After four days of August practice, the general opinion of the five head football coaches in Lafayette is optimism, but a trace of apprehension over the five day conditioning period.

Larry Dauterive's Fatima Warriors, who should challenge for District 5-B honors, will rely on the passing of senior signal-caller Bobby Bernard and the receiving of final-year split end Clay Judice, a Class B all-stater last year.

**Dauterive's band of 39, which includes 11 seniors, has delighted the first year tutor. He added that the attitude of the team is good and he was pleased with the condition of the players. A summer weight program, he noted, kept the boys in good shape and they reported in condition.**

Commenting on the conditioning period, the assistant to Philip Stoma last year, said it's "too long, three days would be better." He added that conditioning could be accomplished in three days what now is done over five.

Kicking is the main phase that is being stressed during the conditioning period at Fatima. But he added that ball handling and pass defense is also on the agenda for each day.

Fatima has scheduled three scrimmages before their Aug. 30 date with Northside in the Kiwanis Jamboree. On the 21st, the Warriors scrimmage St. Martinville on the home field at 6 p.m.

**Two days later Fatima**

**engages Cathedral and AIC of Opelousas at Cathedral. The Warriors' last scrimmage is scheduld for Aug. 26 against Notre Dame in Crowley. This will be mostly a passing affair, Dauterive noted.**

Pat Richard, who coached at St. Aloysius last year, will head Teurlings grid hopes this year in District 5-B. With a 33-player squad, Richard stated that one of his main aims is to convert the boys to his philosophy.

Since Richard did not have a spring training, he noted that it is difficult to determine the quality of players he has until contact work is initlated on Saturday.

During the conditioning time, the Rebels will stress discipline as well as the kicking game and offense, both running and passing.

**He added that the condition of the team has improved tremendously during the period. This he explained will help when he enters the jamboree to meet Teurlings.**

Richard expressed that the period will prevent a lot of heat exhaustion cases as well as heat cramps. This he commented is what people — doctors, mothers and others— are afraid of. It will cut down on the mortality rate of football players in Louisiana.

Northside's small group of performers have pleased Coach Chockey Kassom, now in his third year as top man.

Kassom, who is in favor of the conditioning period, expressed a point that other coaches noted — that is that the period

of conditioning was just too long. Most would like the timetable moved back to three days instead of five. The main object is to get started with contact work which is necessary, Kasem cited.

**During this exercise period, the Vikings will stress kicking as well as the pass offense which will be the key to Northside's hopes in '68.**

The first scrimmage is set for Aug. 24 against Catholic High of New Iberia in Lafayette.

The Mighty Lions of Lafayette High have pleased Frank Foreman with their performance. During the exercise period, the Lions are striving for agility and quickness as well as condition. Foreman also noted that ball handling and kicking are being stressed in addition to some phase of offense and defense.

With a varsity of 36 players, the Lions will tangle with Crowley on Aug. 20 in the first scrimmage and then battle Abbeville and Eunice in a three-way practice in Eunice on Aug. 23.

**Linden Bercegeay former assistant coach at Baker**

**will take over the reigns of the Cathedral Tigers from Billy Talbot.**

Bercegeay's cast of 32 players will continue to work on the kicking and passing phases of the game. He added that his aim is to teach the basic fundamentals both offensive and defensive during the conditioning period that ends Saturday.

The period in Bercegeay's opinion is a "tremendous help." This is the best way to get the boys into shape and he endorses the five day period.

The Tigers will drop down into the District 6-A, a class below last year.

Leadership will be an important factor to Bercegeay and his staff since they were not able to institute spring training last year. Three seniors who Bercegeay will key his team around are tailback Chris Arleth, guard Ed Lopez and tackle Mike Doucet.

Only one scrimmage has been scheduled by Bercegeay and that comes on Aug. 23 against Fatima and AIC of Opelousas with Cathedral acting as host.

With Bernard operating out of the shot gun offensive set-up, the highly touted senior slinger couldn't find open receivers or ones that could catch the ball and after three downs he punted to the Viking 31.

As the clock ticked away with 1:47 left in the first half, Landry scrambled around for 28 yards on the ground and several key passes to Benny Benoit and Rubin and moved the ball to Fatima's 33. A last second desperation pass fell incomplete.

The second half was a stalemate as both teams seemed to strengthen the defenses. Northside used more than six minutes of the second half with a slow methodical infantry movement.

DeSota picked up 93 yards rushing on five carries for Fatima while Landry netted 61 yards on the land and 143 yards through the air.

Pat Richard's Teurlings' Rebels got a tremendous effort from Solis as he completed three of four tosses for 43 yards and one touchdown. Add to this, the running of Tommy Guidry (29 yards) and Kenneth Menard (30 yards) and that makes the ingredients for a victory.

In the second game, Teurlings took the ball on their 35 and marched 65 yards on 11 plays. Guidry, Menard and Solis carried the brunt of the

rushing attack on alternate plays. Guidry went the final two yards on an off-tackle slant and running over two men. Rickey Constantine converted the PAT and Teurlings led 7-0 with 5:30 left in the first half.

Unable to get their offense geared up, the Tigers went into punt formation with Steve Denny set to punt. But Coach Linden Bercegeay's last thoughts were of a bad snap from center, and that's just what happened and Denny lost eight yards to the Tiger 27.

In two plays the Rebels were in the end zone on an exciting running pass from Solis to end Gary Procter for 23 yards. With 2:48 left, the Rebels led 13-0 as the kick was wide.

Cathedral's hopes of a touch-down were batted down by Darrell Guidry of Teurlings on a pass from quarterback David Ellis intended for Steve Credeur after the Tigers had driven to the Teurlings' 22 yard line.

The second half was mostly Cathedral. Using a primary running offense based around Denny, Credeur and Chris Arleth, Cathedral lit the scoreboard with a two yard plunge with 5:29 left in the game and a 13-6 advantage for Teurlings.

The big play on the drive was a 34 yard pass from Denny to John Chappius. Denny, playing at halfback, took the pitch out from Ellis and lifted

a pass gently down field to Chappius.

A desperation attempt by Cathedral to tie the game ended with the Tigers on the Rebel 33 yard line. The noted play that brought the Tigers into scoring position was a 33 yard pass from Ellis to Chappius.

In the night cap, Frank Foreman's Lions dominated the game with a ball-control rushing unit built around quarterback Luquette. Joining Luquette in the running department were fullback Glen Harder and halfbacks Dwight LeBauve and John Anderson.

The first half ended in a scoreless tie with neither team mounting a sustained drive.

After Breaux Bridge gave the ball up on downs in the second half, the Lions marched 69 yards to score the game's lone tally. On the drive, Anderson netted 26 yards, Luquette 26 yards and LeBauve 18.

Luquette dashed the last 13 yards as he rolled out left and bowled over two would-be tacklers. John Anderson made the PAT and the Lions led 7-0 with 3:12 left.

With the Tigers attempting to get on the scoreboard, Willard Foreman poked out a Kendall Richard aerial on the 47 yard line of Lafayette.

Lafayette had three runners with respectable yardage — Luquette 47 yards on eight carries, LeBauve had 36 yards on six totes and Anderson had 35 yards on seven carries.

# Teurlings Rebels Are Longshot Choice To Claim Crown For Boss Pat Richard

The Boston Red Sox won the 1967 American League championship as a 100-1 longshot. The Teurlings Central Rebels are remarkable similar to the Boston Braves in the odds department as well as the type of personnel.

## New Leader

The Red Sox called upon Dick Williams for help and now the Rebels call upon Pat Richard to form a new era.

Richard replaces Paul Brown, said whose team finished with a 6-3 record in 1967.

Senior quarterback Larry Solis is the Carl Yastrzemski type of take charge guy who may develop into the best leader in the District 5-B race. Solis, a 165-pound three-year letterman, is the mechanical type who runs the plays to perfection and has the ability to throw the ball on the run.

## Infantry Force

But there are other heroes. The main infantry force will be led by junior tailback Kenneth

Menard (150) and fullback Tommy Guidry, a 160-pound junior. At the wingback sophomore David Dutton (160) will be a primary receiver.

The interior make-up finds tackle Gus Nelson, 200-pound senior, and Earl Tanner, 165-pound senior, running forward as the line leaders.

The center position promises to be a battle between senior Robert Zumbrother, 110 pounds, and junior Glenn Bennett, 5-9, 170 pounds.

Guidry will come from Mike Boudreaux, 5-9, 170-pound co-captain. Joe Latta, 135-pound sophomore, and senior Rich Constantine (165).

## Outside Posts

The outside posts will be manned by Paul Guy, 160-pound senior co-captain, and Gary Greer, 9-2, 150-pound senior. However, sophomore Gary Proctor, 6-2, 170 pounds, is the best prospect of all as he indicated with a touchdown reception in the Rebels' 42-6 win over Calhoun in the Kiwanis Jamboree Friday night.

If a reserve is needed for Solis then freshman Johnny Nelson (135) will have to mature for the Rebels to have a successful season.

Richard is building for the future with a solid Bernard Boudreaux, 6-3, 180-pound sophomore tackle.

Because Richard has a limited player personnel, 10-foot blockers will have to do double duty.

## Front Wall

Defensively Nelson will line up at middle guard with Boudreaux and Tanner on his flanks. At tackle Randy Canard, a 145-pound senior, will relieve the tackles.

The terminals belong to Guy and Mike Thomas, a 110-pound junior.

Lanebackers stand prepared in Tommy Guidry and Dutton. The four deep secondary will consist of Solis, Menard, David Trahan, 150-pound senior, Charles Perry, 130-pound sophomore or Darrell Guidry, 140-pound sophomore.

If the offense which will be

built around Solis will feature a balance between the rushing and passing with a slant toward the running, if a deviation is shown. However, the Rebels' biggest weapon may be Solis' ability to run the ball out and throw out of the play to late receivers in Proctor, Guy, Menard and Dutton.

As usual if injuries come Teurlings will have to rely on a predominantly junior and sophomore unit and the season may turn out to be a fizzle.

## Kicking Game

Guy will do the Rebels' punting. Richard noted that Guy's punts have distance and good height to prevent rim kicks.

The conversions and kickoffs fall to Nelson, who handled the chores last year. He also is the back up punter.

If the Rebels are to overcome inexperience and a tough district schedule then Solis, Nelson, Menard and Guidry are the quartet that must have excellent seasons to bring Teurlings the district crown.

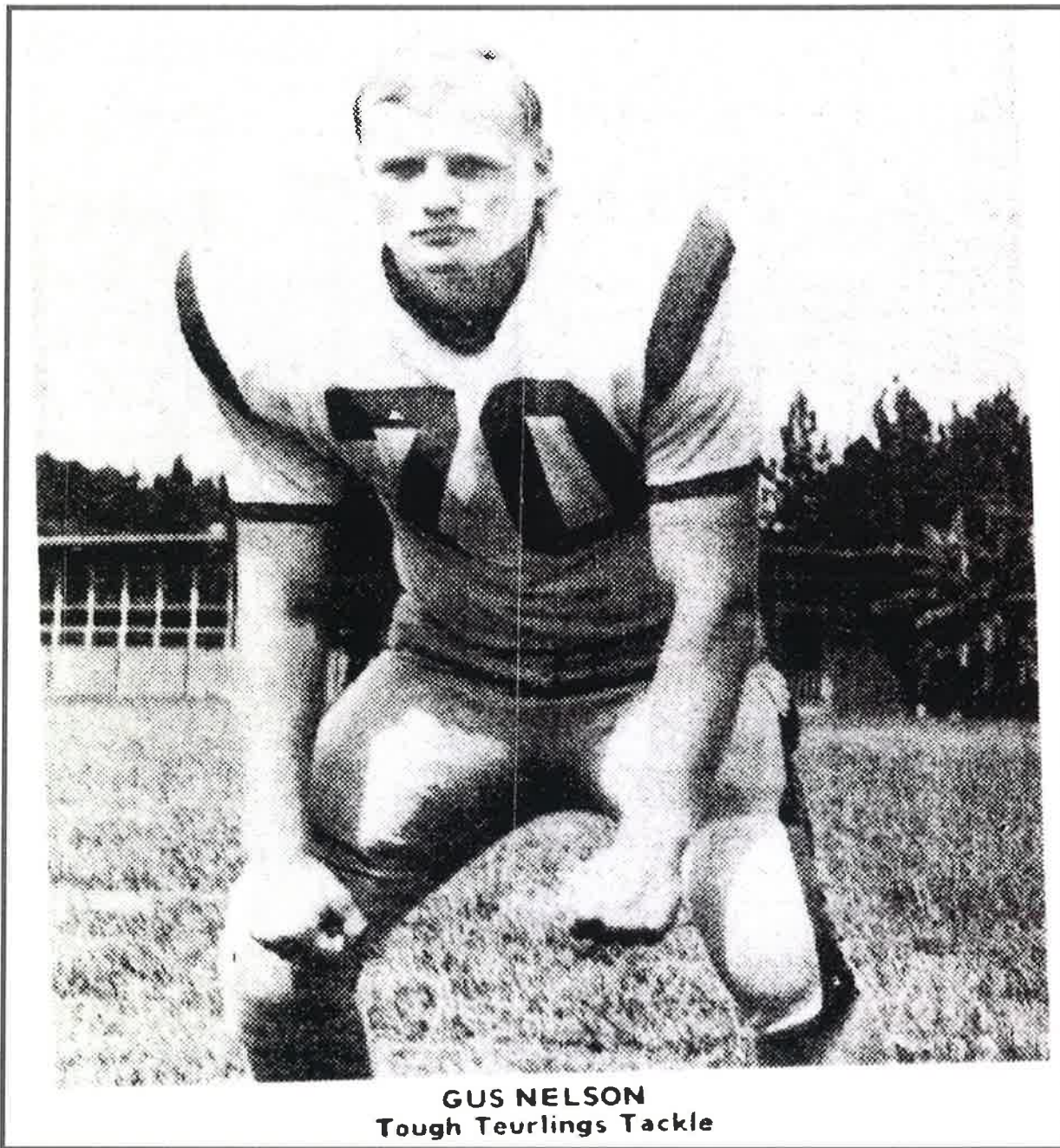

## OVER SCOTT

# Solis, Duhon Pave Way To Reb Verdict

SCOTT — The Teurlings Rebels rallied in the third quarter here last night to take a hard fought 13-6 gridiron victory over the Fighting Eagles of Scott High School.

The encounter was the first of the regular season for both teams. Scott has just moved in District 5-AA and Teurlings is a member of loop 5-B.

Scott scored first when wingback Charles Fox danced and pranced 32 yards into the end zone early in the opening stanza.

Little did the fans assembled dream that Fox's run would be the only Scott tally of the night. Last week in a 20-minute jamboree contest, the Eagles racked the scoreboard for 27 points in a convincing win over AIC of Opelousas.

But Teurlings put the stops on Fox and Ken Begnaud and the other Scott swiftness who are capable of scoring on any play of the game.

Teurlings tied the encounter in the third period when quarterback Larry Solis pitched seven yards to David Duhon. The extra point attempt was no good and the score stood at 6-6, but not for long.

Duhon, playing like a cat, picked up a fumble by Begnaud and raced 29 yards for the deciding score late in the third stanza.

Gus Nelson booted the PAT and the Rebels were home with a 13-6 win.

Teurlings did not fare too well in the statistical as Scott dominated the game. The Eagles had 16 first downs to five for the Rebels. In rushing yardage the Eagle line held the Rebels to a minus 14 yards while the Eagle backs were prancing through the Confederates for 293 yards.

Paul Breaux, attempting to equal last week's 66-6 victory performance over Henderson of Breaux Bridge, hosts Capitol High of Baton Rouge with the contest beginning at 8 p.m.

**Robert Morris' Spartans of Comeaux High travel to Erath to match decisions with the Bobcats' head mentor Willie Lutgring. Both clubs lost their season openers last week.**

The Scott Eagles with several of the most exciting running backs in Class Double-A will attempt a rebound after being upset by Teurlings in its season opener last Friday. Dave Cavalier's crew will welcome John Beazley and his Breaux Bridge Tigers. The Tigers were stopped in its opener also last week.

Cathedral takes the week off to prepare for Catholic High of New Iberia.

The Panthers rated second in Double-A host S. L. Scott's Kaplan Pirates.

Crowley, gearing its offense around quarterback Randy Prather fullback Robert Holtpair and halfback Monto Harmon, journey to Jennings. The Gents, selected ninth in the weekly poll, will be pressed to win after Jennings lost to Catholic High last week.

Led by quarterback Louis Cook and Jack Bonin, the Rayne wolves host Gerald Harrington's St. Martinville Tigers tonight.

# Teurlings-Loreauville Set District 5-B Action Tonight

Teurlings Rebels and the Loreauville Fighting Tigers clash tonight in Loreauville to usher in the first full schedule of District 5-B contests.

Pat Richard's Rebs, carrying a 1-1 mark into the game, will rely heavily on the passing of quarterback Larry Solis and the rushing of Kenneth Menard.

# Fatima Downs Rebels With DeSota Starring

Fatima's Richard DeSota intercepted a John Nelson pass and returned it 66 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter to blunt the Teurlings Rebels hopes of an upset over the Warriors last night.

With Fatima in front 22-6, Teurlings quickly marched down to the Warrior 34 yard line on the effort of a 40 yard pass completion from Nelson to Tommy Proctor.

DeSota, playing on defense for the first time in several contests, cut inside the intended Reb receiver and picked off the aerial and raced down the left side untouched. After Bobby Bernard added the PAT kick, Fatima led 27-6 with one minute to play in the third stanza.

A blood clot was removed from the base of Bowie's brain Friday in surgery at a St. Paul hospital.

"He is a little groggy and has a headache," Karen Bowie said. "He is going to be all right. I'm so relieved it's over. I was so worried."

Doctors say they expect no "after effects" of the surgery.

# Fatima Stars, Coach Win District Honors

(Written for The Louisiana Sports Writers Association) — The 1968 coaches all-district 5B team released to the Sports Writers Association found great runners, tremen'ous passing and a hard charging line for the mythical dream team of one of the toughest class B districts in the state.

Clay Judice and Gus Nelson were tied for the best lineman award and the coaches chose to place both great linemen on the first unit as the best of the forward wall.

In the backfield, Central Catholic's Merlie Fuselier who had at the center slot. Fatima gained more than 1,000 yards for the second year in a row got the nod as the best back over the 1968 Bobby Bernard who re-wrote the record books at the Lafayette school, the coach-es perhaps felt that Fuselier who was linebacker on defense and a great one, had the edge because he went both ways for the rugged Eagles.

Rounding out the backfield were Hanson's mighty mouse, Bill St. Blanc and hard running fullback Baron Bayard of Loreauville.

**Judice Named**  
Blessed with great blockers and tacklers the forward wall found Judice of Fatima and Rene Rodrigue of Hanson the district champs at the terminals. Gus Nelson of Teurlings and John McGraw of Vermilion were picked as the tackles, while Sammy Holloway of Central and Garland Hebert of Delcambre are the guards and Hanson's

St. Blanc scored 20 touchdowns for Hanson and netted 1,200 yards and was a good pass receiver for the Tigers. Bayard, was most of Loreauville's offense and he averaged five yards a carry and was a demon on defense.

Fuselier, who netted 1,300 yards last year and scored 79 points played in only nine games for the 8-2 Eagles and gained 1,026 yards for an average of 5.5, sweep of the Eagles, he backed up the line on defense and was a fine passer. He scored 11 touchdowns this season.

Nelson, averaged nine tackles a game for Teurlings and recovered six enemy fumbles, also kicked for his team and averaged 35.2 per boot for 48 kicks.

Rodrigue, caught three touchdown passes and averaged six tackles a game, his teammate Saichuk, also got six stops a game and he called defensive signals for the Tigers and backed the line up.

Holloway, the pulling guard in the Eagles' winged T formation, was a good blocker on offense and backed up the line on defense. Hebert was also a fine blocker and tackler for Delcambre, while DeGraaw was a tower of strength in the Screaming Eagles' forward wall — he did everything well.
