# Lafayette, Fatima Cop Wins; Vikings, Rebels Play To Tie

Lafayette's Mighty Lions, Father Teurlings' Rebels and the Fatima Warriors showed surprising strength in the 12th edition of the Kiwanis Football Jamboree at USL's McNaspy Stadium Friday night.

Lafayette, playing without the services of its three top halfbacks, rolled to a 19-6 victory over Cathedral in the first game and Fatima used one of razzle-dazzle plays to take measure of Breaux Bridge by a 6-0 margin in the second game. In the final contest both Northside and Father Teurlings faltered inside the 10-yard line and had to settle for a 0-0 deadlock.

Coach Rayford LeBlanc's Lions left little doubt that they would be a team to reckon with as they unveiled a powerful fullback and also showed greatly improved passing. Defensively the Lions were ready for Cathedral's great passer, Robert Trahan, and bottled him up with only two completions in nine attempts for a total of 23 yards.

26. Six plays later Edney broke over from one yard out and the Lions had a 13-0 bulge. Edney's kick failed.

In the second half after both teams had swapped the pigskin Cathedral took over on their own 28. After two running plays netted eight yards and moved the ball to the 35 Larry Bishop went wide around left end and scampered 45 yards to the Lafayette 20. Father Teurlings and Northside both showed a lot of offensive punch but neither showed well on defense until they got inside the 10-yard line. Northside took the ball at the start of the game and covered 27 yards in only four plays before John Thibodeaux.

The Rebels took the ball on the 34 and drove steadily down the field and in 10 plays had moved the ball to a first down and goal to go on the nine yard line of Northside. Rebel fullback Bob Thomas took four cracks and was

Northside made its bid for a score late in the game when they drove from their own 21 to the Rebel six before losing the ball on downs. Northside was aided by three Rebel penalties and a fine 26-yard keeper play by quarterback Robert Richard.

Northside got a first down on the Rebel 13 and moved to the eight in two plays but fumbles on the next two plays kept the Vikings from getting a good shot at a first down.

Northside had nine first downs to four for the Rebels and racked up 117 yards rushing to 80 for Teurlings. The only pass of the game came on the final play of the contest when Don Breaux hit Rick LeBlanc with a nine-yard aerial.

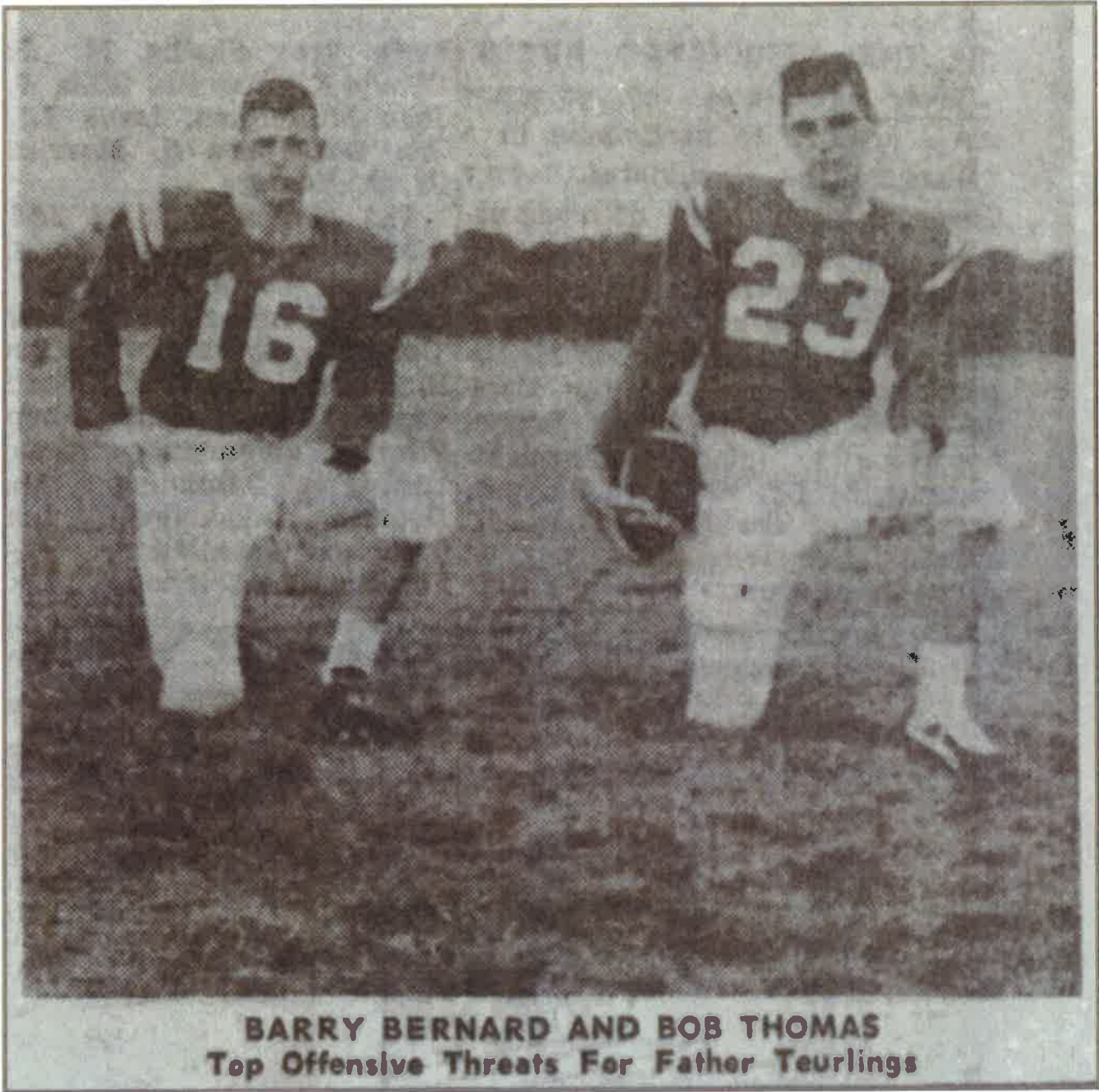

# Father Teurlings Opens Slate Here Tonight Against Scott

Coach Bill Michot unveils his 1963 Father Teurlings football team tonight at 8 p.m. at Clark Field when his Rebels tackle the Class A Scott Eagles in the regular season lid-lifter in Lafayette.

The Rebels rolled to a 9-1 standard in 1962 and Michot has compared his '63 team favorably with the 1962 eleven. If this year's game is anything like last season's contest it should be a thriller from the start. Father Teurlings had to score in the closing minute of the game to take a 25-20 victory over the Scott team.

Other games slated for tonight will find the state champion Catholic Panthers of New Iberia testing Hanson of Franklin in a District 5-A tilt and Sunset tackles Cecilia in the other opener.

Michot has four regulars back in action from last year's team in end Don Theriot (135), tackle Keith Zimmerman (225), quarterback Mike Tausin (145) and fullback Bob Thomas (170). In addition to these players Michot can also call on four lettermen to fit into the starting lineup. Guard Glenn Webb (185), tackle Rene Picard (205), and halfbacks Butch Leger (160) and Barry Bernard (140) will play key roles in the Father Teurlings plans.

Zimmerman is being boomed as one of the top linemen in Class B football and he showed why last week in the Kiwanis Football Jamboree when he played a fine game against Northside and helped his Rebels gain a 0-0 tie with the Class AA team.

The Rebels have three fine backs in Leger, Bernard and Thomas and it is hard to single one of them out. Leger will probably do most of the breaking away for the Rebels from his halfback position while Thomas handles the tough yardage from his fullback

deur (140), quarterback Willard Hanks (135) and fullback Jimmy Baker (160).

Many observers feel that the Catholic Panthers can repeat as state champions if they can keep from getting key individuals hurt during the season. Right now coach Bob Banna has halfback Herbie

LeBlanc and tackle Nat Toulon not up to par and both are valuable members of the Panther Squad.

The Panthers figure to be stronger defensively especially without the services of LeBlanc. Pharr should be one of the top offensive threats for the Panthers with his passing.

Hanson was dealt a crushing blow when they lost the services of big tackle Lawrence St. Blanc, a 220-pound all-star prospect. But they have center Dan Hidalgo (160), guard Torger Brown (175), halfback James Barrilleaux (155), end Al Troclair (135), fullback James Dugas (160), end Gordon Booser (155) and quarterback Jody Boudreaux (160) to serve as a nucleus for the team to build around.

Sunset will have six starters back in action in end Michael Landry (160), tackle Roddy Lemaire (170), tackle Ronald Burleigh (165), quarterback Frederick Bourque (150), and halfbacks Velton Stelly (145) and Kenneth Savoie (145). Lettermen are guard Carroll Menard (150), quarterback Carroll Domengeaux (140) and fullback Wayne Savoie (140).

Cecilia has the makings of another good club this season. They have guard Wiley Latilais (160), tackle Jack Hurst (190), end Donald Dupuis (175), quarterback Ronald Landry (150), halfback Leonard Scrantz (135) and fullback Jimmy Caillier (180) returning as regulars. Their National League lead is now down to five games over second-place St. Louis.

Hubbs, who led the league in strikeouts with 129 last year and was equally proficient at hitting into doubleplays, crossed up the book Wednesday night by lining a two-out single in the 11th inning that gave the Chicago Cubs a 2-1 decision over first-place Los Angeles.

The Dodgers' board of strategy held its meeting after Andre Rodgers led off the 11th with a single and moved around to second on a sacrifice. With two out, it was decided to give Williams—who outhits Hubbs by about 50 points—an intentional walk.

That decision lopped a full game off the Dodgers lead over the surging Cardinals, who extended their longest winning streak of the season to seven games as Ken Boyer's 100th run batted in provided the decisive score in a 6-5 victory over the

The Cubs opened the scoring against the Dodgers in the sixth on singles by Rodgers and Ellis Burton and a sacrifice fly by Ron Santo. The Dodgers tied it in their half on doubles by Jim Gilliam and Tommy Davis.

# Bernard Sparks Victory Powerful Rebels Belt Scott By 14-6 In '63 Grid Opener

Memo to Father Teurlings' opponents — forget it if you think the Rebels will be any weaker this season, they may be a little better than in 1962.

Coach Bill Michot's got 1963 off on the right foot Thursday night by whipping Class A Scott by a 14-6 score on the dazzling runs of halfback Barry Bernard, who scored both Rebel touchdowns and racked up 133 yards rushing in 11 carries.

But the game wasn't all Father Teurlings as the Scott Eagles moved the ball well and for a time looked to have the game well in hand. The Eagles scored in the second period and held that margin until the third period.

The game was played in a steady rain and although the ball was slippery the contest never did get sloppy.

Scott capitalized on a fumble by Rutch Leger to take over the football and drive 13 yards for its first touchdown. First little halfback Johnny Richard sparked the drive with his fine sweeps and finally got the score from nine yards out with nine minutes to go in the second half.

The Rebels lost the ball three times on fumbles in the first half as they never could get their offense cranked up. The powerful Rebels had only three first downs and 43 yards total offense in the first half while Scott got 117 yards rushing and had six first downs.

But in the second half Bernard took things into his own hands and decided to please the home folks in the season opener. The Rebels kicked off to Scott and then drove the ball to the Teurlings' 27 before Richard Goureaux fumbled and Glenn Webb fell on the pigskin.

The Rebels gained seven yards but were then set back to the 29 by an offside penalty before Bernard flashed 56 yards to the Scott 41. Bob Thomas got eight to the 33 and then quarterback Mike Tausin rolled around and for 17 to the Eagle 16. On the next play Bernard hit paydirt from 16 yards out. Tausin laked into the middle of the line and rolled around end for the PAT and the Rebels led 7-6.

Tommy Guilbeau kicked the ball for Scott on the second play of the final quarter and Bernard grabbed it on the 35 and dashed back to the 49. Three plays later the little scabbard broke loose for a

47-yard scoring sprint and Tausin again ran for the PAT.

The Rebels played a fine defensive game against the quick sweeps of Richard and Richard Goureaux. Bob Thomas, Steven Comeaux and Keith Zimmermann did a fine job defensively for the Rebels.

One of the brilliant features of the game for the Rebels was the excellent punting of Donald Theriot who averaged 59 yards per kick on three efforts. Theriot got off kicks of 38, 65 and 47 to keep

Scott well in their territory most of the night.

The Rebels will field a big ball club with right tackle Keith Zimmerman weighing in at 225 pounds, left tackle Rene Picard tipping the scales at 205 and guard Webb weighing 185.

The Rebels should have as good a backfield as last year although none of their backs possess the break-away speed that Don Tauzin did. But Butch Leger and Barry Bernard are strong, talented halfbacks and Bob Thomas could develop into one of the top backs in the area.

Mike Tauzin will probably handle most of the Rebels field general's duties but Bob Duhon is probably the better passer of the two.

The Rebels open their season on September 5 against

Scott at home and then play Mt. Carmel of Abbeville and Hackberry before hitting the road for tilts against St. Joseph of Rayne and Cecilia. Erath, Fatima and St. Bernard of Breaux Bridge will all be home tilts for the Rebels before they hit the road for games with Delcambre and St. Edmunds of Eunice to close out the season.

Assistant coaches for Father Teurlings are Dean Daigle and Gordon Coreil.

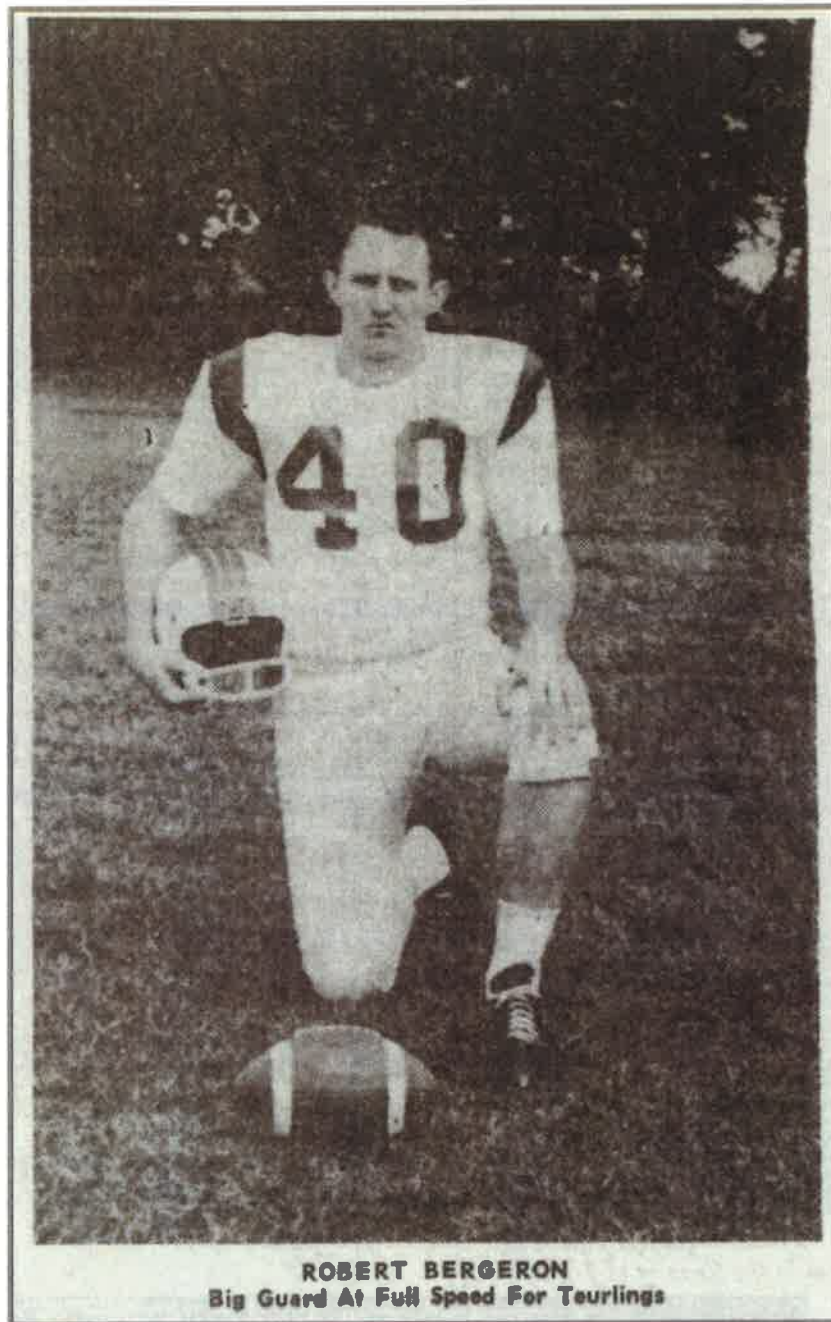

# Fatima Warriors Protect No. 1 Rating By Belting Teurlings

Fatima's brilliant defensive unit stopped Father Teurlings on the six-yard line with less than a minute remaining in the game and protected its No. 1 rating in the state with a 13-7 victory over Rebels at Clark Field Saturday night in a District 7-B clash.

Fatima showed a bruising ground attack that tore the Teurlings' defenses apart in the second half after the Rebels had intercepted a pass in the first half and taken a 7-0 lead into the intermission.

It was the seventh straight victory for the Warriors and marked a very important district triumph. It was the third without a defeat for the Fatima Warriors and moved them into a good position to take the district championship.

But all of the work of the Fatima team almost went down the drain in the closing minutes of the contest. Teurlings got the ball on a Fatima punt on its

Duhon then tried to pass to the left side but Bob LeJeune made a diving interception on the six-yard line and Fatima was able to run out the clock.

Teurlings never did get its offense rolling even though the Rebels had a big weight advantage in the line. The only score of the Rebels came in the first period when Barry Bernard intercepted Ray Mouton's pass on the Fatima 21 and went over untouched. Bob Thomas

ran for the PAT and the score read 7-0.

Fatima moved to the Teurlings 15 and to the Rebel eight in the second quarter but each time the Teurlings' defense was able to turn back the threat.

But the second half was a different story as Teurlings couldn't handle the potent Fatima ground attack and the Warriors cracked into the Rebel line for three and four-yard gains almost at will.

St. Bernard of Breau Bridge is trying to make a mess out of the District 7-B race.

The Crusaders remained in the running for the district championship Thursday night as they hit for a quick touchdown and made it stand up until the Father Teurlings Rebels gave them another in the fourth quarter to ruin the Rebels' Homecoming celebrations by scoring a 13-0 victory.

Early in the second quarter the Rebels recovered a St. Bernard fumble on the Crusader's 28. Butch Leger and Mike Tausin moved the ball to a first down on the St. Bernard 17. Leger then picked up six yards to the 11 but on the next play Tausin fumbled the ball and had to fall on it at the 11-yard line for no gain. Tausin took to the air on the next play and

Robin grabbed off the pass in the end zone and ran it out to the 17-yard line to end the Teurlings' threat.

# Segura, Fruge Spark All-Southwest Class B Team; Stoma Cited For Best Coaching Job

A fast - stopping quartet of backs headed by Erath's brilliant Terry Segura and a rugged line sparked by St. Michael's big center David Fruge make up the 1963 All-Southwest Class B team selected for the Louisiana Sports Writers Association.

Fatima's young mentor Phil Stoma was honored for taking his Warriors through the regular season unbeaten by being lauded for the best coaching job in the Southwest Area Class B ranks. Stoma took a Fatima team in its second year of varsity football and led the War-

riors to ten straight victories before Erath bumped off the Warriors in the playoffs for the District 7-B championship.

Terry Segura followed in the footsteps of his brother Bob Segura who gained all-area honors in 1962 as a quarterback for the Erath eleven. Terry made the switch from halfback to quarterback following Bob's graduation and was the leader of the Rebel team that won its second straight District 7-B championship.

Segura piled up 676 yards rushing for the Rebels during the season although he missed two games at the start of the season due to a broken hand. He also passed for over 200 yards and averaged 37 yards per kick.

Fuge headed a St. Michael line that was lauded as one of the biggest in the state. The Crusaders averaged 205 pounds per man in the forward wall and the 6-2, 180-pound Fruge was the anchor of the St. Michael line. St. Michael was the team that eliminated Erath, beating the Rebels in the bidistrict playoffs and it was Fruge who played a major role in that victory.

The all-star backfield featured two backs who topped the 1,000-yard mark in ground gaining. Lake Arthur's Ray Fleur, a 6-0, 150-pound ram, rushed for 1214 yards and caught

passes good for over 200 additional yards and scored 83 points. Jeannette's Roy Pontiff sparked a Jeannette team that won only one game all season as he rushed up 1067 yards rushing and caught passes for 109 yards.

The other member of the talented backfield was Merryville's Robert Burr who scored 82 points and rushed for 781 yards. Burr caught passes for good for 124 yards.

Two pass-catching demons who also starred on defense manned the terminals. Fatima's Pat Duffey who caught 25 passes for 325 yards and five touchdowns and Al Davenport of Sacred Heart of Ville Platte who hauled in 15 passes for 250 yards and three touchdowns grabbed off the first-team votes.

The tackle positions were the only spots in the line where the all-stars had a 200-pound plus player. Delcambre's Ronald Espagne, a 5-11, 205-pounder and Ladd Wainwright of South Cameron, a 5-4, 205-pounder were the anchor men on the all-star line.

John LaFleur of Elton and Layne Landreneau of Mamou were the light, but hard-nosed guards on the first unit. LaFleur was brilliant for Elton as a linebacker and offensive

blocker and Landreneau was named the top lineman in District 4-B.

But even the second unit was enough to make most coaches take a cut in pay just to be able to coach it.

The ends were Dub Hardcastle of Kinder and Bill Miller of Lake Arthur; tackles were Keith Zimmerman of Father Teurlings and Nick Hebert of Oberlin; guards Roy Cosse of Paulina and Eugene Frederick of Erath and the center was Lynn Conner of South Cameron.

In the backfield was Jerry Arson of Sacred Heart of Ville Platte at quarterback and the backs were Terry Langley of

Elton, Nick Russo of Sacred Heart of Morgan City and Glenn Flash of St. Michael of Crowley.

On the third team were Earl Franks of Merryville and Al Dabavel of Welsh at ends, John Monroaux of St. Michael and Michael Tate of Mamou at tackles, Russell Storer of Kinder and John Franks of Merryville and John Franks of Ville Platte at center.

Mike Sanner of Oberlin is the third unit quarterback and Ray Robin of St. Bernard of Breton Bridge, Dan Denon of Sam Houston and Pat Manuel of St. Edmund of Eunice round out the backfield.

The Class B all-area team is selected from all district teams of Districts 4-B, 5-B, 6-B, and 7-B.
