Nunez. Pendergraft said 10 Rebels go on both offense and defense although injuries have forced changes in the regular lineup.

Pendergraft plans to start sophomore Jamie Camel at quarterback, Gerald Gerami, a junior, at fullback, and a pair of seniors, Charlie Duhon and Randy Conque, at halfbacks.

Across the offensive line from left to right will be junior Mike Blakely, sophomore Terry LeBlanc, senior Kenzie Perrodin, senior Pat Bernard, senior Rickey Nunez, senior Donald Camel, and senior Milton Duhon.

Fatima, under first year coach Bobby Banna, has six seniors returning, including its number one quarterback Brian Etier. Joining him in the backfield will be backs Steve Oats

and Kenneth Champagne and flanker Chris Whitney.

That touchdown was the last of the evening for both squads as neither team could muster any type of a substantial drive. The game ended with a tie 6-6 but Acadiana had the big edge in first downs 8-4.

Teurlings - Fatima

Halfback Charlie Duhon plowed his way to 103 yards rushing for the Teurlings Rebels but was unable to cross the goal line as the Rebels played the Fatima Warriors to a scoreless tie in the first game of the Kiwanis Jamboree.

Teurlings drove down to the 17 - yard line on the initial drive but because of an offside penalty and two bad throws, were unable to score and turned the ball over to Fatima at the 23.

Fatima's drive was halted at the Teurlings' 38 - yard line when James Hobert picked off a Brian Etier pass intended for

Chris Whitney and returned it 35 yards to once again give Teurlings good field position. The half ended with the Rebels stalled on the 10 yard line.

In the second half neither team was able to put together a drive and there were four fumbles in the last few minutes. Due to a mix - up, seven plays were run after what everyone thought was the end of the game.

Coach Roy Pendergraft was pleased with the play of the offensive line but was not pleased with the overall hitting.

"You know, a tie is like kissing your sister," explained Pendergraft, but he heaped praise on Charlie Duhon. "Anytime a runner can gain over 100 yards in 20 minutes he is doing a good job. He ran tough and broke tackles."

Duhon averaged 8.9 yards per carry and had big gainers of 18, 20 and 25 yards. Duhon came through when Teurlings needed yardage and made four of the Rebel's eight first downs. Duhon lost one fumble late in the second half.

Quarterback Jamie Camel connected on six of 14 passes and had one interception for 57 yards. The 130 - pound sophomore ran hot and cold as he completed passes of 12, 13 and 26 yards but badly over-throw his receivers on several attempts.

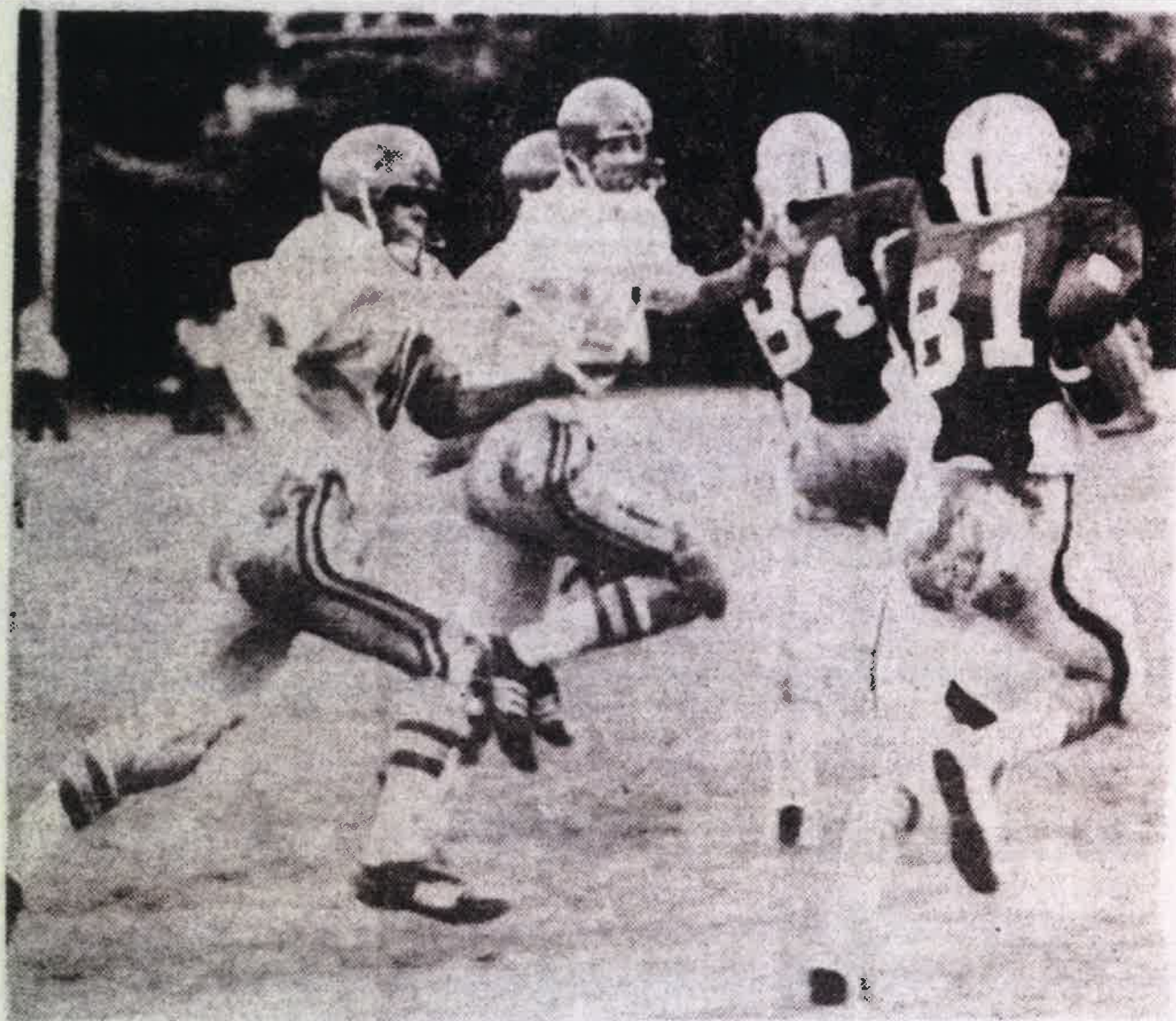

BEATS HOLY ROSARY

Teurlings Winner On Kicking Game

The Teurlings Rebels on the strength of two successful on-side kicks and one faked punt, rammed past the Holy Rosary Eagles 28-5 in the season's opener for both squads Thursday night at Clark Field.

The Eagles drew first blood as Norman Williams recovered a Rebel fumble on the Rebel 40-yard line and scampered to the 22-yard line. With first and 10 on the 16, the Eagles' quarterback, Gergory Jolivet, hit Norman Williams on a 15-yard pass play that brought the ball down to the Rebel one where three plays later Norman Williams bulldozed over from the one to give Holy Rosary their lone touchdown of the evening.

Trailing 4-0, Teurlings used a powerful and consistent ground attack that carried all the way to the Eagle six. There the drive was brought to an abrupt halt as Jamie Camel fumbled with Raymond Spears recovering the pigskin for the Eagles.

The second quarter of action found the Rebels of Teurlings coming to life. Taking over from the Eagle 41, Gerald Gerami picked up seven on the ground, followed by Randy Conque for five. The Rebels continued their onslaught on the ground as they drove all the way to paydirt with Conque getting the final 10 yards up the middle.

With the score tied it seemed as though the two teams would settle down and battle it out to the end. On the ensuing kickoff, the Rebels footed the fans and the entire Eagle team as they successfully executed an

on-side kick attempt, taking possession of the ball on the Eagle 44.

Jamie Camel, the Rebel starting signal caller, mixed a few screen plays to that already established punishing ground attack and drove his team to their second touchdown in six minutes. Charlie Dubon got the final two over left tackle and with 5:34 seconds the Rebels had taken the lead in the context by a score of 14-0.

The Rebel defense did an outstanding job as the Eagles could go absolutely nowhere either running or passing. Their defense allowed the Eagles only two first downs and minus one yard rushing in the first half. Passing for the Eagles was not the answer either as they could manage only 15.

Penalties added to the Eagles woes as they were penalized 25 yards in the first half and 125 by the time the final whistle blew.

As for the Rebels, their first half stats read as follows: 12 first downs, 146 yards rushing, and 27 passing. In total offense the Rebels outdistanced the Eagles 172-14.

The Rebels, in the third quarter of play, picked up right where they left off using their superior ground attack to pick up most of the yardage. Their initial drive stalled on the Eagle 23 as Camel threw incomplete to Mike Blakely.

The Rebels' next scoring opportunity came when David Davis intercepted a Jolivet pass at the Eagle 38. Teurlings could not capitalize, however, as a field goal attempt from the 15-yard line was just short of the goal posts.

By the time the fourth quarter arrived, both coaches sensed the contest

was out of reach and consequently both began to substitute freely. The Rebels' final tally of the night came when Conque bulldozed over from the five thus making the score Rebs 28 and Eagles 5.

Individual leaders for Teurlings included Gerald Gerami getting 105 yards on 18 attempts and Charlie Dubon 100 yards on 14 carries. Conque also enjoyed a productive evening scoring twice and picking up 32 yards on six attempts.

Pin Placed In Shoulder Of Rutledge

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. (AP) — University of Alabama quarterback Gary Rutledge was recovering from shoulder surgery today in a local hospital.

Doctors inserted a pin in Rutledge's right shoulder Thursday after the Crimson Tide starter separated the joint in a scrimmage at practice Wednesday. Kirk McNair, a spokesman for the university's athletic department, said it was not known if Rutledge would see action this season for the Tide. Coach Paul "Bear" Bryant said, "Maybe he'll be able to come back and play the last part of the season. We certainly hope so."

McNair said he didn't know when Rutledge would be released from the hospital and return to classes.

In 1971, Rutledge was red-shirted, making this his last year of football eligibility at the university.

Last season, Rutledge directed the Tide's wishbone offense to an 11-1 record. The only loss was to Notre Dame, 34-23, in the Sugar Bowl.

Teurlings-Northside

Injuries will slow Teurlings considerably but the Rebels "aren't about to give up", says Coach Roy Pendergraft.

Both offensive stars Charlie Duhon and Randy Conque were hurt in practice on Tuesday of this week. Duhon picked up over 100 yards in the jamboree and gained 100 yards in 14 carries last week against Holy Rosary. He also scored 10 points on a two - yard run and two two - point conversions.

Conque scored two touchdowns last week on a 35 - yard scamper and a five - yard run.

Duhon has a painful hip - pointer and will be out from one to three weeks while Conque suffered a pulled muscle.

Taking Duhon's place this week will be Blaine Hollier, a 165-pound sophomore. Covering for Conque will be 130 - pound sophomore, Mike Camel.

Gerald Gerami will be starting in the fullback slot after picking up 105 yards in 16 carries last week and scoring one touchdown.

Pendergraft has been disappointed with his team's

passing game so far and will be emphasizing that this week.

"We are a lot smaller so we must be a lot quicker. They are going to have to earn the victory if they get one," warns Pendergraft.

Solid defensive players for the Rebels last week were line-backer Ricky Nunez, safety James Hebert, end Donald Camel, and cornerbacks David Davis and Kenzie Perrodin.

Northside got blanked last week by Comeaux, 20-0, and could only manage 173 yards total offense.

The AAAA team got 46 yards in the air and 127 yards on the ground.

Teurlings' Defense To Be Rebs' Strong Point

Defense is expected to be the strongest point for the Teurlings Rebels this season with two second team All-District choices leading the way.

Ricky Nunez was chosen to the second team last year as linebacker and offensive guard. Nunez is super aggressive and a tremendous hitter. Coach Roy Pendergraft states that Nunez is "a good student, a good person, and a good leader as well as a good football player. Nunez will be the kingpin of our defense."

Nunez is a senior this year and is 6-0 and 190 pounds. He is playing the strong linebacker position.

The second returning

district choice is Don Camel, who was chosen as a defensive end. Camel is going to be a senior and is 6-1 and 170 pounds.

"Camel holds down his side of the field," explains Coach Pendergraft. "He is tough to run around."

Camel is a playing defensive end and offensive tackle. All-District

John Delahoussaye was also an All-District pick at defensive end. He was expected to play at the tackle spot but is out for the season with a broken leg suffered before school started.

Kenzie Perrodin is another experienced player on defense. The senior has two

letters and has been called the "hardest hitting defensive back in this area," by his coach.

Perrodin will play cornerback on defense and guard on offense. As Coach Pendergraft puts it, "Perrodin enjoys punishing receivers."

The Rebels are using a straight T offense because running is their strongest point. They will be led by another second team All-district pick, Charlie Dubon.

Exceptional Runner

"Dubon is an exceptional runner with the ability to break a tackle. He can make the big play when we need it," explains Coach Pendergraft.

The 5-5, 185 pound running back is a senior.

Senior Randy Conque is also playing running back. Conque was a transfer student last year and ineligible to play. He is quick and aggressive as a runner and is also a good receiver.

As well as playing running back, Conque is playing linebacker. Coach Pendergraft adds, "On defense he reacts well and hits hard."

The third running back is John Gerami, who is 6-2 and weighs 180. Gerami has good speed and is tough running inside. He is also a good blocker.

Playing Safely

The junior is playing safely. He has been nicknamed "torpedo" by his teammates because of the way he sticks the ball carrier.

Filling the quarterback spot

is Jamie Camel, who is a sophomore and has very little experience. Camel can throw the ball well.

"He shows a lot of promise and as soon as he gets a few games under his belt he'll be fine," says Coach Pendergraft.

Blaine Hollier is a sophomore who has surprised some people. He has good speed and is a strong break-away runner. Hollier is returning punts and kickoffs for the Rebels.

Another surprise this season has been Jim Hebert, who is also a sophomore. He is doing the punting and kicking off as well as playing safety.

Don Camel is handling the extra point duties. He only missed two all season last year. He also hit four of seven field goal attempts last year with the longest one from a distance of 37 yards.

What does Coach Pendergraft like best about his team? "The way we hit."

Rebels Have Case Of Grid Dropsies

Teurlings dropped the ball and the game to Cecilia High School Friday night 26-0 as the Warriors dropped seven good passes and lost seven fumbles.

Only several top defensive efforts near the goal line kept the score from being much higher. The antics of the officials did not help the Warriors as there were numerous questionable calls, official timeouts, changed decisions and at one point, an injured referee.

The Bulldogs held Charlie Duhon to 24 yards on 13 carries as the Cecilia defense read Teurlings easily.

Teurlings' Coach Roy Pendergraft was unhappy with the way his team played and summed up their performance with the harsh comment: "They played like dogs and ended up like dogs—on the bottom of the score."

Kicked Off

Teurlings kicked off to Cecilia and on the third down play Mike Blakely tackled quarterback Mark Nauquin for a 10-yard loss.

Cecilia punted and Teurlings was unable to move the ball. Cecilia then put together a drive started by Armand Darder's 45-yard cross-field run.

But Teurlings got fired up and held Cecilia for four downs inside the eight-yard line.

Cecilia finally got on the scoreboard with 39 seconds left in the first quarter. Nauquin hit end Kerry Menard who was all alone in the end zone on a 20-yard pass.

Second Quarter

In the second quarter, quarterback Jamie Camel threw the ball away the first two times Teurlings had the ball.

Cecilia got the ball on its own 25 yard line in the middle of the quarter and ground out the yardage and the clock, climaxing the drive with a three-yard off-tackle play for the score.

On the ensuing kick-off Charlie Duhon fumbled and Tim Roussard recovered for Cecilia on the 32 yard line. On the third play of the drive Rickey Nunez intercepted and had a 10-yard run back but interference was called on the Rebels and Cecilia retained the ball.

With 33 seconds remaining in the half Teurlings took over on downs at its own 22 but lost the ball on another Camel fumble from the snap from center Roy Covillion.

Unsportsmanlike Call

The Rebels came out in the second half and began grinding out the yardage, aided by an unsportsmanlike conduct called on Cecilia. On a fourth down at the 50, the fake on the punt was had and Cecilia took over at the 40.

Nauquin came out passing and the TD was saved only by the sterntness of James Hebert and Camel. Teurlings again got the ball on downs but was unable to advance.

By the end of the third quarter the Cecilia defense was reading Camel's cadence as well that the linebackers blitzed through to pounce on the quarterback almost before the ball hit his hands.

The fourth quarter began with Teurlings losing possession of a Cecilia punt but after a five minute chat with the officials, Coach Pendergraft convinced them of the error in their ways and the ball was given to Teurlings.

On the next play Camel fumbled for the last time and Cecilia took over on the Teurlings 22 yard-line.

After the ball slipped away from Cecilia quarterback Nauquin's hands freshman Bill Davis came in to lead the team from the QB spot. Davis had a good variety of plays though the Rebels were unable to capitalize on them.

The fourth quarter was a new ball game with both teams' freshman battling. Davis was intercepted on his own nine yard line and on the next play Jerry Champagne ran it in. The final score of the game was also set up by an intercepted Davis pass as Terry Collette returned the ball 37 yards to the 6-yard line. LeBlanc carried the ball in from the six yard line.

It was a strong defensive effort against Plaisance. J. P. Dunbar picked off two Plaisance passes and Eddie Toups led with seven individual tackles.

Mark Harrington scored on a blocked punt in the end zone for the top defensive play of the game.
