

# Rebels In 7-B Test

ABBEVILLE — An injury-riddled Teurlings of Lafayette football squad will meet Mt. Carmel of Abbeville here Friday night in a District 7-B contest.

Teurlings coaches Bill Michot and Dean Daigle reported that spirit is high despite a siege of injuries. Eight Rebel starters have been lost because of injuries, accidents and a transfer.

Mt. Carmel opened its season last week with a convincing 27-7 decision over Midland.

The Rebels have been seiged by a series of setbacks since spring practice last year. Before school opened, three starters were lost due to accidents and a transfer. Since August 15, the Rebels have lost the services of four more starters and another is doubtful. Right guard Alden Stutes, quarterback Robert Romero and halfback George Gardiner are nursing broken fingers, and key runner Bryant Gilder is out with a knee injury.

Gilder scored 87 points for the Rebels last year and does all the kicking for the team. His absence will be a severe handicap.

Romero, Stutes and Gardiner may see limited action in the Mount Carmel game, but starting tackle Kenneth Plouet is on the doubtful list because of a bruised thigh suffered this week.

Probable starters for Teurlings will be ends John Gardiner and Arthur Courville, tackles Keith Zimmerman and Jesse Champagne, guards Douglas Naquin and Donald Abadie, center James Simon, quarterback Pat Brinkman, halfbacks George Broussard and Bill Ashy and fullback Stanley Arce-neaux.

# Mt. Carmel Wins Over Rebs, 19-6

ABBEVILLE — The Mt. Carmel Eagles, stung by a lightning-quick Teurlings of Lafayette touchdown, rallied in the second half to win 19-6 in a District 7-B football game here Friday night.

## Crimson Tide Vaults Over Georgia 21-6

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP)—Alabama's Crimson Tide uncorked a startling offense, succeeded in blunting Georgia's vaunted passing attack and smothered the Bulldogs 21-6 before a national television audience Saturday.

Little Billy Richardson, a 168-pound junior fullback, was the big gun in an Alabama attack that piled up more points than Crimson Tide team has scored since beating Furman 28-6 in 1958.

In the first half alone, when 'Bama poured it on for a 21-0 lead at intermission, Richardson gained 58 yards single-handed—two more yards than the entire Georgia team made on the ground. Georgia got its only touchdown in the waning seconds. Billy Jackson, a sophomore halfback, took an Alabama punt on the Georgia 19 and raced 78 yards to the Alabama three. From there Francis Tarkenton fired the ball to halfback Dan Davis in the end zone as the final buzzer sounded.

## Beman Is New Amateur Champ

ST. LOUIS — Deane Beman, a compact little guy who loves pressure, brought the course, par and dapper Bob Gardner to their knees Saturday and captured the 60th National Amateur golf championship with a relentless 6 and 4 triumph.

Brilliant iron play and clutch putting when he needed it the most spun the 22-year-old, 143-pound Maryland senior around 32 holes at the sun-drenched St. Louis Country Club course in a spectacular 5 under par.

Teurlings broke a scoreless deadlock early in the third period when center Jim Simon picked up a Mt. Carmel fumble and sprinted 45 yards for a touchdown. The extra point attempt failed.

The Eagles came back with a scoring drive later in the third quarter. It covered 64 yards and Richard Langlais got the touchdown on a 4-yard smash through tackle. Quarterback Charlie Howell ran for the extra point to put Mt. Carmel ahead 7-6.

Early in the fourth quarter Mt. Carmel's John Megison, who had earlier fumbled the punt that resulted in the Teurlings touchdown, fielded a Teurlings kick and raced 45 yards for a score. The attempted run for the extra point failed and Mt. Carmel led 13-6.

The final Eagle score came late in the game when halfback Ray Bernard smashed over from the 2-yard line. The scoring thrust was set up when guard Chris Segura recovered a Teurlings fumble on the latter's 18-yard line. Bernard's 16-yard run was a key gain in the short scoring drive.

Mt. Carmel piled up 15 first downs and netted 261 yards rushing while holding Teurlings to 54 yards on the ground.

Teurlings Coach Bill Michot praised the work of 13-year-old freshman guard Keith Zimmerman, who moved up to a starting tackle post only Friday.

The "biggest factor," said Michot, "was the loss of our captain and defensive quarterback James Simon. On the play after he scored our touchdown, he went down under a kickoff and dislocated his elbow. He's probably out for the season, but he did a wonderful job for us while he was in there."

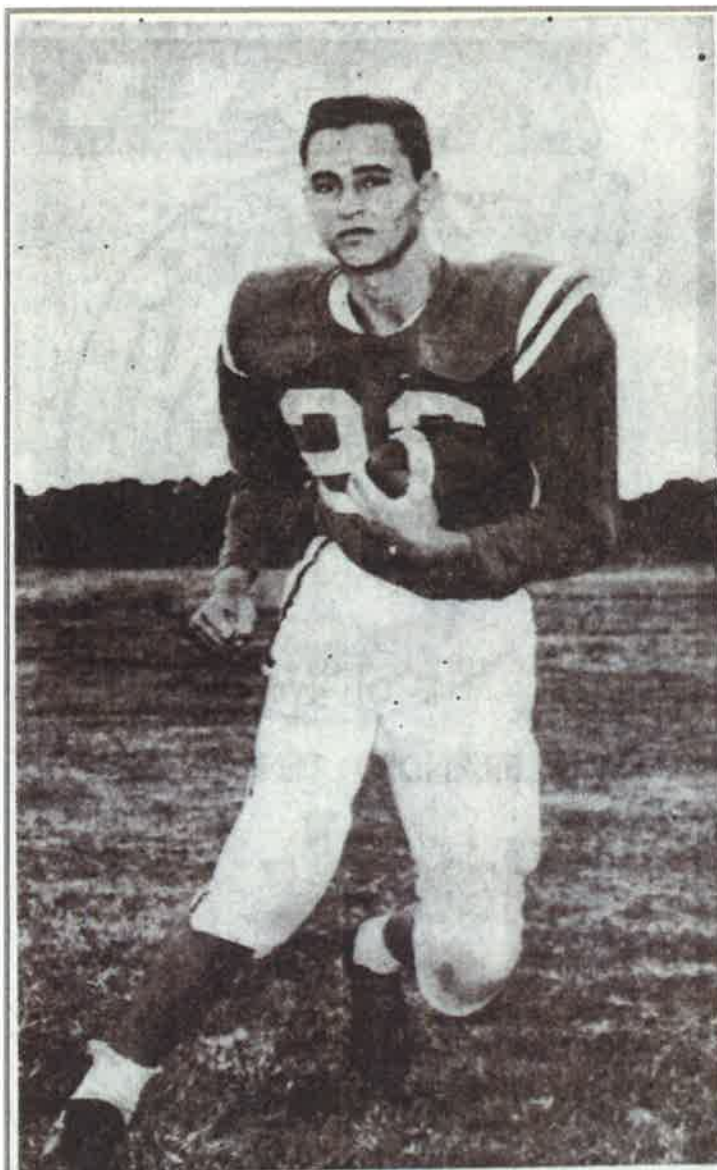

# Teurlings To Play First Home Game Friday Night

Teurlings of Lafayette will host Loreauville High Friday night, 7:30, at Clark Field in a District 7-B football game that promises to develop into a wide-open offensive game.

Loreauville, unbeaten in two starts, is sparked 6-1, 205-pound senior fullback Merlin Walet. The Tigers beat Catholic High 13-7 last week as Walet scored two touchdowns and gained 114 yards rushing.

Teurlings Coach Bill Michot reported this morning that he'll have all but two of his starters ready for Loreauville. Halfback Bryant Gilder is back in action after missing four weeks of work because of injuries, and quarterback Bob Romero will start after seeing only limited action last week.

Teurlings dropped a 19-6 decision to Mt. Carmel of Abbeville in its opener last week.

Another Rebel starter ready to go is guard Alden Stutes, who had been nursing a hand injury.

"Loreauville has been strictly a power-and-speed team this season," said Michot. "Walet was the 10."

B players with more than 100 points last year and he's even better this season. He's the man leading scorer among state class we'll have to stop."

The return of Gilder will boost the Rebels, although the junior halfback won't be at top speed. Last season Gilder scored 87 points last season, to rank behind Walet in the 7-B scoring race.

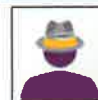

# Loreauville In 27-7 Grid Win

Loreauville's Tigers rode the power - running of 205 - pound senior fullback Merlin Walet to a 27-7 victory over the Teurlings Rebels of Lafayette Friday night at Clark Field.

Walet scored three touchdowns. His first came on a 15-yard run early in the second period. The powerful Tiger runner scored later in the same period on a 60-yard run from scrimmage. He added his third touchdown when he returned the second - half kick-off 80 yards.

The other Tiger touchdown was scored by end Don Ashurst, on a

6-yard pass from quarterback J. O. Neuville.

The Rebels scored their touchdown in the third quarter on a 6-yard plunge by Stanley Arceneaux that capped a 70 - yard drive. A 53-yard pass from halfback Bryant Gilder to end Arthur Courville was the key play during the drive.

Gilder also did an outstanding job punting. The senior halfback averaged 47 yards on five punts. His longest was a 50 - yard quick-kick in the first period of play.

Walet dominated the game with his running. The big fullback netted 155 yards rushing and also played a fine game on defense.

Teurlings' standouts in the line included John Gardiner and Jesse Champagne. Gilder, George Gardiner and Arceneaux starred in the Rebel backfield.

Gilder made tackles all over the field on defense and also played a tremendous offensive game in his first start of the season. He returned to the Rebel lineup last week after recovering from pre-season injuries.

## Teurlings In 33-0 Victory

YOUNGSVILLE — Teurlings of Lafayette defeated Youngsville 33-0 in a District 7-B football game here Sunday afternoon. The victory was Teurlings' first of the season after three losses.

The Rebels scored two touchdowns in the first period and were never threatened afterward.

The Teurlings touchdowns came this way:

(1) Halfback Bryant Gilder passed 40 yards to halfback Arthur Courville to cap a drive of 80 yards that started with the opening kickoff. Fullback Stanley Arceneaux ran for the extra point.

(4) Teurlings took a Youngsville punt and drove 60 yards, with Brinkman getting the touchdown on a 20-yard run around left end. The point-after attempt failed.

(5) Gilder ran 15 yards on a trap play to climax a 75-yard drive. Halfback George Broussard ran for the extra point.

Coach Bill Michot called the victory "a real good team effort," and said the Rebels played their best game of the season.

Youngsville passed the midfield stripe only once, in the third period.
