Teurlings Has New Mentor

A new head coach and a new district (6-AA) will be the two things surrounding the Teurlings Catholic Rebels football team this year.

Tony Palermo, who was offensive co-ordinator at Carencro High School for the past three years, will be guiding the Rebel's gridsters this year.

Assisting Palermo are Jack Deihomme, who doubles as head basketball coach and Darrel Hebert who coaches the Rebel tracksters.

The Rebels will be young this year as they will be starting only three seniors on offense. Gerald Gerami, Mike Blakely and Kyle Gideon are the only returning senior starters from last year's team. Despite the inexperience of his team, Palermo said, "I feel the players we have will play with anyone."

Returning Starters

Starters returning from last year's team are Tommy Radon, Blakely, Gideon and Jamie Camel.

Radon is a junior who is 5-10, weighs 125 pounds. He made the all-district 2-A team last year as a defensive tackle. On offense he will be playing guard.

Blakely will operate at the tight end spot on offense and will play linebacker on defense. He carries 190 pounds on his six foot frame. Blakely is also a three year letterman.

The Rebels' field general will be Camel. He is a junior and is 5-10 and weighs 130 lbs. Camel started most of the year last year but a broken nose kept him out of action much of the season.

Gerami could be one of the best fullbacks in the state if he stays healthy. He is 6-1 and weighs 180 pounds. Gerami is a three year letterman and runs 40 yard dash in 4.8.

Double Duty

Gideon will be playing tackle both on offense and defense this year. He is 5-10 and weighs 130 pounds.

Completing the back field will be juniors Blaine Hebert and Mike Camel.

Anchoring the offensive line for the Rebels at center will be junior Tommy Benesch. He lettered at defensive guard last year and with his great competitive desire, Coach Palermo has moved him into the middle of the line on offense. Playing the other guard will be junior Michael Begnaud while Terry LeBlanc will handle the right tackle spot. LeBlanc was one of the sprinters on the Rebels' track team this year and ran the hundred yard dash. He will also be playing defensive end.

Other starters on the offensive attack for the Rebels will be James Hebert at split end. Hebert is a junior and is 6-2 and weighs 170 lbs. He will be out to win his third monogram at Teurlings. When not playing on offense, he moves to the defense and plays safety.

Upsets, Shutouts Mark 24th Kiwanis Jamboree

Upsets and shutouts marked the 24th Annual Kiwanis Football Jamboree Friday night at Cajun Field. Two schools from the AA ranks, Teurlings and Cathedral, rose up and upended 5-AAAA squads, while two other 5-AAAA teams, Lafayette and New Iberia, posted victories.

In the opening struggle, Blaine Hollier sparked the 6-AA Teurlings Rebels to a 14-0 pasting of the Northside Vikings. Hollier rambled for 50 yards on 10 carries and caught an 18-yard pass from Rebel quarterback Jamie Camel for the team's first touchdown. Camel's only other completion was also a scoring one, as he lofted a 35-yard aerial to end James Hebert.

Scoring for Teurlings was evenly spaced, with touchdowns coming in both the first and second halves. After the second

score, kicker Tommy Badon was forced by a penalty to kick a 33-yard extra point. Coach John Fischer of Northside used both Mark Phillips and Mark Veillon at quarterback, but neither could manage to dent the spirited Rebel defense.

Scoring Interception

Defense was also the key in the second game, a 7-0 whitewashing of Comeaux by Cathedral Carmel. The only score in the game was a spectacular 62-yard interception return by Roy Revere. Revere stepped in front of a Mike McBride shot over the middle and had a convoy of purple shirts to the goal line.

Until the big turnover, the game seemed destined to end a scoreless tie as neither squad could muster a sustained march. Leading rusher in the game was Wilbert Bernard of the Spartans, with 45 yards on 10 carries. The Tigers' offense was geared to the rushing of

Robert Mahtook, who ground out 33 markers on 13 totes.

The New Iberia Yellow Jackets, sparked by two long scores in the first half, triumphed over Carencro 20-0 in the third game. Quarterback Keith Delcambre lofted a 21-yard TD strike to Ed Davis and Greg Boutle eluded several tacklers for a 45-yard touchdown run in the first half. The other Jacket score came on a nine yard run by Harvey Batiste.

Behind the leadership of Delcambre, the New Iberia offense gained 200 yards, while the defense limited the Golden Bears to 12 net yards.

District 5-AAAA rivals Lafayette High and Acadiana clashed in the final game, with the Lions scoring a 7-0 win. Wingback Mac Barousse booted one yard for the lone score with some three minutes left to play in the first half. For the rest

of the contest, the Lions' defense clung to that lead under an aerial barrage from Ram quarterbacks Brett Price and Ken Wildbur.

The Lafayette score was set up by a fumble recovery, leading Lions' coach Bob Mahfoux to comment, "In a jamboree, the team that gets the big breaks early usually wins." Coach Bill Dotson of Acadiana was "pleased with the team's hitting" in the raggedly played game, but stated that the Lions "executed" better than his squad.

A heavy rain two hours before the first contest made the field and the ball slippery, causing many slips, fumbles, and intercepted passes. Penalties were also numerous as the teams struggled to operate smoothly as efficient units in game conditions. Despite the wet weather, the turnout was good for the charity affair.

O P E L O U S A S — The Opelousas Catholic Vikings, defending State AA champs, started off the season right by defeating the Cathedral-Carmel Tigers 12-0 here last night. In other District 6-AA action, Notre Dame defeated Jennings 12-0. Teurlings defeated Carencro 12-0, Erath smashed Vermilion Catholic 30-6 and Catholic High of New Iberia edged Patterson 8-4.

Opelousas Catholic-Cathedral — Neither team could muster much offense in the first half as defense was the word. Penalties stopped good gains when they occurred for both squads. Cathedral had possession of the ball five times in the first half with their furthest penetration going to the 13 yard line of the Vikes with 3:28 remaining in the second quarter. The Tigers had gotten there by the running of Mike Madona and Robbie Mahtook. This drive was stalled when quarterback John Favorioa was stopped on a left end run.

Opelousas Catholic got the first of its two scores in the third period when tackle John Alandor broke through the Cathedral line to block a Favolora punt. Al Robicheaux picked up the pigskin and rambled 25 yards for the touchdown. The kick for the point after was no good and the Vikings led 6-0 with 6:05 left in the third period.

Cathedral got one more possession before Catholic scored again but could move the ball only to the 42. From there it was all Dupuis as the speedy Viking tailback showed the Tigers his heels.

Dupuis took a first and 10 pitch out from quarterback Fields and ran 31 yards down the sideline before Madona forced him out at the 11. Two plays later Dupuis dove over from the one to put the Vikes up by 12 points.

Notre Dame-Jennings — Quarterback Peter Trahan and halfback Mike Pravost sparked the Pioneers to an opening night win over the Bulldogs.

Trahan started off the scoring by running in from two yards out with 11:11 left in the second period. The run for two points failed and Notre Dame led 6-0.

With 10:41 left in the final period, Pravost took the ball in from one yard out to increase the Pioneer lead to 13 points. The run for two points failed again and the final score was 12-0.

Carencro-Teurlings — The Rebels gave first year coach Tony Palermo an opening game win over his former school in this non-district tilt. Teurlings scored first in the opening period as Jamie Camel

threw a 10-yard pass to David Davis. The kick for the point after failed and the Rebels led 4-0.

With just 34 seconds left in the first half, Sport Perrodin intercepted a Bear pass and ran 40 yards for the touchdown. The run for two was stopped and Teurlings led 12-0.

Erath-Vermilion Catholic — Mark Desormeaux led the Bobcat charge with two touchdowns while Cliff Livings and Eddie Campbell each chipped in one score.

Vermilion Catholic was first on the scoreboard as Fred Bourgeois raced in from 64 yards out. The kick failed and the Eagles had an early 6-0 lead.

Four 6-AA Elevens Face First District Competition

Four 6-AA football teams plunge into district competition this week. Cathedral - Carmel takes on Erath and Teurlings faces Catholic High. Meanwhile, Loreauville faces tough AAA Ponchatoula while Notre Dame has a bye.

Last week, Loreauville, Cathedral and Catholic all won while Teurlings and Cecilia battled to a scoreless tie. Notre Dame and Erath both lost tough games.

Cathedral-Erath

"It's going to be a very tough game," commented head coach Linden Bercegeay of Cathedral. "They are a very good team and have a lot of speed in their backfield." The Tigers are just

off a 30-22 win over Hanson, but as Bercegeay said, "any time we don't play football, and the other team does, then we are going to get beat."

For the first time in many weeks, the Tigers from Cathedral are injury free. "Jimmie Domengeaux will be back to bolster our defensive second year this week," commented Bercegeay, and "this should help us out quite a bit."

Last week against Hanson, the Tigers got off to a 30-0 lead, but had to hold on for the win. "We can't do that this week," said Bercegeay, "because Erath will beat us if we give them the opportunity."

The starting lineups for the Tigers will be the same as the previous three games, with the starting offensive backfield

being John Favalora at quarterback, Robbie Mahtook at fullback, and Billie Madona and Danny Williams as the two set backs.

Erath is sparked by quarterback Mark Desormeaux, a 99 runner. "He is the quickest man we have faced this year," said Bercegeay. His speed could cause the Tigers problems."

Catholic - Teurlings

Both of these squads are off good showings last week. Teurlings held AAA Cecilia to no points and Catholic is fresh from an upset of fifth ranked Berwick.

"We have no injuries to speak of," said Teurlings' Tony Palermo, "just the usual bruises, but nothing serious."

Coach Rickey Lougne of Catholic said that the Teurlings

defense stunts and slants, "If we can keep them off our backs, then we stand a fair chance of winning the game." Catholic High is injury free and Lougne remarked, "If we can get our defense down, we will be all right."

Loreauville - Ponchatoula

Loreauville head coach Arvel Boudreaux respects Ponchatoula. "They are always up there in the AAA ratings at the end of the season which means that they are very competitive," he said.

Rebs Lose First Game To Panthers

The Catholic High Panthers handed Teurlings its first defeat of the year by upending the Rebels 20-6 in a hard fought game at Clark Field Friday night.

The Panthers, fresh from upsetting fifth ranked Berwick 8-6 last week, used the hard running of Allison Bourgeois and the shifty speed of Mark Henry to knock the Rebels from the ranks of the unbeaten. The contest marked the first District 6-AA game for both teams.

Not only was this the first defeat for the Teurlings Rebels, it marked the end of a three game shutout streak. Neither Carencro, Cecilia or Vermillion Catholic, could push any points across the Rebel goal line. However, in those three games, the Rebels offense could muster only a total of 12 points, and the lack of offense showed against the Panthers.

Outraced Rebels

The first score of the game came with just over four minutes remaining in the opening period. Panther quarterback Richard Romero hit Todd Babineaux across the middle and the fleet footed receiver outraced the Rebel backs to the endzone. Catholic High had been going pretty much on the ground and the pass to Babineaux looked as if it surprised the Teurlings defense. Marcel Breaux booted the extra point and the Panthers were ahead 7-0.

The Panthers kicked off to the Rebels but in two possessions, neither the Rebs not the Panthers could muster any offense. The next big break in the game came after a Catholic High punt out the Rebels in business on their own 30.

Blain Oller and Mike Camel combined for four yards to set up a third and six at the Teurlings 34. On an attempted pitch out, quarterback Jamie Camel lost the ball and Panther defensive lineman Randy Tatford pounced on the pigskin on the 21 yard line. Five plays later Bourgeois drove up the middle from one yard out to score.

The Rebels got one more

possession and had a chance to score, but quarterback Bill Davis overthrew a wide open Mike Camel on a third and five situation. Teurlings then punted the ball to Catholic High to set up the final Panther score of the night.

The Panthers started on their own 35 and drove up the field using two quarterbacks. On the first and second downs, Richard Romero would come in to direct the offense. On third and long, Seb Patout would come in to put the ball up in the air.

Runs by Henry and Bourgeois and a pass completion to Babineaux put the ball on the Rebels four yard line. With just 39 seconds left in the half, a good second effort run by Bourgeois put another six points on the board for Catholic High, this time from four yards out. Marcel Breaux was wide to the left on the point after touchdown and the Panthers went into halftime with a 20-0 lead.

After the half, the Teurlings Rebels seemed to have defense on their mind. Several times, the Panthers threatened to score, but the Rebs rose up to meet the challenge. Several players deserve mention for their defensive effort for Teurlings and they include Tommy Benezech, Sport Perrodin, Mike Blakely and Gerald Gerami. The entire Rebel team played outstanding defense the entire second half, but they just got a little too far behind against a bigger ballclub.

The lone Teurlings score came after four stright completions from Jamie Camel to James Hebert put the ball on the Panther 12. From there Gerald Gerami ran around right end for the six points. The run for two points failed and the Panthers had won 20-6.

The Rebels played well in the second half and gained 111 yards on the ground while getting 64 yards in the air for a total of 175. Most of the passing yardage came in the final minutes when the Rebs were driving for their touchdown. Fumbles could have been the deciding factor in the loss as Teurlings lost four fumbles while the Panthers did not lose the ball on a fumble. The

Panthers from New Iberia gained a total of 210 yards with 163 coming on the ground and 47 in the air. Catholic High threw five passes and completed two while the Rebels put the ball up 12 times and completed four.

Mark Henry led the visiting Panthers with 101 yards on 22 carries while Mike Camel carried the ball for 20 yards on 15 carries and Baline Hollier carried the ball 1 times for 74 yards.

The loss makes the Rebs overall record 1-1-2 and their district record 0-1. Catholic High is now 1-0 in district and 3-1 overall.

"They have a real fine ball club and on any given night, could beat any given team." These worried words were spoken by Tiger head coach Linden Bercegeay on the outlook of their upcoming game with the Rebels. "They have a real fine end in Jim Hebert and are also good with Mike Camel at quarterback and Gerald Gerami at fullback."

An early season loss to Catholic High put a damper on Teurlings' district hopes, and Bercegeay said, "We viewed the game films of the Catholic High game, and the reason Teurlings lost was because they fumbled twice inside the ten or twenty." Bercegeay added, "Our boys have been a little flat this week, and if Teurlings is more up than we are, there could be trouble for the Tigers."

"We made too many mistakes last week to beat Catholic," said Bercegeay, "and if you totalled the yardage we lost in 60 yards of penalties, we lost about 205 yards in total offense. The only reason we won was because of a good team effort in the fourth quarter."

The Tigers, sixth ranked in the state, are not looking any

further into the season than the Rebels. "Our sixth ranking is good for the team to show that they are there, but it is also good for Teurlings, because they have somebody to shoot down."

The Rebels from Teurlings have been getting strong performances from quarterback Mike Camel and fullback Gerald Gerami despite having lost their previous two games.

Notre Dame-Catholic High

"Catholic High is a real good football team, indicative of their performance last week against Cathedral," said Pioneer head man Ashton Cassidy. "They know that having lost to the Tigers last week, that losing to us this week could put them out of the district picture, so they will be up for us."

The two-quarterback system of the Panthers should not give the Notre Dame defense too much trouble, according to Cassidy. "When Romero is in, they will be primarily concerned with the run, but he can throw the football, too," said Cassidy. He also added, "But when Patout is in, we will have to play run also because we don't want any surprises such as long runs with us playing only for the pass."

Coach Rodney Lougne of Catholic High expects a rough-and-tumble game from the Panthers.

"We are just exhausted after the game with Cathedral," said Coach Lougne. "Cathedral seems to have been our jinx the last six or seven years."

"Notre Dame is big and rough," said Lougne, "and they are big and strong on defense. We will have our hands full because they are such a fine football team. However, if we play our game and do not commit too many mistakes, then we should be hanging in there tough around the end of the game."

The Panthers have a few nagging injuries, but Coach Lougne says, "These injuries are just something that any football team will have to play with throughout the season."

Loreauville-Erath

The Bobcats are hoping to rebound from a disastrous game against Notre Dame, while the Loreauville Tigers

hope to continue their winning ways.

Mark Desormeaux is the quarterback and chief offensive threat of Erath. Fullback Carter Livings has been a good group gainer for the Bobcats as last week he gathered in 73 yards on only 12 attempts.

The Loreauville Tigers, fresh from a 23-0 whitewashing of Sunshine, hope to get their first district win against the Bobcats.

Running backs Roy Julian and Keith Simon are the two outstanding backs for Loreauville. Last week, Julian scored on a touchdown on a 14 yard scamper while Simon tallied twice, one from two yards and another from 15 yards out. The Tiger offense had 274 yards in total offense, all coming on the ground.

Top Offensive Player in 5-11, 100-pound split end Richie Lane. The senior speedster accomplished the feat of catching a touchdown pass in every game until the finale with the Pioneers when he was shut out.

Backfield
The offensive backfield is composed of players from four of the six schools in the district with Erath's Mark Desormeaux at the helm. Desormeaux, a 5-11, 175-pound senior, led the Cats with 826 yards rushing and an additional 477 passing for the season. Others in the backfield include Pioneer Ricky Stutes (6-1, 185, sr.) Robbie Mabtook of Cathedral (5-10, 190, sr.) and Loreauville's Roy Julian (6-1, 180, sr.) Stutes was second on the list of rushers for ND this season, as he rushed for 328 yards and scored 32 points. Mabtook led Coach Linden Bercegey's Tigers in rushing with 497 yards while Julian

compiled 362 yards rushing for the Bengals of Coach Arvel Boudreaux.

Manning the offensive line for the '75 Dream Team are ends Wayne Hoffpauir of Notre Dame (6-2, 195, sr.) and Cathedral's Lane. Hoffpauir had nine catches for the district champs, four of which went for touchdowns, while the fleet-footed Lane grabbed 24 passes on the season with 11 touchdowns. The two Catholic powerhouses also shared the positions for guards and tackles with Notre Dame placing tackle Jude Leonard (6-2, 220, sr.) and guard Chris Blanchard (5-10, 180, sr.) while the second-place Tigers had monstrous tackle Mark Domingue (6-4, 250, sr.) and guard Hunter Huckabay (5-10, 185, sr.). Mark Petitjean, a 1974 AA All-Stater, was unanimously selected as the starting center. The 6-0, 210-pound stalwart had the honor of being the only unanimous selection on the team.

Head Defense

Thibodeaux, a 6-3, 215-pound junior heads the defensive unit with credit for 74 individual tackles and 24 assists during the season. The big junior noseguard was a primary reason the ND defense allowed only 71.3 yards rushing this season. Joining the Pioneers in the front five are ends Bruin Hayes of CC (6-1, 180, sr.) and ND's Matt Beslin (5-11, 160, sr.). The tackles line - up as Rusty Reed, Catholic High of New Iberia (6-0, 195, sr.) and Notre Dame's Jimbo Hundley (6-2, 175, jr.).

Talented Catholic's Keith Cormier paced the linebacker - threesome with tackles as the rangy 6-1, 195-pound senior accounted for 33 per cent of the Panthers' tackles with 61 primary stops. Teurlings' only representative on the All-District squad was linebacker Gerald Gecami (6-1, 155, sr.), who was the heart of the Rebel defense. The other LB post was nabbed by Cathedral's Jerry Landry (5-11, 175, sr.).

A pair of "Mighty Mites" head the 6-AA defensive backfield. Notre Dame's 5-8, 130-pound Brian Boulet and Cathedral's 5-8, 120-pound Mike Madonna were chosen along with CHSNI Panther

stalwart Allison Bourgeois (5-11, 175, sr.). The trio combined for 22 pass interceptions and have over 150 tackles between them. Both Boulet and Madonna are classified as seniors.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — University of Tennessee officials have reportedly decided to keep Bill Battle as football coach and will make an official announcement Wednesday in order to help recruiting.

The Knoxville Journal and The Tennessean in Nashville, reported today that the Tennessee executive committee,

which governs school sports policy, will meet Wednesday in Knoxville and have an announcement then on Battle's status.

Battle came under intense criticism a week ago after Tennessee lost to Mississippi 23-6. The Vols came back to beat Kentucky 17-13 Saturday.

Quoting a reliable source, The Tennessean said, "Make no mistake about it, if Tennessee had lost Saturday to Kentucky, Battle would have been out of his job. There would have been an announcement after the
