

Teurlings 11 Opens Slate

Another step in the development of a complete athletic program at Father Teurlings High School will be taken Sunday when the school's first organized football team travels to meet Berwick High school.

Game time is 2:15 p.m.

Twenty - two candidates for the Fr. Teurlings team have been working hard since the first day of school to get into shape for the opener in Berwick.

The team is coached by Billy Michot.

The only member of the squad with experience is V. J. Guidry, a transfer from Cocilla High who will probably do most of the quarterbacking this year. Guidry will be backed up by William LeBlanc, a sharp passer who has been hampered by a knee injury since the second week of practice.

A pair of fleet halfbacks, Raymond Johnson and Eddie Figuerson, and a powerful fullback, Donald Broussard, round out the backfield for the Rebels. Brian Gilder, a classy freshman will also see plenty of action this year.

Melvin Kling and Johnny Duplantis are currently leading the field at the ends with sophomore James Simon coming around very nicely.

Pat Arceneaux and Valrie Domingue are top candidates at tackle while big Sammy Roberts is slated for reserve duty.

Sidney Thibodeaux has been looking sharp at one guard spot while Alcee Prejean and Reynolds Stoute are battling it out for the other position.

Robert Earl Guidry rounds out the center - quarterback brother combination with an edge in age and experience over Stanley Arceneaux.

The first home game for the Rebels will be Thursday, Oct. 2, at Clark field.

Teurlings Tops Berwick 14-7

BERWICK — Father Teurlings of Lafayette made its debut in organized football here yesterday with a 14-7 victory over class B Berwick High.

The two teams played a scoreless first half, but Berwick broke the ice with a touchdown early in the third period when a defensive player picked up a Teurlings fumble and ran 15 yards for a touchdown.

Berwick added the extra point to take a 7-0 lead.

Teurlings got back in the game in the same period when V. J. Guidry threw a 30-yard pass to Mevin Kling. Two pass interference calls against Berwick put Teurlings on the latter's two-yard line, from where Guidry swept end for the touchdown.

Guidry passed 17 yards to Johnny Duplantis for the go-ahead touchdown in the fourth period. A 35-yard pass from Guidry to Kling set up the score.

Late in the game, Teurlings' Bryan Gilder punted 59 yards, the ball rolling out of bounds on the Berwick one-yard line. Two plays later Donald Broussard tackled a Berwick player in the end zone for a safety to put Teurlings ahead 14-7.

Guidry completed five passes in nine attempts, with Kling catching four of the aerals. The longest aerial gain was an 80-yard play that failed to score.

Top defensive players for Teurlings included Broussard, Pat Arceneaux, Reynolds Stoutes and Valrie Domingue. Eddie Figueron turned in a fine running performance for the winners.

Teurlings' next game will be Thursday night, 7:30, at Clark Field against Kinder.

Teurlings Wins Over Elton 14-13

Teurlings netted 235 yards rushing. Guidry completed six passes in 13 attempts for 60 yards.

Other outstanding players for Teurlings included fullback Pat Arceneaux who turned in a 45-yard run, tackle Donald Broussard, guard Raymond Johnson, end Johnny Duplantis, linebacker Sammy Roberts and center Robert Guidry.

The victory was Teurlings' second of the season against one loss. Coach Billy Michot's team meets Catholic of New Iberia's "B" team at Clark Field Friday night.

Teurlings 7-6 Winner

Father Teurlings High school of Lafayette drove 60 yards for a touchdown in the final four minutes of play Friday night to take a 7-6 victory over the Catholic of New Iberia "B" team in a football game played at Clark Field.

The Panthers scored early in the fourth period on a 20 - yard run by George Waguespack. Teurlings charged back late in the period to launch a long drive for the tying touchdown.

Quarterback V. J. Guidry, who passed to end Melvin Kling for the Rebel touchdown, hit Kling with another aerial for the extra point that proved to be the margin of victory.

Freshman Brian Gilder was a key man in both the scoring drive and Teurlings' last minute defensive stand. Gilder hauled in a pass from Guidry good for 30 yards to reach the Catholic 13-yard line during the Rebel touchdown drive.

Then Gilder came up with his second pass interception of the game, picking off a Catholic aerial late in the game to insure the Teurlings victory.

Guidry's scoring pass to Kling covered 13 yards. In all, Guidry attempted 10 passes, with Kling catching four of the aerials.

Other standout players for Teurlings were Pat Arceneaux, Donald Broussard and Valrie Dominique. Alan Gosnell and Waguespack were the offensive stars for Catholic, while the entire Panther defense was outstanding.

Teurlings' next home game will be Nov. 13 against St. Joseph of Rayne. The tilt will mark Homecoming for Coach Billy Michot's Rebels.

The Teurlings Rebels drove 55 yards for a touchdown after the opening kickoff, with Eddie Figueron smashing the final three yards for the scoring thrust. This one carried 50 yards, with Figueron scoring on a 21-yard burst through tackle. V. J. Guidry ran for the extra point.

Guidry returned a St. Bernard punt 70 yards behind fine blocking for the next Rebel touchdown. Pat Arceneaux ran for the extra point.

A. J. Breaux broke away on a fine 70-yard punt return in the third quarter for a St. Bernard touchdown. The Crusaders struck again moments later on a 19-yard pass from Paul Bacquet to Breaux.

The Rebels came back with a scoring pass from Guidry to Melvin Kling, the play covering 60 yards. Guidry added the extra point.

Guidry and William LeBlanc turned in great passing performances for the Rebels, completing 10 passes in 13 attempts for 145 yards. St. Joseph Defeats Teurlings By 27-12

St. Joseph of Rayne defeated Father Teurlings of Lafayette 27-12 in a football game played Thursday night at Clark Field before an estimated 600 fans.

St. Joseph hustled to a 20-6 half-time lead, then stopped a deter-

mined Teurlings rally with a key pass interception in the second half.

Two long-range scoring plays highlighted the game. Fred Gossen of St. Joseph broke loose for a 61-yard scoring dash after taking a screen pass and Melvin Kling of Teurlings sprinted 75 yards for a touchdown on a kickoff return.

St. Joseph went ahead 7-0 in the first period when Billy Link smashed across from the three-yard line, then kicked the extra point. Teurlings struck back in the same period when Bryan Gilder broke away and raced 49 yards for a touchdown.

Luther Green bucked two yards for a touchdown in the first period to boost the St. Joseph lead to 13-6.

In the third period, St. Joseph increased its lead when Gossen unleashed his 61-yard scoring dash on a short screen pass. Then came Kling's 75-yard kickoff return to narrow the St. Joseph lead to 20-12.

St. Joseph picked off a Teurlings pass and pushed across another touchdown in the third period to wrap up the victory.

IBC Clubs Yell Foul (By Court)

WASHINGTON (AP) — The IBC's of boxing want the Supreme Court to rule out, or at least take the sting from, a federal judge's decision that they monopolized championship bouts.

The International Boxing Clubs of New York and Chicago Thursday claimed a foul by District Judge Sylvester J. Ryan, who ordered them to go out of business and directed their money men to get out of Madison Square Garden.

The government argued otherwise, contending Ryan moved wisely to strip boxing of monopoly and encourage independent promoters to put on more fights.
