<p>*Students should choose a course from the list below to fulfill either the Foreign Language or Art requirements.</p> <p>*Please note that 2 years of a Foreign Language are required and that both years are to be scheduled in the same language.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Foreign Language</u></b></p> <p>French I Spanish I</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Art</u></b></p> <p>Art I Fine Arts Survey Theatre/Drama I (acting) Theatre (Competitive Speech)</p>	<p>*Students who took a Foreign Language in 9<sup>th</sup> grade should schedule the second level of that Foreign Language (same language as the first course)</p> <p>*Students taking an Art in 9<sup>th</sup> grade should schedule the first Foreign Language course.</p> <p>*Students who are on Pathway 3 of the Math Curriculum (taking both Geometry and Algebra II in 10<sup>th</sup> grade) should choose Geometry as their Math and select Algebra II as an elective.</p>	<p>*Students who have taken Level I and II of a Foreign Language should schedule an Art class selected from— Art I, Fine Arts Survey, Theatre/Drama I, or Theatre (Competitive Speech)</p> <p>*Students who have taken an Art and the 1st level of a Foreign Language should schedule the second level of the Foreign Language (same language as the first course)</p> <p>*Students who have taken an Art in 9<sup>th</sup> grade and an additional Math in the 10<sup>th</sup> grade must begin taking classes for the Foreign Language requirement.</p>	<p>*Seniors should make sure that the Art Requirement (1 credit) and the Foreign Language requirement (2 credits from same language) have been fulfilled before scheduling any of the electives below.</p>
