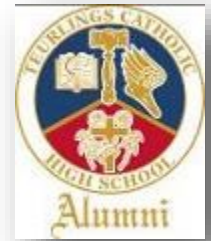

Alumni Spotlight

Michelle Junot, Class of 2007



Michelle Junot, a 2007 graduate of Teurlings Catholic High, was born and raised in Lafayette, Louisiana. She now lives in Baltimore, Maryland, but she still knows where she comes from and remembers important skills like Cajun-dancin' and crawfish-peelin'.

During her four years at Teurlings, Michelle was involved in many clubs and organizations on campus including the Beta Club, the National Honors Society, Student Council, and Retreat Ministry Team. Looking back on those experiences now, Michelle says these groups gave her many opportunities to step outside of her introverted comfort zone, leading her to love new things, people, and places.

This learned-confidence in the unfamiliar helped Michelle travel just up the road to pursue her undergraduate degree at Centenary College of Louisiana in Shreveport. She graduated from Centenary in 2011 with a Bachelor of Arts in Communication and Dance.

When deciding where to go for graduate school, Michelle decided to look further east, beyond the borders of Louisiana. This was, in part, due to a seed that was planted many years ago the first time she felt the rush of plane speeding down a runway her sophomore year at Teurlings. She was on her way to Washington D.C. along with other classmates and upperclassmen, about to get her first taste of east coast life and snow.

Michelle says of the trip, "Going to D.C. was a transformative experience for me. I felt an equal level of safety and freedom to explore the city thanks to Mrs. Dugas and the other brave chaperones. Everything—even the D.C. metro—felt magical and new. In hindsight, I can point to that trip as an experience that

would leave me forever wide-eyed and ready for adventure. It may sound like a simple thing to some, but I'm grateful for it in ways that words cannot articulate."



With that experience in mind, Michelle decided to move east for graduate school, just a hop, skip and jump away from D.C. She earned her Masters of Fine Arts in Writing and Publishing Arts from the University of Baltimore Klein Family School of Communications Design. Upon the completion of her M.F.A. in 2014, Michelle published her thesis collection of essays, **and the floor was always lava**.

"So many people from home have poured out their support over the last five years as my writing career begins to find traction," Michelle says. "Classmates, old teachers, and complete strangers who know me only as a friend of a friend of someone's cousin have shared this accomplishment with me and encouraged me to keep going. To say this is humbling is an understatement."

When talking about her work, Michelle says that the most important gift she received from her Teurlings education was the desire to pursue a career in writing.

"Although it's clear I loved telling stories from the moment I could hold a crayon, I didn't see writing as a skill that could be honed—enjoyed even—until Mrs. Schexnailder's and Mrs. Marino's English classes.

"We wrote in Mrs. Schex's and Mrs. Marino's classes. A lot. Every week. Did I say a lot? It was a ridiculous amount—at least to a 16 year old. I learned and somewhat-mastered the standard five-paragraph pretty early on and quickly became bored with my own writing. I started trying to spice up my lit analyses with anecdotes—both true and non-true—or try titles that were pure alliteration and only loosely linked to my thesis. I either charmed my teachers with my effort or really challenged their patience, but they were kind and continued to encourage and shape me. I learned the beauty of multiple drafts and the necessity of editing. I learned that long papers didn't equal good papers (remember that 11-pager, Mrs. Marino?). I learned that to be a good writer, I would need to write. A lot. I learned to love perfecting that skill."

Michelle is now starting to see that hard work pay off as she celebrates the publication of her second book, **Notes from My Phone*: a self-portrait in her twenties**, published by Mason Jar Press, December 2016.

Notes from My Phone* is collection of essays, to-do lists, vignettes, reminders and dreams; it mixes heart-felt memoir with the everyday marginalia that makes up a twenty-something's life and day planner. The everyday is placed side-by-side with the universal, and in doing so, transcends to be more than the sum of its parts. If, "Life is what happens to you while you're busy making other plans," then **Notes From My Phone***, celebrates life in all its tedious and troubling beauty.

It's hard for Michelle to believe it's already been ten years since she was a student at Teurlings. "I recently reconnected with an old classmate, and he asked me how the last ten years of my life had been. I told him he was crazy; we did not graduate ten years ago! My memories of TCH are as fresh as ever: talking Mrs. Doherty out of a Civics test by revising the preamble to the constitution, road-tripping to the DDay Museum in Mrs. Martin's van with our AP class, learning about myself in a completely new way in Mrs. Surratt's interpersonal communication class, Mrs. Dugas telling me firmly to get a hat on my head in the D.C. snow, acting out a slightly-updated version of Romeo and Juliet in Mrs. Schex's class, all those timed essays with Mrs. Marino, and, of course, the countless retreats with Mrs. Badeaux on Fridays. I carry these memories and all the others with me. I'm grateful for the time and energy each of these women put into helping me to become the woman I am today and will be twenty years from now. There is no greater gift than to invest in someone else's life like each member of the Teurlings faculty and staff invested in mine. It's my hope that in some small way, my writing and teaching will do the same for someone else."

Michelle's writing has been published in The Avenue, Reject, Welter, Industry Night, and Baltimore STYLE. She is the Director of Alumni Relations at University of Baltimore School of Law and is an adjunct professor in the University of Baltimore Klein School of Communications.

She now lives with a cat named Biff in Baltimore, Maryland where she writes and drinks unsafe amounts of coffee, but you can read more from and about Michelle at michellejunot.com.

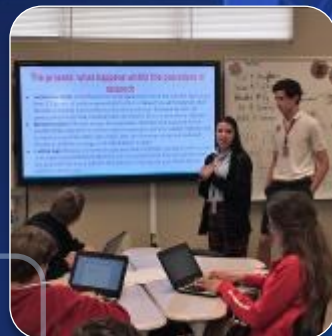

Alumni Spotlight

Dr. Ryan J. Chauffe, Class of 1994



Looking back, I realize my parents both worked extremely hard to provide an opportunity for me to learn and grow in the best environment possible. My principal, Mr. Bruce Baudier, and several of my teachers remain on faculty, which epitomizes the amazing culture and environment of Teurlings Catholic High School. After graduating in 1994 with a class of 65, I attended the University of Southwestern Louisiana (now University of Louisiana at Lafayette).

As an undergraduate student, I was a senior in Business Administration when I realized I wanted to pursue medicine. I recall having a conversation with one of my best friends about my plans after graduation, and I was having a difficult time envisioning a career in the corporate world. That was the first time the idea of becoming a physician crossed my mind. After obtaining my B.S. in Business Administration, I enrolled in the multitude of premedical courses in biology, chemistry and physics - proving it is never too late to follow your true passion. I also worked in the Emergency Department and Wound Care and Hyperbaric units at Lafayette General Medical Center. My years spent in the

emergency department were invaluable in teaching me about the world of medicine and life as a whole. One day at work in the Hyperbaric unit, I received a call from my father. I had received a certified letter from Nova Southeastern University College of Osteopathic Medicine. Realizing rejection letters never arrive via certified mail, this was a very good sign. I had an acceptance letter to begin my career as a physician. Opening that letter with my father was one of the best days in my life.

I moved to Fort Lauderdale, Florida, to start medical school with 200 other very talented people. The four years of medical school was a terrific and unique experience. During orientation week I met my wife, Ann, and a few life long friends. She has always pushed me to do things I would not typically experience, such as sky diving and medical mission trips to Tanzania. Two weeks after graduating medical school, we got married and then shortly thereafter began our internships.

I completed a general surgery internship at the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey. I had an epiphany during my surgical internship. I again had a change of heart and decided I wanted to change programs altogether to become an interventional cardiologist. This was another important and good decision in my life. I spent the next three years completing an internal medicine residency at the University of Pennsylvania's Pennsylvania Hospital in Philadelphia, PA. During this busy time, we adopted our first fur baby, a Great Dane named Dee. Thank goodness for dog walkers!

Afterwards, my wife and I then couples matched into our respective fellowship training programs at the University of Florida Shands University Medical Center in Gainesville, Florida. The next three years as a general cardiology fellow were

challenging to say the least, but prepared me well to practice cardiology. During my time as a cardiology fellow I found success publishing several articles. In 2012, I was awarded the Gatorade Research Travel Award, and in 2013, I was selected as a finalist for the American College of Cardiology Florida chapter's Young Investigator Award. I then went on to complete an additional super-fellowship in Interventional Cardiology. During our time in Florida, our first daughter was born, Kate and we adopted our second Great Dane, Lucy.

In August 2015, my family and I relocated to Louisiana, and I began my career as an interventional cardiologist with Cardiovascular Institute of the South. Over the past two years, I have worked to build practices in both Lafayette and Breau Bridge. I currently serve as the Medical Director of the St. Martin Hospital Cardiac Rehabilitation program and work closely with its CEO, Mrs. Karen Wyble. In a funny turn of events, she also happens to be the one who hired me as an Emergency Department Technician at LGMC prior to medical school in 1999. Since moving back to Lafayette, my second daughter, Keira, was born. It has been great being back in Acadiana; it's an amazing place to raise a family!
