

Teurlings Victor In Grid Opener

The Teurlings High Rebels unleashed a granding ground attack Thursday night to defeat Grand Lake 26-13 in an opening football game at Clark Field. The Rebels

piled up 309 yards rushing and sent halfbacks Bryant Gilder and Chester Guidry crashing for two touchdowns each.

Coach Bill Michot used his reserves throughout the second half after most of his starters were sidelined by assorted bruises. Teurlings built up a 20-0 lead in the first half. Teurlings added another score in the final quarter after Grand Lake shoved across two third-period touchdowns.

The Rebels attempted only one pass and were never forced to punt.

The Rebels marched 60 yards in the first period, with Gilder crashing across from two yards out for the touchdown. Tackle Pat Arceneaux kicked the extra point.

Another 60-yard drive in the same period paid off for Teurlings when Guidry bucked two yards for a touchdown. The extra point attempt failed and the Rebels led 13-0.

In the second period Guidry sprinted eight yards around left end to cap a 40-yard Rebel scoring drive. The extra point attempt failed.

The final Rebel touchdown came in the fourth quarter on Gilder's 25-yard run that climaxed a 55-yard drive. Pat Arceneaux kicked the extra point.

Top backs for Teurlings on offense were Guidry and Gilder. Defensive standouts were Stanley Arceneaux and Guidry. Offensive line stars were Pat Arceneaux and Melvin Kling, while the top defensive linemen were James Simon, Pat Arceneaux and Kling.

Michot used 16 players. All turned fine performances, including linemen Jesse Champagne, Arthur Courville, Reynolds Stoute, Kenneth Plouet, Pat David, Sammy Roberts and Carl Breaux.

Backfield standouts included William LeBlanc and Rene Bourriaque.

Teurlings' next game will be against St. Bernard of Breaux Bridge next Friday night, 7:30, at Clark Field in Lafayette.

Teurlings Beats St. Bernard 6-0

A slightly disabled but spirited band of Teurlings High School Rebels clawed their way to a 6-0 victory over a hard-fighting St. Bernard of Breaux Bridge team Friday night at Clark field.

The Rebel offense led by Big Pat Arceneaux clicked off considerable yardage but could not keep a sustained drive going until late in the third quarter when Arceneaux skirted right end and bulled his way into the open for a 45-yard scoring run.

Arceneaux missed the extra point try and that was all the scoring for the night.

Last-minute changes in the Teurlings line-up greatly hampered the Rebels' usual quick-hitting offense. Center James Simon was not available for duty because of a leg injury received on Tuesday and big tackle Sammy Roberts received a broken finger in a light drill Wednesday.

Roberts played some offense despite his injury and did a fine job. Stanley Arceneaux was moved over to the center spot for this game and also did a creditable job with only one days work at that position. To make matters worse for the local boys, halfback Chester Guidry could not be used from the second quarter on because of a stomach ailment although he stayed in the game, and Pat David, voted hardest worker by his teammates last year, received a broken ankle in the third quarter.

The Rebels made three good drives in the first half to the 10, 15 and 23 only to be set back by penalties or to lose the ball by fumbles.

In the third quarter, Teurlings got a break when one of Bryant Gilder's fine punts was fumbled by the Crusaders John Broussard on the 15 and was recovered by Chester Guidry. The Rebels drove to the 10 but a 15 yard penalty killed that drive. St. Bernard took over and immediately fumbled it away to give the Rebels another chance but another 15 yarder and a fumble stopped the Rebels again.

After John Broussard punted out

to his own 45, Teurlings fumbled on the first play. On the next play Broussard lofted a pass to Mike Grace who got behind the Rebels defense for a touchdown but the play was called back and the Crusaders penalized for being in motion.

After holding St. Bernard, Bill LeBlanc turned Arceneaux loose and the big fullback pounded up the middle and skirted the ends for the remainder of the game, including his touchdown run.

Arceneaux was the workhorse for the Rebel offense picking up 184 yards on 16 tries for an 11 yard average. Gilder picked up 64 yards in 16 attempts and Guidry added 52 yards in 9 carries to help the Teurlings offense. Lennet Castex was the leading ground gainer for the Crusaders picking up 31 yards in 6 tries.

The Rebel defense was lead by Melvin Kling who was responsible for 10 individual tackles and was literally all over the field. Pat Arceneaux, Stanley Arceneaux, Reynolds Stoute, Carl Breau, Pat David, Jesse Champagne, Johnny Gardiner and Kenneth Plouet all turned in fine defensive play for Teurlings.

Teurlings Defeats Sacred Heart 26-13

MORGAN CITY — Teurlings High of Lafayette evened its District 7-B record at 2-2 here Friday night and posted its fourth victory of the season with a 26-13 decision over Sacred Heart of Morgan City.

Teurlings now has a 4-2 record for the season. The loss was Sacred Heart's third against two victories.

The winning Rebels pounded through the Sacred Heart defense for 303 yards rushing. Coach Bill Michot's club stayed on the ground most of the game, attempting only two passes, both incomplete.

Army Batters Duke By 21-6

DURHAM, N.C. (AP) — Twice-beaten Army struck for two touchdowns behind the passing of quarterback Joe Caldwell and turned an intercepted pass into another score to defeat Duke 21-6 Saturday in an intersectional football game.

A homecoming crowd of 33,500 saw Army storm 68 yards for a touchdown in nine plays the first time it got the ball. Caldwell, who has been Army's big offense weapon this season with Bob Anderson ailing, flipped a 16-yard pass to lonesome end Bill Carpenter on Duke's 2 to set up the touchdown. Fullback Don Bonko scored two plays later from the 1.

Bryant Gilder put Teurlings into the lead in the first period when he sprinted 12 yards for a touchdown. The attempted extra point failed.

Sacred Heart tied the score 6-6 in the same period when Allain Russo scored on a 6-yard plunge through tackle.

In the third quarter, Gilder broke loose on a 11-yard touchdown run for Teurlings and Chester Guidry ran for the extra point to put the Rebels in front 13-6. Teurlings widened its margin later when William LeBlanc scored on a 1-yard smash through the middle to make it 19-6.

In the fourth quarter, Teurlings struck again, this time on a 3-yard buck by Stanley Arceneaux. LeBlanc passed to end Melvin King for the extra point to put Teurlings in front 26-6.

Sacred Heart's second touchdown came late in the game when Kenneth Nini sprinted 50 yards for a touchdown. Nini also ran for the extra point.



SUNSET — Teurlings High defeated Sunset High 13-7 in a game played in Sunset yesterday. It was a case of the Teurlings team making the right play at the right time to defeat the Homecoming Lions.

The Rebels handled the ball only 33 times in the entire game as compared to 59 times by Sunset. Melvin Kling of Teurlings was easily the outstanding player on the field as he consistently stopped Sunset backs with vicious tackles, and literally broke the Lions' backs with a 94-yard touchdown run after intercepting a Sunset pass with only 2 seconds remaining in the first half.

Bryant Gilder ran for the extra point and that was all the scoring in the first half after drives by both teams failed to produce anything.

In the fourth quarter James Simon of Teurlings broke through to block a Sunset punt and the Rebels took over on the Lion 15. On the next play, Bryant Gilder skirted right end for the Rebels' second score.

The Rebels will be without the services of Sammy Roberts and Pat David, both out for the rest of the season because of injuries.


Berwick's top offensive threats are halfback Roland Verrett and fullback Whalen Kiffe.

Teurlings Wins Homecoming Tilt

The Teurlings Rebels honored their first graduating class by scoring a 32-0 Homecoming victory over a Youngsville team Friday night at Clark Field. The Rebels scored in every period and were never pressed as they made it four wins in a row, six for the season.

Stanley Arceneaux started the scoring when he blasted through the middle for a 20-yard scoring jaunt early in the first quarter.

Moments later, on Youngsville's first play from scrimmage, Pat Arceneaux grabbed a fumble and almost scored but was hauled down from behind on the Dragon 25-

yard line. Chester Guidry scored on the next play.

The Rebels forced Youngsville to punt on the next series and in three plays had the ball on their opponents' 20 again.

Bill LeBlanc lofted a pass to his favorite target, Melvin Kling, and the big end pulled it in for another touchdown. Bryant Gilder converted to make the score 19-0.

Gilder didn't wait long to get back into the Youngsville end zone as he returned a punt 10 yards behind beautiful blocking to score untouched a few plays later.

Just before the half ended, with most of the Rebels' reserves in the game, Robert Romero handed Gilder the ball on a quickie play and with no hole opening up at all, the elusive halfback worked his way into the clear for a 35-yard touchdown run.

In the third quarter, Gilder scored from 40 yards out to cap a long scoring drive featured by the running of Guidry. Rene Bourriaque ran for the extra point.

In the final quarter, speedster Eddie Figueroa hit off left tackle for a 20-yard touchdown. Pat Arceneaux converted.

The Rebels second team played the fourth quarter and mounted a scoring drive of their own, this one climaxed by George Gardiner's 10-yard touchdown sprint. Arceneaux again converted.

The entire Teurlings team played well both on offense and defense to make a good homecoming showing. About 400 fans braved the threatening weather conditions and were treated to a half-time show that featured the presentation of the Teurlings homecoming queen, Miss Edith Turpin, and her court, consisting of Alberta Castille, maid of honor, and the Misses, Glenda Stutes, Gloria Bardon, Betty Angelle and Sandra Jenkins. Booster club president Gerald Lejeune made the presentation of a bouquet of roses to Miss Turpin to highlight the festivities.

The Rebels will be at home again this coming Friday when they will host St. Joseph's Academy of New Roads.

Tigers Defeat Baker

BATON ROUGE — The Morgan City Tigers capitalized on a short punt, a fumble and a pass interception to score an 18-0 victory over Baker High in a prep football game here Friday night.

The victory was the second of the season against seven defeats for Morgan City.

Teurlings Is Victor Over Kinder, 25-12

KINDER — A hard-fighting Teurlings High Rebel team spoiled "Homecoming" for a rugged Kinder eleven Friday night, scoring a 25-12 football win. Teurlings played its best game of the season as they fought off Coach Johnny Buck's Wing-T offense led by star halfback Jerry King.

King was the workhorse of the Yellow Jackets as he carried the ball 22 times for a total of 134 yards including touchdown runs of 1 and 27 yards.

But while the Rebels were having their troubles stopping King, the Kinder boys found they had more than they could handle in the trio of fine Rebel backs — Bryant Gilder, Chester Guidry and Stanley Arceneaux, and in the cool, accurate passing combination of William LeBlanc to Melvin Kling.

The Rebel backs consistently found holes in the Kinder line and exploited them throughout the game. Freshman fullback Stanley Arceneaux showed that he is one to be watched in the future as he played an outstanding game both offensively and defensively for the Teurlings team.

The Rebels drew first blood, climaxing their opening drive with a beautifully-executed boot-leg pass from Bill LeBlanc to Melvin Kling which covered 24 yards.

Kinder came back to take the lead when halfbacks King and Smith sparked drives of 61 and 65 yards. The Rebels started another drive soon after this but fumbled it away on the Kinder 19.

Then came what may have been the key play of the game for Teurlings when the Kinder quarterbacked, trapped on his own 19, uncorked a pass which was picked off by Melvin Kling, who skirted into the end zone with the tying score.

The Rebels buckled down and held Kinder from this point, while getting one more drive going, this time for 40 yards with Stanley Arceneaux going the final one yard for the score.

The final score came in the third quarter after The Rebels stopped Kinder on the Teurlings 30.

The Rebels drove to Kinder's 45 and from this point LeBlanc and Kling re-enacted their first touchdown play with Kling going into the end zone untouched.

Coach Bill Michot praised the Rebel victory as an entire team effort. Pat Arceneaux, Reynolds Stoute, James Simon, Jesse Champagne, John Gardiner, Carl Breaux, Kenneth Plouet, Ellis Maturin, Melvin Kling and Stanley Arceneaux all played well defensively for the Rebels. Stanley Arceneaux had 11 individual tackles and Melvin Kling had 12 to lead the Teurlings defense.

Teurlings Ready For Sunset Tilt

The Rebels of Teurlings High will be trying to extend their "Homecoming" win streak Sunday when they journey to Sunset to meet the Lions of Sunset High School.

Since beginning football last year, the young Rebels have spoiled four of their opponents' homecomings in as many attempts.

After Sunday's game the Rebels will return home for their next two games, including their own Homecoming against Youngsville High School.

The Rebels will enter the Sunset game without Carl Breaux, 205-pound starting guard. Breaux injured his knee in the Sacred Heart game and will be out of action for three weeks. His position will

be filled by Jesse Champagne or Al Sonnier. Sonnier played his first football game at Morgan City last week and did a fine job on defense.

Leading the Rebel offense are Bryant Gilder Chester Guidry and Melvin Kling. Gilder has carried the ball 73 times for 404 yards and a 6-yard average per carry. He is the leading Rebel scorer with 31 points, including five touchdowns. Guidry has carried the ball 46 times for 339 yards and a 7-yard average. He has scored three touchdowns, all rushing.

Kling has pulled in 4 passes for 69 yards, two of them touchdown passes, and one of an extra point. His other touchdown came on a pass interception.

In the passing department, Bill LeBlanc has connected on 9 passes in 38 attempts for 151 yards and three touchdowns.

As a team, the Rebels have rushed for 1,050 yards and passed for 151 yards in six games.

On defense the Rebels have been lead by Melvin Kling, Pat Arceneaux and Stanley Arceneaux who have contributed the most tackles per game. Fine defensive play has also been turned in by James Simon, Reynolds Stoute, Carl Breaux, Sammy Roberts and Bryant Gilder.

Teurlings will be seeking their third win in a row and their sixth of the season Sunday.



Teurlings Hosts St. Joseph Team

The Teurlings High Rebels will host St. Joseph of New Roads Friday night at Clark Field in a prep football game that finds the Rebels seeking their seventh victory of the season against only two losses.

The game will be the final home appearance of the season for Coach Bill Michot's Rebels.

Probable starters for Teurlings will be ends Jesse Champagne and Melvin Kling, tackles Reynolds Stoute and Pat Arceneaux, guards Al Sonnier and Sammy Roberts, center James Simon, quarterback Bill LeBlanc, halfbacks Bryant Gilder and Chester Guidry and fullback Stanley Arceneaux.

Gilder, a 5-10, 155 - pound sophomore, is the Rebels' leading scorer. He has 57 points, which places him third among District 7-B scorers. Guidry is also the leading Rebel ground - gainer with 576 yards in 93 carries for an average of 6.1 yards per trip.

Guidry ranks second with 463 yards in 57 attempts for an average of 8.1 per carry. Guidry has scored 24 points.

Kling, a 6-1, 155 - pound senior leads the Rebel pass - receivers and is also one of the defensive leaders in the district. Kling has caught six passes for 111 yards and three touchdowns. He has added two more touchdowns on pass interceptions. He returned one 94 yards against Sunset and another for 45 against Kinder.

St. Joseph has a light but scrappy club, Michot reported. "We expect a very tough game," Michot said.

Seniors playing their final home game will be Pat Arceneaux, Kling, Eddie Figueron, Sammy Roberts, Carl Breau, Stoute, Sonnier, LeBlanc and Rene Bourriaque. Pat David, who will miss the game because of injury, is also a senior.

Lenoir By Rhyme Replaces Lamar

Teurlings Beats Patterson 33-8

PATTERSON — The Teurlings High Rebels of Lafayette played their best game of the season here Friday night as they beat a good Patterson High team 33-8.

Patterson had been generally considered the most improved team in District 7-B after beating Loreauville and Tyns Berwick in their last two outings.

Berwick and Loreauville had handed the Rebels their only losses this season.

The victory was far and away the most impressive showing that

Teurlings has made. It was the eighth win of the season — sixth in a row — and it kept intact the Rebels unbroken string of spoiling the opponents' Homecoming games. This was the fifth "Homecoming" victory of the year for Teurlings.

The Rebels received a severe jolt before the game got underway when it was learned that their captain and key defensive player, Melvin Kling, would not be in the starting lineup. Kling suffered a pulled muscle in his back during the week and the injury acted up during pre-game warm-ups.

Faced with this critical situation, the Rebels had to make some last minute changes in their defensive and the fired-up Teurlings boys rose to the occasion.

Kling was able to see limited duty. Stanley Arceneaux and Bill LeBlanc turned in top performances. Arceneaux boomed through the Patterson defensive for 196 yards in 16 carries including touchdown sprints of 75 and 55 yards and made several tackles from his cornerback slot on defense.

LeBlanc threw two touchdown passes, returned a punt 75 yards for another score after a key block by Stanley Arceneaux gave him a start, and intercepted a Patterson pass that had a touchdown label on it.

Bryant Gilder and Chester Gildy turned in their usual consistent games for Teurlings, picking up 33 and 37 yards respectively while also playing top defensive games.

The Rebels drew first blood in the opening period when Gilder got them out of a hole with a beautiful punt from behind his goal line to midfield which the Patterson safety couldn't handle and which was recovered by Johnny Gardiner. The Rebels moved to the Patterson 13 and Bill LeBlanc ran into the end zone from this point, but the play was called back and Teurlings penalized 15 yards for holding.

After another holding penalty and a fourth-down situation on the 20, LeBlanc passed to Jesse Champagne for the score. Gilder ran the extra point.

Crucial Prep Football Games Slated In Area Friday Night

Abbeville travels to Kaplan Friday night for a non-district game that should be a thriller. This is an intense but cleanly-played rivalry and should draw a capacity crowd.

Crowley travels to Morgan City for a 5-AA game that won't count in the title race but gives Morgan City a chance to regain a great deal of prestige. The Tigers are rebuilding this season and Crowley could assure itself of another successful season with a victory over Morgan City.

Breaux Bridge could sew up the 5-A championship Friday night with a win over St. Martinville on St. Martinville's field. Coach Sonny Roy's Tigers are unbeaten in nine starts but St. Martinville looks like the toughest test of the season. Catholic of New Iberia goes to Church Point and Cecilia goes to Hanson Memorial of Franklin for other 5-A games.

The big explosion in class B, however, will take place at Basile where St. Michael shoots for the 6-B championship against Basile. This one will decide the crown. St. Michael is bowling along on a 10-game winning streak this season and would wrap up a perfect campaign with a win over Basile. Basile once-beaten in overall play but perfect in district action, is expected to fire both barrels against the strong Crusaders.

St. Joseph Tops Teurlings 46-6

RAYNE — St. Joseph of Rayne completed the first unbeaten, untied football season in school history here Friday night with a 46-6 decision over Teurlings High of Lafayette.

St. Joseph ended its regular season with a 10-0 record. No team in the 13-year football history of St. Joseph had posted a perfect season record.

St. Joseph will meet unbeaten, untied Port Barre High school in a post-season playoff game to decide the District 4-B championship next Friday night, 8 o'clock, at Rayne Athletic Field.

St. Joseph netted 200 yards rushing and completed eight of 13 passes for another 224 yards against Teurlings.

In the first period, Luther Green started the St. Joseph scoring when he sprinted 12 yards for a touchdown. Gene Romero had recovered a Teurlings fumble to set the stage for Green's scoring run. Green also ran for the extra point.

Later in the same period Billy Link ran 37 yards for a touchdown to cap a 60-yard St. Joseph drive.

Link scored his second touchdown early in the second quarter when he raced 26 yards for a score to climax a 62-yard march by St. Joseph. Link ran for extra point.

Later in the second quarter Bob Richard recovered a Teurlings fumble on the latter's 25-yard line and St. Joseph drove for another score. John Menard—who completed eight passes in 13 attempts

for 224 yards during the game—ran the final 5 yards for the score. Alex LaCroix ran the extra point.

LaCroix snatched 1 yard for a St. Joseph touchdown, then ran the extra point to put St. Joseph in front 34-0 at halftime.

In the third period St. Joseph drove 60 yards with Link scoring on a 10-yard run. The final St. Joseph touchdown came later in the third frame on a 32-yard aerial from Menard to Edward Habetz.

Stanley Arceneaux bucked 1 yard to end a 59-yard drive in the fourth period for the only Teurlings score.

Link with 101 yards in 10 carries and Green with 80 yards in 11 trips sparked the St. Joseph ball-carriers. Menard was the passing star and his favorite target was LaCroix, who caught three passes for a total of 95 yards. Romero, Richard, Daniel and Edward Habetz, Billy Heinen, Mike Berrier, John Trahan and Wally Link anchored St. Joseph on defense.

Ryder Was Solid Football Runner

George Ryder, Port Barre's veteran halfback, won the individual ball carrying title for Southwest Louisiana during the 1959 prep football season.

Ryder, a 175-pound senior who earned his third letter at Port Barre this fall, averaged 15.9 yards per carry in taking home the ball-carrying crown. Ryder carried the ball 79 times, and netted 1,257 yards for the Red Devils.

Long runs helped Ryder boost his carrying average throughout the year. In Port Barre's 10-game schedule, he had six touch-down runs of 40 yards or better.

Perhaps his most outstanding performance came against St. Edward of Eunice, when he carried the ball only four times, but gained 124 yards. In that game, he also returned a punt 90 yards for a score.

Second on the list of Southwest Louisiana ball carriers came South-

Cameron's fullback, MacArthur Rutherford. Rutherford, who won the area scoring championship with 136 points, had 105 carries for the Tarpons, and netted 1,066 yards, an average of 10.1 yards per try. No other player bettered 10 yards per try during the season.

Busiest back of the season was Crowley's Garland (Buddy) Hamie, a strong fullback who ran with the ball 204 times and netted 1,332 yards. Hamie's net total was the most yards gained by any back this fall.

Second best in the matter of total yards gained came Loreauville's Merlin Walet, who netted 1,247 yards in 174 carries. Walet had a 7.2 average.
