

Rebs May Be Tough For 7-B Foes

Father Teurlings had only a five-five record in District 7-B competition but most opponents will agree that the Rebels were a much better team than that and 1964 may prove that the Rebels still have some pretty good personnel around.

Former assistant Dean Daigle will take over the head job with the Rebels, replacing Bill Michot who turned in some outstanding seasons with the Teurlings team.

Teurlings opened last season rated as one of the top teams in the District 7-B chase. The Rebels whipped Class A Scott by 14-6 in the season opener but then lost an important game to Mt. Carmel of Abbeville by a 14-6 score in a league encounter.

The Rebels snapped back to defeat Hackberry 6-0 and then stomped St. Joseph of Jeanerette by a 32-6 margin. The Rebels then blanked another Class A team, Cecilia 14-0. But in another crucial 7-B contest the Rebels went down, this time before Terry Segura and Erath 21-7.

The big grudge game with Fatima came next and this ruined the Rebels' season as the Warriors pulled a big upset and knocked off the Rebels by 13-7. St. Bernard of Breaux Bridge defeated the Rebels by 14-0 and Delcambre knocked off the Lafayette team by 14-7.

Teurlings came back to even its season record in the final game of the season by defeating the St. Edmund of Eunice squad, 6-0.

Daigle feels that his team could be a contender if they can escape injuries. Daigle says that a couple of converted players will have to come through if the Rebels are to

One of the real bright spots for Teurlings is the return of their fine fullback Bob Thomas. The Rebel star is regarded as one of the top collegiate prospects in the state and should show 7-B opponents plenty on offense and defense. Thomas will probably play at 185 pounds.

Other lettermen back for the Rebels will be Glenn Webb (185), center Wayne Arceneaux (180), Guard Danny LeJeune (145), end David Romero (150), quarterback Bob Duhon (165), Halfbacks Ronald Menard (140) and Steven Comeaux (145) and tackle Rene Picard (220) and end E. J. Arceneaux (160).

Probable starters for the Rebels will be Arceneaux and Romero at ends, Picard and Gary Rabalais at tackles, Glenn Webb and Donald LeJeune at guards, Danny LeJeune at center.

Duhon will handle the field general's duties for the Rebels. Menard and Comeaux will be at the halfback spots and Thomas will be the fullback for the Teurlings' team.

Teurlings will open its 1964 season on September 11 against Scott in Scott. The Rebels then travel to Abbeville to engage Mt. Carmel and then play Loreauville in Loreauville on September 24.

The Rebels will return home for an engagement with St. Joseph of Jeanerette on October 2 and then host Cecilia on October 9. The next clash for the Rebels will on October 16 against Erath in Erath. The Rebels will meet Fatima in the big game of the season on October 22. St. Bernard of Breaux Bridge will host the Rebels on October 30.

Delcambre Is 7-B Favorite; Fatima Second Place Choice

Delcambre's 7-2 1963 football record and 11 returning lettermen impressed District 7-B coaches enough to install them as pre-season favorites.

The Panthers collected every first place ballot but their own as they gathered 24 votes to Fatima's 16. In being picked for second Fatima collected one first place vote, two seconds, a fourth and a last place vote to edge by Mt. Carmel, a team that garnered 14 points to take third ahead of Father Teurlings' 13 and St. Bernard's eight.

The Delcambre team has seven starters returning and lettermen enough to fill the other slots.

Left halfback Terry Dore is back to try for his fourth letter and quarterback Benny Dronet and fullback Wildie Primeaux are back to try for their third. Ronald Saunier, a speed merchant, is starting at the left half spot and will be

out for his third letter.

The Fatima Warriors, a team that lost only to Erath in the district playoff last season, may find it hard to match last season's fine 10-0 regular season record. The defense that allowed only 20 points will be hurting and Coach Phil Stome has only six lettermen returning, promising only that his eleven will "show up for the games."

Father Teurlings is still in the process of rebuilding but they could help to decide who wins the championship. The team won only five games last year but have 10 lettermen returning and what Coach Dean Daigle describes as the best fullback in the district (Robert Thomas, 185) and a fine running and passing quarterback (Bob Duhon). The halfbacks are light but have plenty of speed in the stop and go broken field running category.

Mt. Carmel will have the biggest line in district with both tackles and a guard

weighing in at over 200 pounds. The backfield has the speed to go all the way on just about every play and quarterback Shotty Hollier is an adequate passer.

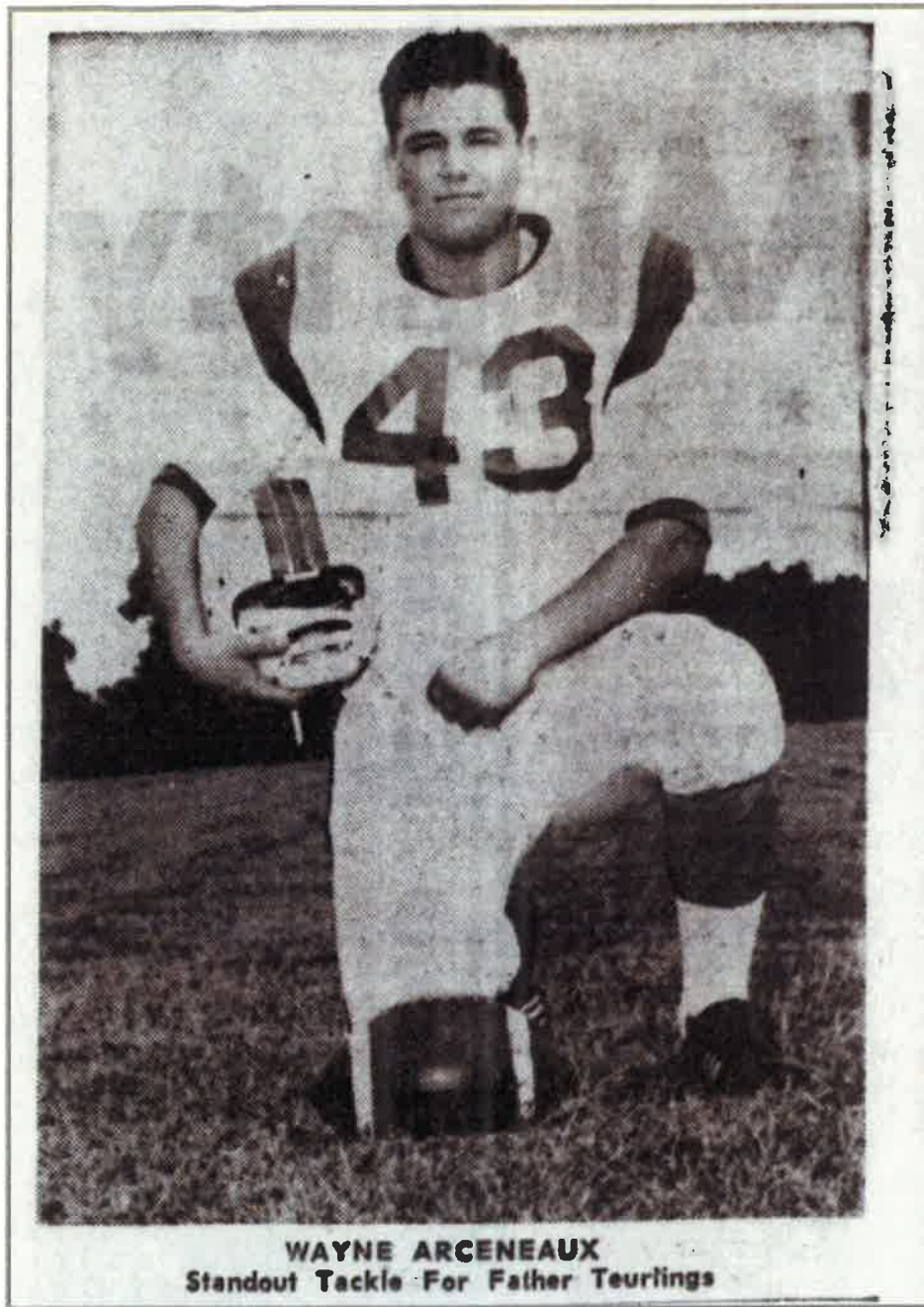

Thomas Stars Rebels Surprise Eagles By 19-0

SCOTT — Father Teurlings' Rebels showed unexpected strength in rolling to a 19-0 decision over the Class A Scott Eagles here Friday night.

Coach Dean Daigle's Rebels unveiled a bruising ground attack that rolled to 236 yards on the ground and 25 through the air for a total offense of 261 yards.

Teurlings also showed a rugged defensive unit and didn't allow Scott but 88 yards on the ground and six through the air for a total offense of only 94 yards.

The Rebels drew first blood in the game when Wayne Arceneaux scored from five yards out after Teurlings had put on a sustained drive. The Lafayette eleven got another marker in the second stanza when Ronnie Menard hit paydirt from 10 yards out. The extra point attempts after both scores proved unsuccessful.

Big Bob Thomas started out his senior year with a bang as he sparked the Rebel attack with his bruising running and was the spearhead of the Teurlings de-

fense from his linebacker spot.

Thomas got the final touchdown for the Rebels and put the game completely out of reach for the home-standing Eagles when he bolted into the end zone from the one-yard line. Bob Duhon ran for the extra point.

The Hub City team took to the air only four times and completed two while the Scott team tried three passes and completed one. Teurlings intercepted one Scott aerial. The Rebels punted one time for a big 40-yard average and Scott kicked three times for a 47-yard average.

Scott gave up the ball on fumbles three times and this helped kill all the offensive threats for the home eleven. Both teams were assessed 55 yards in penalties.

Fatima, Delcambre Clash Here Friday

Fatima and Father Teurlings try to keep their '64 football season record clean as they go up against tough opponents in their second week of action.

Teurlings travels to Mt. Carmel in Abbeville for their tilt while Fatima plays host to powerful Delcambre. Both Lafayette schools were successful in their initial engagements as Teurlings dropped Scott High 19-0 and Fatima edged by Judice 3-0.

Fatima's Ray Mouton kicked a 35 yard field in the Warrior victory, that coming in the third quarter.

In the Rebel win Bob Thomas turned in a three-touchdown performance and rushed for tremendous yardage. All his touchdowns were on runs. Teurlings gained 261 yards total offense with 236 via the

ground route. Scott managed 10 first downs but only with the aid of numerous Teurlings penalties. They gained 88 yards on the ground and six by passes.

Delcambre, ranked ninth in this weeks Associated Press Class B poll, is expected to give Fatima one of its strongest tests this season. In last week's action Delcambre swarmed Sunset to a 41-20 tune, piling up 415 yards total offense. The ground game netted 350 of those yards with quarterbacks chipping in a perfect five for five performance. Fatima is not ranked in the top ten but received votes for a position in the elite group.

Delcambre's pass defense is doubtful — they allowed 100 yards on nine completions in 14 attempts and Fatima Coach Phil Stoma is not overlooking

the possibility that he might have a chance with his aerial game.

In Distict 7-B Tilt Mt. Carmel Nips Teurlings By 6-0

ABBEVILLE — Mt. Carmel scored a touchdown with 2:26 left in the football game here Friday night and edged Father Teurlings of Lafayette 6-0.

The winning score came 16 plays after the Screaming Eagles had taken over on their own 40 yard line. Penalties helped the drive when it seemed stalled on the Teurlings eight yard marker. A personal foul by a Rebel player moved the ball half the distance to the goal. But then Mt. Carmel was penalized five yards for delay of game before little quarterback Scotty Hollier pitched out to halfback Gary Williamson, who in turn tossed eight yards to right end Jimmy Simon for the touchdown.

Teurlings threatened several times, particularly in the first two periods. They took the kick off, failed to move and punted to the Mt. Carmel 30. The Screaming Eagles relinquished the ball via a fumble and Teurlings recovered.

The Rebels moved down to the 11 yard line before they gave up the ball on downs. Rebels Bob Duhon and Ronnie Menard did most of the carrying during the abbreviated drive.

In the second period Teurlings drove to the Mt. Carmel 17 before a 15 yard holding penalty was assessed against them. Screaming Eagle Frank Motty threw Steve Comeaux for a 12 yard loss to stop the threat.

In the third period Mt. Carmel threatened after Williamson recovered a Bob Thomas fumble on the Teurlings 27. The Eagles drove to the 22 then were penalized 15 yards for a personal foul. Immediately after that Williamson fumbled and the Rebel's Glenn Webb recovered on the Teurlings 23.

Bob Duhon led Teurling's rushers with a pickup of 41 yards in 12 carries. Mt. Carmel's James Motty picked up 56 on 12 rushes.

The last half was dominated by the Screaming Eagles who were in possession of the ball in 27 out of 45 plays.

Loreauville Blanks Teurlings By 21-0

LOREAUVILLE — Loreauville took advantage of injuries to key Father Teurlings players and racked up a 21-0 victory here last night.

The Tigers carried a 7-0 lead into the fourth quarter and quickly put the game out of the Rebels' reach. Dave LeBlanc dealt the first blow with a three yard run around right end for the first final period score, with quarterback Glenn Dauterive sneaking for the point after.

Fullback Lynn Neuville then ran 10 yards up the middle for the final Tiger score and Dau-

terive passed to Terry Etie for the PAT.

Loreauville's first touchdown came in the second quarter on a 44 yard toss from Dauterive to end Etie. The same two players combined for the extra point. That drive started on the Tigers' 48 yard stripe.

Teurlings did not mount a serious threat in the entire ballgame with its top offensive threat, fullback Bob Thomas, hobbled by injuries.

Thomas, who saw only limited duty in the game, reinjured his shoulder in the third quarter.

Regular halfback Ronnie Menard saw no action at all and starting tackle Wayne Arceneaux played very little.

Teurlings Coach Dean Daigle said that Loreauville just "played better football than we did" and with his team not at full strength the Rebels were just no match for the fired up Tigers.

Teurlings was limited to 48 yards total offense and collected three first downs. Loreauville picked up 208 yards rushing and threw for 57 yards in the air.

The Rebels have now won one game and lost two. They have beaten Scott (19-0) and dropped a thrilling 6-0 clash to Mt. Carmel last week. This game marked the second week in a row that Teurlings failed to gain as much as 50 yards.

Strong Fatima Shuts Out Teurlings By 21-0

Fatima's hopes for a District 7-B title are now in the hands of Delcambre and St. Bernard of Breaux Bridge.

Fatima remained in the running for the 7-B title Thursday night by blanking arch rival Father Teurlings 21-0 in a game that definitely showed Fatima as the team with superior depth. The Warriors now have a 5-1 season mark and a 2-1 standard in district play. Teurlings is 0-2 in league and 3-4 for the season. Mt. Carmel is the district leader with a 2-0 mark but still must play St. Bernard and Delcambre before it can claim the league title.

Teurlings battled Fatima on almost even terms in the first half although the Warriors held a 7-0 halftime lead. Teurlings was on the Fatima nine-

yard line when the first half ended and it appeared that the Rebels were going to put up a good struggle.

But Fatima got to Teurlings in the third quarter for another score and the Rebels gave Fatima another and the game was not in doubt after the early minutes of the third quarter.

Early in the second quarter Bob Thomas fumbled and Terry Chaumont recovered the ball on the Fatima 24. The Warriors drove the 76 yards in nine plays and a 25-yard pass from quarterback Ray Mouton to end Steve Gardes being the key play. The pass was a fourth down play and the Warriors needed 11 yards for a first down. But the Warriors came up with the pass and got a first down on the Teurlings nine.

Ken LeJeune cracked in for seven yards to the two and on fourth down Mouton shoved his way over from the one-foot line. Mouton booted the extra point to make it 7-0.

Teurlings got in a hole in the third quarter and Jerry Johnson had to kick from his own 22. The ball went to the Fatima 43 where Bobby Lavin hauled it in and raced to the Teurlings 48.

Falcon and LeJeune were the top ball carriers in the drive as LeJeune got 14 yards and Falcon picked up 21. The Warriors picked up a first down on the Teurlings' one and two plays later Mouton barged over from the one. Mouton again booted the PAT to make it 14-0.

At the start of the fourth quarter neither team could move the


football and Falcon kicked from his own 23 to Johnson on the 33 but he fumbled and Bill Cobb covered it on the Teurlings' 19. It took the Warriors only four plays to score with Lavin going the final five yards for the touchdown. Mouton missed his first try at the PAT but he got another chance when Teurlings was offside and this time he made it good to run the score to 21-0.

The rugged Fatima defense held Teurlings to 32 yards rushing and 41 passing for a total offense of 90 yards. Fatima picked up 153 on the ground and

61 through the air for a total offense of 215 yards.

Teurlings' only sustained drive of the night came after the first Fatima score. The Rebels took the ball on their own 30 and started a drive. With big Bob Thomas doing yoeman work the Rebels moved to a first down on the Fatima 18.

Rebels Looking District Win

Father Teurlings may not have a chance for the District 7-B title but the Rebels may have a say as to who wears the crown when they take on the Fighting Crusaders in Breaux Bridge tomorrow night.

The Rebels have been plagued with injuries all season long and will have one of their starting tackles out this week — Wayne Arceneaux, out with a broked rib he sustained last week against Fatima.

St. Bernard won its first three games before falling to Judice and St. Francis of Iota on successive weekends. The Fighting Crusaders are still undefeated in district play, however, and bring a 3-2 record into the fracas.

In district proceedings, the Rebels haven't won a game in starts against Mt. Carmel and Fatima and bring an overall season mark of 3-4 into this game.

Teurlings' probable starting line will be Dan LeJeune and David Romero at the ends, Gary Rabalais and Glen Webb at tackle, E. J. Arceneaux and Don LeJeune at guard and John Trahan at the pivot post.

In the backfield Rebel Coach Dean Daigle will start Steve Comeaux at quarterback, Ronnie Menard and Bob Duhon at the halves and Bob Thomas at fullback.

Teurlings and St. Bernard both have depth problems but the Rebels appear to have a bigger problem than the Crusaders.

Teurlings opened its season on a stunning note, by racking up Scott by a 19-0 count. Then came the big battle with Mt.

Carmel and Eagles came out on the long end of a 6-0 score. Several injuries then hit the Rebels and they fell before Loreauville by a 21-0 margin.

The Rebels had a rough time edging St. Joseph of Rayne by a 7-6 score but then played one of their better games in rolling over Cecilia by a 14-7 margin.

Erath continued its mastery over the Rebels by scoring a 12-0 triumph and last week the Rebels had to settle for a 21-0 lacing at the hands of arch-rival Fatima.

St. Bernard got off to an even more impressive start, winning three straight games. The Crusaders bumped off Midland 13-0, blasted Jeanerette 27-6 and edged past Delcambre 60. But Judice put an end to the Crusaders' winning ways by blasting out a 32-12 decision. St. Francis of Iota then made the St. Bernard losing string two by scoring a 20-9 decision.

Ray Robin is the leader of the St. Bernard team and Bob Thomas is the key performer for Father Teurlings. Robin is a hard running halfback and Thomas operates out of the fullback spot. Thomas and Robin are also defensive standouts for their teams.

Teurlings should be in better shape this week with halfbacks Bob Duhon and Ronnie Menard back at full speed. Duhon is a former Quarterback and is the only one that can spell Thomas on offense. Steve Comeaux handles the field general's duties for the Rebels.

Frank Richard is the quarterback for the Crusaders and he has been very successful with

St. Bernard went into the game with a perfect 1-0 standard in district action and hopes of challenging Mt. Carmel of Abbeville for the title. Delcambre played Mt. Carmel to a 6-6 standoff Friday night and the

Screaming Eagles now own a 2-0-1 league mark.

St. Bernard is still in the running for the league title as the Crusaders are now 1-1 with games with Fatima and Mt. Carmel remaining. Two victories would give the Crusaders the title.

But for Teurlings' coach Dean Daigle the victory couldn't have been sweeter. The Rebels went through the entire 1963 season with a district win and had lost their first two league starts

this season.

Teurlings tries for its second upset in two weeks when the Rebels play Delcambre Friday night at Lafayette's Clark Field. The game is a District 7-B clash. The Rebels upset St. Bernard 6-0 last week and

handed the Fighting Crusaders their first conference loss of the year. It was Teurlings' first league win. Delcambre is on the rebound. The Panthers, after three straight midseason losses, have beaten Jean-

erette (51-12) and Gueydan (21-7), while holding defense-minded 7-B leader Mt. Carmel to a 6-6 tie. Delcambre has yet to win a district game, although the Panthers were the choice to win the title in a pre-season poll of the conference coaches.

Teurlings has had to depend mainly on its first eleven boys for its victories this season because the Rebels are sorely lacking in depth. The results have been good when all the boys are healthy but bad when they are not.

Fullback Bob Thomas has been the main offensive threat in the backfield for the Rebels this season, but injuries have slowed him up in crucial ball games. Halfback Ronnie Menard came of age in the St. Bernard game last week as he scored the lone touchdown of the game on a run from 46 yards out.

Teurlings probable line starters are David Romero and Dan Lejeune at the ends, Gary Rabalais and Glenn Webb at tackle, Don Lejeune and E. J. Arceneaux at the guards and John Trahan at center.

Teurlings Coach Dean Daigle will start Steve Comeaux at quarterback, Menard and Bob Duhon at the halves and Thomas at fullback.

Delcambre Crushes Teurlings By 27-0

Delcambre scored in every period here Friday night and downed the Rebels of Teurlings 27-0 in a District 7-B game at Clark Field.

Panther halfback Ronald Saunier tallied twice for Delcambre in the rain-drenched contest.

Jimmy LeBlanc opened Delcambre's scoring in the first quarter on a three-yard burst over the middle.

The fired-up Panthers scored again in the second period on Saunier's 23-yard jaunt to

make the score 14-0 at the intermission after quarterback Mike Delcambre converted the first two PATs.

Errol Broussard added to Teurlings' misery in the third frame when he ran 10 yards and a touchdown, as Delcambre rolled up a 20-0 third period lead. Quarterback Delcambre's try for the extra point was no good.

Mire scored the first of three Eagles touchdowns in the sec-

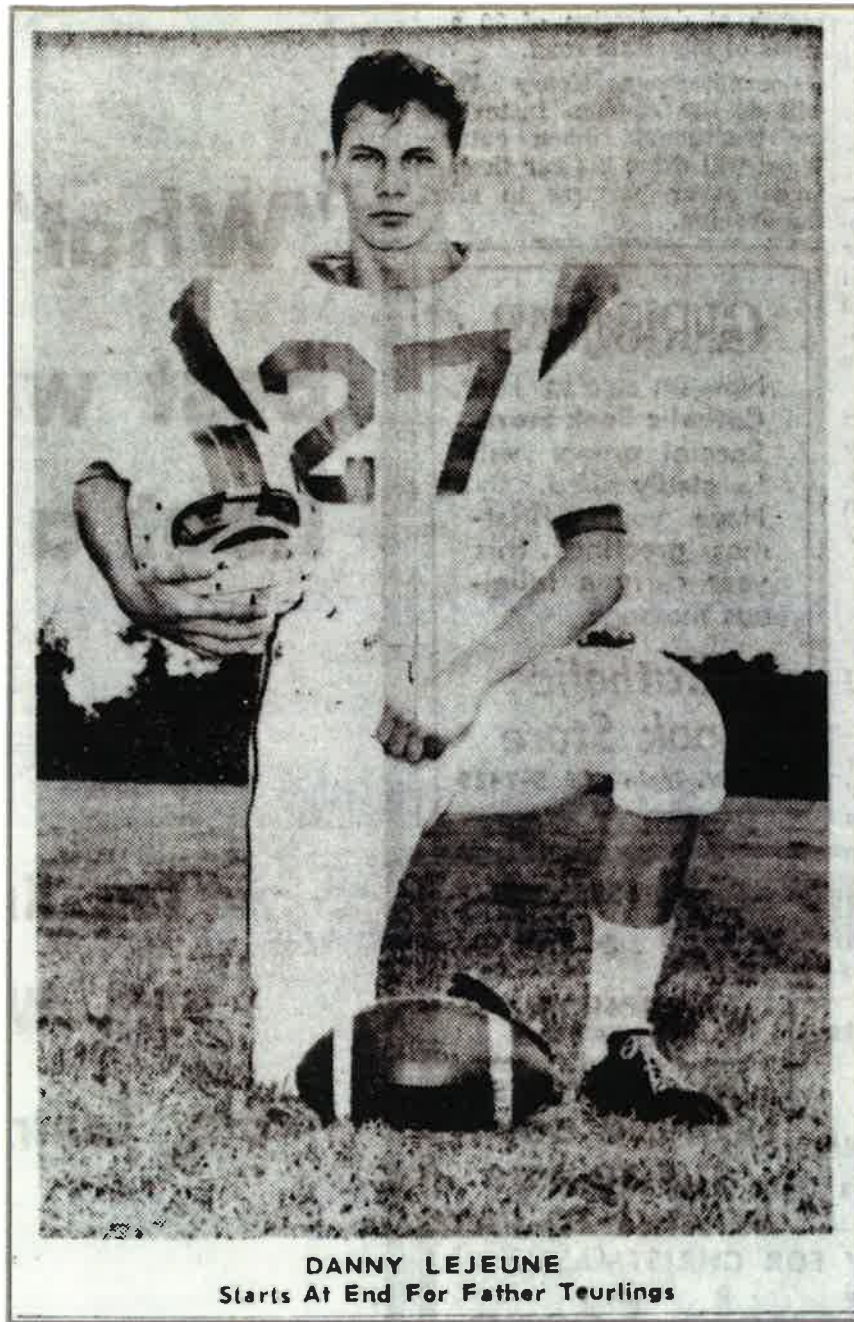

Teurlings Ends Year By Losing To Jays

Father Teurlings lost in his bid for a 500 season last night as St. Edmund beat the Rebels 19-6 in a non-district game played at Clark Field.

The Rebels finished their season with a 4-6 record as the Blue Jays from Eunice racked up 11 first downs to Teurlings' six.

Largely a defensive game through the first three quarters, St. Edmund broke it open in the third and fourth quarters with two big touchdowns and a 19-0 lead. Teurlings scored late in the final period.

St. Edmund's Whittie Hebert kicked to Rebel fullback Bob Thomas late in the 4th quarter who brought the ball out to the 36-yard line. Teurlings' quarterback Bob Duhon then handed off to Thomas twice in a row and the big back carried for seven and six yards. Duhon threw two passes incomplete, then hit halfback Jerry Johnson who carried the ball down to the St. Edmund 47-yard stripe. Halfback Romie then picked up a first down at the Blue Jay 38.

Duhon threw an incomplete pass but St. Edmund was penalized to the 33 for off-sides. Duhon and Thomas then teamed up for a pass-run play that carried to the Blue Jay 11 and on the next play the two teamed on another pass that car-

ried in for the score. A run for the extra point was stopped short.

St. Edmund picked up six first downs in the first half and held Teurlings to only two firsts and 42 yards total offense. The Blue Jays picked up 53 yards on the ground and 65 in the air that first half.

The first Blue Jay touchdown came in the second quarter with 8:30 showing on the scoreboard clock. The touchdown

came after a sustained drive of 67 yards and it took 16 plays for the Blue Jays to carry it in.

The big play in the drive was a third down pass completion from quarterback Charlie Montz to Robert Robira from the Teurlings' 38 to their five.

Robira carried to the two but was thrown back to the three on the next play. Pat Manuel carried it over from that point and Whittie Hebert kicked the only successful point after of the night.

That ended the scoring until the third quarter when Teurlings kicked off to the Blue Jays. They brought it back to the 38 and Gregory Chatagnier carried to the 43 on the first play from scrimmage. Robira carried for a first down to the Rebels' 48-yard stripe. On the next play Chatagnier burst through the Rebel line, and outraced the Teurlings safety the 48 yards for the touchdown.

With about four minutes left in the game St. Edmund took advantage of an errant Teurlings pass to score again. Whittie Hebert intercepted Duhon's pass at the Reb 35. Montz took to the air and hit Manuel at the four-yard line. Manuel, on successive rushes, lost to the five and gained to the three before Montz again took to the airways. He hit and Darryl Feucht for three yards and the score.

Thomas was the rushing leader for Teurlings, picking up 65 yards on 15 rushes. He also played a good defensive game at his linebacker position, making several fine tackles and preventing what may have been other Blue Jay TDs.

Chatagnier rushed for 93 yards for St. Edmund and led his team in that department.

Mt. Carmel, Fatima Lead 7-B All-District Selections

District 7-B champion Mt. Carmel of Abbeville landed three players and runnerup Fatima of Lafayette captured four in the balloting for the 1964 all-district team.

Carlton Falgout of Mt. Carmel was honored for doing the best coaching job in the district as his Screaming Eagles went through four district games with only a tie to mar its record.

Fatima claimed the top lineman and top back in the balloting. The Warriors' Terry Chaumont was selected the outstanding lineman in 7-B and his running mate Ray Mouton was tabbed as the outstanding back.

Chaumont, a starter for LaGrange of Lake Charles last year, came to Fatima this year and immediately made his presence felt as he supplied the spark that led the Warriors to a very successful 7-2-1 season. Chaumont, a 6-2, 190-pounder, was a standout blocker on offense from his tackle spot and then switched to line-backer on defense and also starred at his position.

Mouton has more than his share of credentials as the outstanding back. He threw

the football 113 times and completed 64 for a completion mark of 56 per cent. He gained 887 yards through the air and 185 rushing in 54 carries for a total offense of 1,072 yards. He threw for eight touchdowns and scored 42 points.

But Mouton was also a field goal kicker and handled the PAT duties. His 35-yard field goal defeated Judice 3-0 and a 19-yarder against St. Bernard of Breaux Bridge gave Fatima a 10-7 margin.

The bruising Mt. Carmel line had three of its standouts picked for the first eleven. Tackle Frank Motty, a 6-0, 225-pound terror on both offense and defense heads the Mt. Carmel trio. Sophomore James Landry, destined to become one of the finest ends this area has has even produced, landed one of the end spots and center Jim Simon captured the ball-snapping position for the Eagles.

Marcus Viator of Delcambre was the other selection at end. He caught 10 passes for 235 yards and two touchdowns and was one of the finest defensive ends in the league. Neal Saunier of Delcambre was one of the biggest vote-getters at his guard spot. He played line-backer for a Delcambre ele-

ven that came up with some fine defensive performances.

Fatima's other line choice was 5-10, 165-pound Bill Cobb who along with Landry of Mt. Carmel seems destined to become an all-state performer in the next two years. The rugged Fatima sophomore plays middle guard on defense and deals opposing centers plenty of misery.

The three running backs should make any coach happy. Ray Robin of St. Bernard, Steve Falcon of Fatima and Bob Thomas

of Teurlings round out the potent backfield.

Robin picked up over 1,000 yards total offense and is a repeater on the all-district eleven. He also recorded a 34.5 punting average and excelled on defense from his safety and line-backer positions.

Falcon probably has the most impressive statistics of all as the Warriors' star picked up 543 yards rushing, caught 29 passes for 424 yards and passed 13 times and completed six for 309 yards.
