# Parish Teams Ready For Jamboree Play

The 22nd Annual Kiwanis Football Jamboree, scheduled tomorrow night at USL's McNaspy Stadium, brings together

eight Lafayette Parish teams in one of the oldest and biggest pre-season football spectacles in the state of Louisiana.

## Tech Secondary Has Experience

(Last in a series of seven stories about prospects for the 1973 Louisiana Tech football team.)

**RUSTON**—With three of four starters returning—and all three considered all-star quality by the coaching staff—Louisiana Tech has hopes of getting another big season from its defensive secondary.

It may be impossible to duplicate last year's effort when the Bulldogs set a new school record and ranked in the top three nationally with 29 pass interceptions but don't count them out of such possibilities yet.

### Jr. Cornerbacks

Senior safety John Causey of Monroe along with junior cornerbacks Welford Wilborn from White Oak, Texas, and Larry Griffin of Shreveport are the three star returnees and Tech coaches feel they are "perhaps the best we have ever had here at their positions."

Causey set a school record with 10 pass thefts a year ago, including four in one game, while Griffin got eight and Wilborn two along with marking himself as one of the best punt return men around. Welford also helped set in motion Tech's big win over Southern Mississippi with a 79 yard TD run after picking off a first quarterback fumble in mid-air.

Two Years Ago

Tyrone Jones (5-7, 180) of Jonesboro was clearly the leading candidate although another soph, Billy Kilpatrick of Petal, Miss., will also be a strong contender for the post this fall.

Three others who show promise in the secondary include cornerbacks Eddie Anglin of Haynesville, out much of last year with a broken leg, and two tryouts who played well in the spring, soph Byron Rettig of Overton, Texas, and junior Wayne Westernman of Shreveport.

Some of the incoming rookies to be looked at include John Henry White of Haynesville, Donnie Perry of Lafayette and Terry Slack from Bossier City. Airline star Jim Williams is also available but will be tried first at wide receiver.

## Scrimmage Caps LSU Workout

**BATON ROUGE, La. (AP)**—A rugged controlled scrimmage capped two-day workouts for LSU Wednesday as the Tigers practiced in the afternoon before the members of the annual Southeastern Conference Skywriters tour.

The four-game format is a change from the previous three-game jams held in the past. Pre-jam ceremonies begin at 7 p.m., followed by the Northside-Carenro jamboree opener at 7:15 p.m.

### Second Game

Fatima and Comeaux will hookup in the second game, Acadiana and Teurlings play in the third contest, and Cathedral and Lafayette High close out the pre-season affair, which is usually a fair indication of how parish teams will perform in the upcoming season.

In last year's jamboree, Northside and Fatima played to a 7-7 tie, Lafayette High whipped Teurlings 20-6, and Cathedral beat Acadiana 7-0.

### Last Year

Comeaux and Carenro did not participate in last year's jamboree.

Tickets are available at each school's athletic department or from any Kiwanis Club member. Tickets will also be available at the gate Friday night. Ticket prices are \$2 for adults and \$1 for students.

### Northside-Carenro

Both Northside and Carenro are coming off bad seasons as the Vikings completed their second straight winless campaign with an 0-10 mark in 1972 while Carenro managed only a 7-0 win over Breux Bridge in 10 games last year.

Head coach at Northside Joe Clark feels his team will be much more competitive this season.

The Vikings have always had their share of problems on the football field but Clark fields the 1973 Northside grid fortunes will take a turn for the better.

Northside is a member of District 5-A.

### Recent Years

Carenro head coach Jerry

lost to Hahnville 28-6 in a first round playoff game.

Coach Mike Simmons' squad was hard hit by graduation, losing the entire starting backfield.

One player back from last season's team is Jeff Ledlow, a defensive back last year, but who will handle the quarterback duties for the Spartans this season.

Ledlow is 6-0, 160, and should be the Spartan leader throughout the season.

District 9-A team Fatima was 3-7 in 1972 and will be in about the same situation it was in last season - young and lacking depth.

Junior Brian Etier, 5'10, 135, is the Warrior quarterback and his performance at that spot will be critical for Coach Jim Edney's team.

### Acadiana-Teurlings

Acadiana was 2-8 last season while Teurlings had one of its better seasons with an 8-2 record and a second place finish to Sacred Heart of Ville Platte in 7-A.

The Wrecking Rams are in 5-A this year while Teurlings plays in 9-A.

Coach Bill Dotson's Acadiana team is inexperienced and will be a problem at quarterback and with its kicking game.

### Younger Players

How well Dotson's younger players perform will determine the Rams' success or failure in 1973.

According to Teurlings coach Roy Pendergraft, his Rebels will be fairly tough on defense and a definite question mark on offense.

Linemen Mark Foley and Rick Nunez will anchor the Teurlings line and should be two of the better performers in 9-A.

Foley is 5-10, 165, while Nunez is 6-0, 170.

# Teurlings Rebels Have Experience

With 14 seniors and a total of 21 lettermen returning from last year's team, the Teurlings Rebels will have some degree of experience on their side.

Whether head football coach Roy Pendergraft and assistants Harold Tridico and Jimmy White are able to put together the right combination of variables that produces a winning football team will to a great extent depend on how those experienced players perform.

## District Mark

Teurlings finished with an 8-2 record last year including a 6-2 district mark. The Rebels were second to Sacred Heart in District 7-A. This season a realignment of districts puts Teurlings in District 9-A.

Merryville beat Teurlings 12-6 in the first round of the state playoffs last season.

## That Team

Gone from that team are All-District performers Barry Johnson and John Davis. Johnson scored 68 points and Davis 36 to lead the Rebels last season.

In assessing his team's chances this season, Pendergraft thinks his running game will be the Teurlings' strong point.

Jeff Breaux will handle the quarterback duties for Teurlings. Breaux is a 5-10, 140 pound senior and has lettered once.

## Join Breaux

Junior letterman Charlie Duhon and senior letterman Ricky Landry along with John Jordan will join Breaux in the Rebel backfield.

Duhon is 5-7, 155, and Landry is a diminutive 5-4, 115.

David Dugas also returns for

Teurlings Dugas is a two-year letterman and is 5-10, 160.

## Last Season

Quarterback Breaux didn't play too much last season behind Johnson and his ability to come through in tight situations will be a crucial factor for the Rebels.

Several starting linemen return and should provide a good nucleus for a strong line.

Ends Milton Duhon, Don Camel, and John Delahoussaye all are back. Duhon is 5-10, 150; Camel is 6-0, 160; and Delahoussaye is 5-10, 160. All are juniors.

Pendergraft thinks Sacred Heart of Ville Platte should repeat as district champ. "They will be untouchable. No one will be able to stay with them," Pendergraft said.

In summary, Teurlings should have enough good athletes to make an adequate showing in District 9-A. While a district title is unlikely, the Rebels will probably battle the other 9-A teams for the second spot and another berth in the state playoffs.

# Teurlings, Tigs Take Grid Wins

Teurlings blanked Holy Rosary 14-0 and Breaux Bridge stopped Jeanerette 25-0 in high school football action last night. Both Teurlings and Breaux Bridge are 1-0 on the season. Teurlings plays Northside on Friday while Breaux Bridge travels to Bunkie.

## Teurlings-Holy Rosary

The Rebels used scores by quarterback Jeff Breaux and halfback Charlie Duhon to down the Eagles. The statistics clearly show Teurling's domination of the contest as the Rebels gained 281 total yards to seven for the Eagles. The Rebels also dominated the first down count by getting 23 first downs to Holy Rosary's three.

Late in the third quarter after an Eagles punt, signal caller Breaux scooted in from eight yards out for the first Rebel score. The run, which capped

a seven-play, 65-yard drive, was followed by a successful extra point kick by Dom Campbell. Teurlings lead at the half 7-0.

## Breaux Bridge-Jeanerette

The Breaux Bridge Tigers ran up 314 yards rushing and coasted by Jeanerette in the season opener for both teams last night.

The Tigers had 18 first downs, 314 yards total offense, punted twice for a 40.5 average and were penalized 90 yards.

Breaux Bridge attempted three passes but was unable to complete one. The Tigers also fumbled six times and lost five of them to Jeanerette.

Jeanerette collected three first downs, had 11 yards rushing, 60 yards passing hit on seven of 15 pass attempts, punted eight times for a 27 yard average and was penalized 125 yards.

# Vikings Break Two-Year Drought

The Northside Vikings came

The Vikings and the Rebels

each now have 1-1 records.  
Northside lost to a tough  
Comeaux team last week and

Teurlings began the season with  
a win over Holy Rosary.  
Northside was very im-  
pressive at times but was  
plagued by fumbles and a very  
unpredictable defense against  
the pass rush.

Ted Phillips, the Viking  
quarterback had a great night  
throwing with six completions  
in 11 attempts and 160 yards.  
His favorite target was Earl  
Godfrey who caught two passes  
for 33 yards.

**One Pass**  
Ronnie Montgomery caught  
one pass for 60 yards and a  
touchdown and Alvin Ferrell  
hauled in another one for a  
score, a 20 yarder.

Dwight Rochem was the  
leading rusher for the Vikings  
with 33 yards in 14 attempts  
and scored a touchdown on a  
23 yard run to the second  
quarter.

Northside ran up 74 yards  
rushing, 150 passing for an  
impressive 224 total yards.

The Teurlings Rebels were not  
able to take advantage of two  
Viking fumbles on punt returns  
that put them deep into North-  
side territory, and never got  
their stunted running attack in  
gear, to come up the lower last  
night.

**Dubon Led**  
Charles Dubon led the Rebels  
with 41 yards in 12 attempts  
but Teurlings' 82 yards on the  
ground and 18 in the air way

not enough to deny Northside  
the win.

Teurlings ran off eight  
straight plays after taking the  
opening kickoff picking up one  
first down but being stopped by  
the middle of the Northside line  
in the second series of play.

With fourth and eighth on  
their own 25, the Rebels punted  
to the Northside deep man  
Roland Cormier who fumbled  
the ball away to a host of  
Teurlings Rebels.

This turnover gave Teurlings  
the ball on the Viking 300. Three  
plays later on fourth and nine  
Charlie Dubon went up the  
middle for eight and the Rebels  
had to give up the ball.

**Minutes Later**

Two minutes later Teurlings  
were again punted to Northside  
and this time Earl Godfrey  
fumbled the ball away. This  
play gave the Rebels the ball  
on the Viking seven yard line.

With first and goal from the  
seven Dubon carried for five  
yards to the Viking two. With  
second and goal Randy Calais  
went over guard for one yard  
putting the Rebs to within one  
yard of paydirt.

With third and goal from the  
one yard line, Dubon carried  
the ball and was pushed back  
and the ball was knocked loose.

Michael Victor picked up the  
ball and ran it out to the 15  
and the Teurlings scoring  
threat.

The Vikings looked anything  
but fantastic up until this point  
but when they exploded they  
dazed the fans and the  
Teurlings Rebels.

With no score and 5:50 left  
in the second quarter, Ted  
Phillips faded back on a second  
down and five situation and

## Four Games

After four games, Tulane's defense is allowing an average of only 167 yards total offense per game, and less than two yards per rushing attempt. Ring leaders in the Tulane defense are defensive tackle Charles Hall (40 tackles), linebacker Rusty Chambers (40 tackles), middle guard Mark Olivari (44 tackles) and line backer Kit Bonvillian (31 tackles).

Tulane's defense has dropped the opposition for losses 30 times in four games, led by Hall, Olivari and defensive tackle Nathan Reil with six apiece.

## Offensively

Offensively, junior quarterback Steve Foley is in the midst of a fabulous season. Averaging 130 yards of total offense even though he sat out much of the VMI and Pitt wins, Foley has thrown five touchdown passes and run for four TDs himself. He hit brother Mike with the game winning TD pass with nine seconds remaining against Duke.

North Carolina opened the season with a 34-27 win over William and Mary, then went into a three game losing skid as their two top quarterbacks

went down with injuries. Sophomore Bill Paschall has the top job now, and in their last two outings the Tar Heels barely lost to North Carolina State (28-26) and whipped Kentucky (16-10).

# Trojans Dominate All-District Team

Sacred Heart of Ville Platte, winner of the district crown for the past four years, dominated the 1973 9-A All-District team selected for the Louisiana Sports Writers Association. The Trojans placed eight players on the 22-man team and walked away with the outstanding offensive player.

Bill David, a 5-9 185 pound senior, was named the league's outstanding offensive player for his fine performance on the season. David rushed for 1,069 yards on 196 carries for an average of 5.4 yards per try. He also was on the receiving end seven times for 126 yards. He scored 18 touchdowns and scored on two conversions for his total of 112 points.

**Walked Off**  
Loreauville's Mike Ryan walked off with the defensive honors in the league. The 5-11 180 pound senior linebacker ended the season with a total of 110 individual tackles, 47 assists and a pass interception. For this, Ryan was named the outstanding defensive player on the squad.

Vermilion Catholic's head coach Calvin Hargrave, garnered the Coach of the Year honors on this year's all-district selection. Hargrave guided his Screaming Eagles to a co-district championship this season after being pre-season picked to finish fourth in the league. Vermilion Catholic ended the season with a 6-1 showing in league play.

Joining David in the offensive backfield were running backs Mark Piazza of Vermilion Catholic and Patrick Willis of Loreauville. Hanson's Sonny Charpentier was named to the quarterback position.

**Top Rusher**  
Piazza, a 5-11 170 pound junior, was the top rusher on

the all-district team as he picked up a total of 1,229 yards rushing on 269 carries, an average of 4.7 yards per try. He scored a total of 17 touchdowns and four two-point conversions for a total of 110 points scored this season. Willis carried the mail 104 times this season gaining a total of 618 yards on 119 carries for an average of 5.9 yards per carry. He scored nine touchdowns and booted four extra point conversions for his total of 38 points. Willis is a 5-10 185 pound senior.

Charpentier put the pizkin in the air 154 times and completed 89 for a total of 1,000 yards and 11 touchdowns. Only nine of his passes were intercepted and the 5-2 160 pound junior will be back at the helm for Hanson next season.

**Was Selected**  
Charpentier's favorite receiver, Mimi Bert, was selected to the all-district team at split end. Bert, a 5-9 125 pound junior, caught 30 passes for a total of 850 yards and seven touchdowns. Vermilion Catholic's Robert Fontana was selected at the tight end position. His main duty at this position was blocking and his coach termed him as one of the better blockers on the team. However, Fontana did catch five passes for 60 yards. He is a 5-11 185 pound junior.

Rick Ortega and Danny Broussard were named to the tackle positions on offense. Ortega, a 6-2 235 pound senior, was a repeater at this position from last year. He has been the leading blocker for Sacred Heart. Broussard, a 6-3 185 pound senior from Vermilion Catholic, was termed by his coach as the best blocker on the Eagle squad.

Loreauville's Rodney Breaux and Sacred Heart's Paul Dugas were the selections at the guard positions. Breaux, a 5-10 165

pound junior, is termed as an all-around player on the Loreauville team. Dugas helped the Trojans in the middle of the line mainly as a blocker. He is a 3-10 110 pound senior.

## Offensive Unit

Rounding out the offensive unit was center Ed Lalour of Sacred Heart. The 6-3 190-pound senior carried out his blocking assignments and was a returning all-district selection at this position.

Ortega headed the defensive line on the all-district team at the middle guard position. He was selected to this position a year ago and also gained All-State honors. Ortega was credited with 60 individual tackles. He also sacked rival quarterbacks five times for 48 yards in losses. He blocked three passes and recovered two fumbles.

Loreauville's Huey Nora was the only unanimous selection to the 73 all-district team. The 6-1 215 pound senior tackle ended the season with a total of 68 individual tackles and 21 assists. Paul Frank of Plaisance was named to the other tackle position. The 6-2 210 pound senior had a total of 48 individual tackles.

## Defensive Ends

The defensive end positions weren't hard to fill as two all-district returners from last year were named to the positions. Sacred Heart's Larry Fontenot, a 6-2 185 pound senior, had 32 individual tackles in spite of being injured throughout the season. He recovered four fumbles and blocked four passes from his end position. The other end was 6-0 185 pound senior Francis Fontana of Vermilion Catholic.

Joining Ryan at the linebacker positions were Billy Joe Davenport of Sacred Heart and Greg Mouldous of Vermilion Catholic. Davenport, a 6-2 190 pound junior led the Trojan defense with 73 individual tackles and six interceptions along with two fumble recoveries. Mouldous is a 5-10 135 pound junior.

Joey Butler, Tim Bert and Darrell Boutte were named the deep backs on the all-district defensive unit. Butler, a 5-9 165 pound senior from Sacred Heart had 66 individual tackles, five fumble recoveries and a pass interception. Bert, a 5-10 160 pound senior from Hanson, had 50 tackles and 25 assists. Boutte, a 5-9 160 pound senior from Loreauville, collected a total of 48 individual tackles and led his team in interceptions with four, one for a touchdown.

# Wallace, Judice, Henderson Head All-Parish Off. Squad

Three top offensive high school players, led by the outstanding Offensive Player in the parish, Clarence Wallace, of Lafayette High and the Outstanding Coach, Bob Mahfouz, of Lafayette High, highlighted the 1973 All-Parish Offensive Team released today by the Advertiser.

At least two other players making the All-Parish Offensive team, junior quarterback Rex Henderson of Lafayette High, and sophomore running back Kevin Judice of Comeaux, were serious contenders for the top honor in the parish but the clutch play of Wallace, who

made the key plays for the Lions all season long, was the determining factor in his selection.

The 6-0, 160 pound senior wide receiver was also named as the Outstanding Offensive Player in 5-AAAA. Wallace was a first team 5-AAAA choice on both offense and defense, as he was on the All-Parish team.

Wallace caught 36 passes for 655 yards this season, an 18.7 average, and eight touchdowns. In tight situations, Lafayette High invariably went to Wallace, who also returned punts and kickoffs and was the hub of the Lion defensive second

Wallace's longest TD catch of the year was an 80-yarder from Henderson against Northside but he also had scores of 35 yards and two 30-yarders.

Comeaux's Judice, 5-11, 180, the Outstanding Offensive Player in District 5-A, ran for 1,205 yards in 146 carries, a 8.3 average, and 31 touchdowns in his first season as a Spartan.

Judice was the key to Comeaux's offense and when he was stopped, the Spartans usually had problems. In a 15-6 loss to Lafayette High in the only regular season defeat in a 9-1 Comeaux season, Judice managed only 26 yards. In three of his better efforts, the smooth running Lion picked up 270, 151, and 149 yards.

Henderson, the 5-AAAA All-District quarterback, threw for 1,177 yards in his first season of guiding the Lions. The 6-2, 175 pound junior hit on 75 of 138 passes, 54.3 per cent and nine touchdowns. Henderson had only four passes intercepted.

Mahfouz guided his Lafayette

High team to its second straight 9-1 season and the 5-AAAA title. Mahfouz lost 19 of 22 starters from last year's squad and molded this year's team into what it became.

Two players besides Wallace were named to the All-Parish Offense as well as the All-Parish Defense, Guy St. Marie of Comeaux and Robert Durkee of Lafayette High.

St. Marie (5-10, 205, Sr.) was named to an offensive tackle spot while Durkee (6-4, 195, Sr.) was picked as the All-Parish tight end. St. Marie was a defensive tackle while Durkee was a defensive back.

St. Marie was also named to the 5-AAAA All-District offense and defense while Durkee was picked as the 5-AAAA first team tight end and a second team defensive back.

Durkee caught 31 passes for 401 yards and two touchdowns for Lafayette this season.

The two All-Parish tacklers are Clarence Edmond (6-0, 170, Sr.) of Comeaux, a 5-AAAA first team choice, and Acadiana's Mike Herbert (6-0, 190, Sr.).

Another Acadiana lineman, Tim Viator (5-11, 165, Sr.) was

named to a guard spot along side St. Marie.

Cathedral's 6-A All-District center, Jim Bienvenu (6-1, 170, Sr.) was named as the All-Parish center.

Bobby Jumeauville (5-7, 150, Jr.) of Cathedral, a 5-AA first teamer, and Mike Tomino (5-5, 145, Sr.) join Judice and Henderson in the All-Parish backfield at running backs. Tomino was the leading ground gainer of the Lion running game, picking up 521 yards on 115 carries.

Leading the second team All-Parish offense is Carencro's Gremlion (5-11, 200, Sr.) the guards and Tim B. Harry Living (6-0, 185, Sr.) of Carencro named yesterday as the Outstanding Defensive Player (Sr.) of Cathedral at Living, a wide receiver, caught

38 passes for 476 yards, average.

Art Theriot (6-0, 175, Jr.) of Comeaux is the 5-A team tight end while backfield is composed quarterback Brian Ellis (6-0, 175, Jr.) of Fatima, Charlie Duhon (5-10, 135, Jr.) of Turlings, D.
