"End of the School Year" greetings to each & every member of the TCHS Family of Faith!



Dear TCH graduates,

The Rebel Nation was like a well-oiled machine in 2016. State championships in volleyball, wrestling, baseball, jazz and hip-hop dance topped the list. State runners-up placements in girls' tennis and cheerleading, along with seven district championships, showcased the competitive spirit of the school. How can that be topped? Well, the graduating seniors did just that, amassing over \$8.6 million in scholarship offers, an all-time record for Teurlings Catholic!

This past year was also a record setter for Teurlings Catholic students participating in college dual enrollment classes. Juniors and seniors involved in our D.E. program enrolled in a total of 443 classes amounting to 1,329 hours of college credits. Of the 443 classes, students earned 287 grades of A and 148 B's.

The building project on campus appears to be ahead of schedule, allowing teachers to move into the new classrooms during the summer months ensuring a smooth transition for the 2016-17 school year. The classroom wings on either side of the chapel will house the Theology department and a large teacher workroom. With the new prayer garden added to the front of the chapel, the entire area will become the spiritual center of our campus.

"Largest" and "biggest ever" were terms often used at Teurlings Catholic this year. The largest enrollment ever, the largest faculty ever (in numbers, not weight), the largest number of students honored at the Academic Pep Rally, the largest number of students to participate in comprehensive extra-curricular programs, and the list goes on! The size of Teurlings Catholic, however, has not changed the family-like, faith-based atmosphere that has been prevalent for the past sixty years.

Bishop J. Douglas Deshotel blessed Teurlings Catholic by celebrating the senior Baccalaureate Mass, as well as conferring diplomas for graduation. It was the most reverent and dignified graduation ever witnessed. All 153 graduates respectfully received their diplomas and shook hands with the bishop. He was VERY impressed with the liturgy, the graduation ceremony, the graduating seniors, and the Teurlings Catholic family. It was a great day to be a REBEL.



Alumni Spotlight

Dr. Tom Lillie Class of 1972

In the late 1960s, St. Bernard High School in Breaux Bridge closed. My parents, Charles and Antonia Lillie, had both graduated from Catholic schools and felt strongly about the value of a Catholic education. Teurlings Catholic High School was an 8-mile drive and the closest alternative. They believed the time spent commuting to Lafayette would be worth the extra effort to learn about service, compassion, and religious faith as part of an academic education.

I felt a sense of community from the first day I arrived as a freshman at Teurlings in 1968. I participated in basketball, baseball, and track. I also served the football program as trainer, statistician and cheerleader. For non-sports programs, I chose Key Club and Beta Club. Teurlings provided a solid foundation academically in the classroom, physically on the sports field, and spiritually through the Catholic Church.



After graduating in 1972, I attended the University of Southwestern Louisiana, now UL Lafayette. My

initial major was physical education; however, in my second semester, I discovered a passion for the natural environment, switched to wildlife management, and never looked back. My ultimate fate was sealed when I learned the Air Force needed medical entomologists, people who study insects and the diseases they transmit.

I joined the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps, graduated with a B.S. in wildlife management, and continued my studies as a graduate student in entomology at Colorado State University in 1976. I entered the Air Force as a medical entomologist in 1978. After serving four years of active duty, the Air Force provided full support for a PhD in medical entomology at the University of Florida, which I received in 1985.

I was fortunate to lead or be a part several rewarding programs during 26 years military service including: (1) documenting pesticide contamination in homes that led the US EPA to ban a pesticide;



(2) field testing new mosquito repellents in Alaska that were eventually adopted to protect military personnel worldwide; (3) preparing environmental analyses for top secret space programs and new weapon systems; (4) preserving the Nation's polar launch mission by preventing residential development on several miles of California coastline; and (5) obtaining congressional approval for over six million acres of land critical to readiness by all branches of the military.

Following my Air Force retirement as a colonel in 2003, I served on the staff of the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee. I was fortunate to be involved in writing legislation that was eventually enacted to expand national parks in Arizona and Tennessee, and establish the Atchafalaya National Heritage Area in Louisiana. In 2010, I was asked to serve my country again during the worst oil spill in the Nation's history. I was selected as Chief of Staff for the lead Federal agency for oversight of offshore oil drilling. Today, I remain in the same position with the Bureau of Safety and Environmental Enforcement in Washington, DC.

Every job I have been fortunate to perform has had at least one common trait, <u>service</u>, a value that was instilled at Teurlings Catholic High School and set the foundation for a rewarding career.




Alumni Spotlight

David Begnaud
Class of 2001

As a 2001 graduate of Teurlings Catholic, David Begnaud's high school career was defined by his involvement as a member of the TCH Speech and Debate Team. "My freshman English teacher Josette Surratt likes to brag, she discovered me. Insisting I had a good voice, she convinced me to join the newly formed speech team. I had already committed to videotaping the Rebel football games, however, so I didn't sign up until the next year." Ms. Surratt stated, "I knew that David's voice was ideal for speech competition. I was also certain that the passion and tenacity I saw in the classroom would serve him well in the field of broadcasting." During his three years on the speech team, David had the opportunity to enjoy much success on the local, state and national levels. He won at his very first speech tournament. Some of his more notable accomplishments in this activity were: State Championships in Oratory, Dramatic Interpretation, Oral Interpretation, and Duo Reading; 5th place in Oratory and 4th place in Duo Reading at the Harvard Invitational tournament and 2nd place in Expository Speaking at the National Forensic League tournament in Portland, Oregon. As David is fond of saying, "I found my voice and myself through speech." In addition to his speech accolades, David was also elected Governor of Boys State in 2000, one of only two Governors in the history of the high school. Upon graduation David was recognized with the

ALL TCH Award, Principal's Award and the TCH Memorial Award. His interest in public speaking and broadcast journalism was further cultivated when, as a senior, David made his television debut as a "Teen Reporter" at KLFY, a CBS network affiliate in Lafayette. Upon graduation from high school, David was hired by the station as a reporter and continued in that role throughout his collegiate years.



He became the host of the inaugural edition of the Passe Partout morning show, Saturday and Sunday editions, as a freshman in college. David later assumed weekend evening anchor duties. "I worked from 4 A.M. to 11 P.M. on the weekends and went to college during the week. There was no time for extra-curricular activities." Maria Placer, his boss and mentor at TV10, says the first time she met David, she knew by the light in his eyes that he had been given a true gift. "David had God-given talent. He always covered a story from a different angle, one that would grab the viewer. In my 43 years at TV10, I have met only 3 applicants with the talent David has. He knew he had to believe in himself and work, work, work...He did that and now he is a STAR!"

While in high school and college, David volunteered with the American Red Cross. He served as a youth



leader on the national level and then joined the Acadiana area Red Cross Board of Directors as its youth representative. He taught first aid, CPR and life guarding. After the shooting at Columbine, David was selected to serve on the national Red Cross School Safety Task Force, which was a joint venture with the White House during President Bill Clinton's administration.

Tony Credeur, the director of the Acadiana chapter during David's tenure, says "David excelled in everything he did with the Red Cross on the local, state, and national levels. He was very aggressive in his work to help other people...sometimes



a little too much [haha]."

After graduating from the University of Louisiana at Lafayette in 2005, David moved to Los Angeles to explore opportunities in the field of entertainment reporting. Within three months of moving there, Hurricane Katrina hit Louisiana and David moved back home to the Bayou State. "I had to return home and Shreveport was the first offer I got." David was hired as a reporter at CBS affiliate, KSLA TV. He spent nearly two years there before accepting a position at CBS owned station, KOVR, in Sacramento, California. After three years he moved to Los Angeles; he was a lead reporter at KTLA TV for two years.

In 2012, he was approached and offered the opportunity to work with Larry King at his new company, ORA TV, founded by Mexican billionaire, Carlos Slim. Wendy Walker, executive producer for Larry King for over 25 years, invited David to start a new concept in broadcasting which David called *Newsbreaker*. This digital show provided breaking news to ripple on their mobile drivers. This job, however, required David stay in the studio to anchor the broadcasts. "I missed being sent to the scene of a big story as a field reporter," he said. After a year, in what could be described as a leap of faith, David joined CBS news. According to him, this was the beginning of a dream realized. "Since I was a child, I would lie awake at night dreaming of being a network news correspondent. I used to practice saying, 'David Begnaud, CBS News, New York'."

He felt fortunate to spend his first year as a freelance feature correspondent for the show CBS This Morning, Saturday. During that time, Entertainment Tonight came calling and he became the "hard news" correspondent for ET.

"Red carpets and movie junkets were never my thing; luckily, I did the same kind of stories for ET that you might see, from time to time, on the evening news. These just happened to involve people who were entertainment celebrities."

In July 2015, Entertainment Tonight sent him to Lafavette to cover a movie theater shooting. "CBS News decided to take a chance on me, by using the 'feature guy' as a 'hard news' correspondent. My big break came at the worst time." David used his homegrown relationships to do some of the best reporting of any network covering the story. "But I



couldn't celebrate. because this was a tragedy in my hometown." When he returned to New York, the Vice President

of Administration for CBS news asked him to take an assignment in Miami as an official duty correspondent assigned of the southern area of the United States. In February 2016, he was offered a three year staff contract with CBS News.

These days David spends most of his time on an airplane and living in hotels. Even though David travels extensively with his job, he is still a "Cajun" at heart. He credits his strong ties to family and the South Louisiana culture as factors that keep him grounded in a business of egos and back-breaking competition. He is aware of all the opportunities he was given and says, "I'm blessed. Imagine living a life where you're making a living doing what you've always dreamed of doing. That's me...and I'm so incredibly grateful for it."


ACADEMICS TECHNOLOGY

Digital ACT and standardized test prep, as well as the implementation of the writing program, along with changes to instruction enabled by the use of the Internet, digital textbooks, peer-to-peer collaboration through class message boards, the use of turnitin.com, Gizmos, Google Classroom, and other programs, can be cited as factors accounting for the upward trend seen in TCHS ACT (and other standardized test) scores. TCHS students score above the national average on all standardized tests. Below is the data for our current 11th and 12th graders, as well as the last two graduating classes. As you can see, our current students scored above national senior levels as juniors and our last two graduating classes were well above both the state and national norms.



Our technology resources have allowed us to diversify the electives we offer to students, especially those seeking to earn college credit.

TCH Speech Team

I remember my very first Wednesday meeting. On a hot, August afternoon in 2005, we filed into the chapel, which served as Ms. Surratt's classroom. Surrounded by trophies, philosophy books, play scripts, and pictures of kids in suits, I was a little nervous about what I was about to get myself into; but after hearing Ms. Surratt welcome us, I knew I wouldn't just be part of a team--I would be part of a legacy.

In 1997, Josette Surratt took over as the head Speech and Debate coach at Teurlings Catholic High. The team had existed for some time, but over the next 10 years, Ms. Surratt would turn it into a *force*. During her reign, the team won eight Louisiana state championships in addition to countless individual local and state championships in interpretation events, such as Oral Interp and Dramatic Interp, and in forensic events, such as Original Oratory, Lincoln-Douglas Debate, and Cross Examination Debates.

The team was not only a local powerhouse, it had a presence on the national circuit as well. At prestigious invitational tournaments such as the Harvard the Glenbrooks Invitational. and Teurlings competitors became semifinalists, finalists, and champions in events like Dramatic Interp and Duo Interp. At national tournaments hosted by the National Catholic Forensic League and the National Speech and Debate Association (formerly the National Forensic League), Teurlings students ranked among the top competitors in the nation. In 2008, her final year as head coach, Ms. Surratt coached four students to the national stage--a semifinalist in Dramatic Interp, a semifinalist in Original Oratory, and a threetime-finalist Duo Interp team.

Though she likes her shiny trophies, Ms. Surratt doesn't rely on them as the sole measurement of her students' successes. As an activity, Speech and Debate instills communication skills students carry into their personal and professional lives. Alumni of the Teurlings Speech and Debate team have gone on to

pursue bachelors, masters, and doctorate degrees. They've become lawyers, doctors, chiropractors, broadcast journalists, speech therapists, medical research scientists, entrepreneurs, college professors, collegiate forensics coaches, and educators. And some of us, myself included, have become the next generation of Teurlings Speech and Debate coaches.

We no longer get to hold meetings in the chapel; I'll admit, I do miss that space. My co-coach, Craig Wall, and I still hold our meetings on Wednesdays, and I'm still surrounded by trophies, philosophy books, play scripts, and pictures of kids in suits. This year, we had 39 students participate in speech and debate. We had numerous local champions, a Harvard semifinalist in Dramatic Interp, and a state champion in Extemporaneous Speaking. When I look at my students--these creative, critical, quirky kids--I am filled with gratitude for the past and excitement for the future. We're keeping the legacy going.













Annual Appeal for the Enhancement of Technology

The goal of an annual fund is to generate dollars to enhance the environment of learning at Teurlings Catholic. It is more than a dollar-raising campaign. TCHS Foundation

The purpose of the foundation is to assure the longevity of Catholic education at Teurlings Catholic High School by investing in an endowment trust fund. An endowment consists of funds that have been set aside by a school to produce income; only the interest earned is made available for the needs of Teurlings Catholic. Unrestricted memorial gifts and proceeds from the Rebel Open are designated for the foundation.




2015 Outstanding Teacher

"My favorite song, More Beautiful You by Johnny Diaz has become my theme. The song reminds us true beauty is not found on the surface, but within. We are all beautiful in the eyes of God, regardless of our size, hair, skin, or features; self-confidence comes from that knowledge."

The daughter of Joe (TCH '92) and Melanie Heintz, Elizabeth admits she comes from a Catholic family, deep rooted in their spiritual beliefs. "Faith is important to not just me, but to my entire family, not only here at school or at St. Elizabeth Church (where she is a Eucharistic Minister, Lector and Altar Server) but in my entire life."
