

Jamborees ignite grid campaign

Major league baseball teams remain in heated pennant races, but it's the sport of football that will steal the spotlight Thursday evening across Acadiana.

The 1989 high school football season begins Thursday evening at USL's Cajun Field when the 38th annual Lafayette Kiwanis Football Jamboree, one of two jamborees locally, officially kicks off the new season.

Thursday night's games will feature a battle of AAAA powers as Acadiana, New Iberia and Comeaux play in a round-robin format. Each team is scheduled to play two 15 minutes games with a 20 minute break between each game. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m.

New Iberia takes on Acadiana in the opener and turns around after a 20 minute break to play Comeaux. The final game of the round-robin has Acadiana and Comeaux battling each other.

The change in format came about following Teurlings Catholic's late departure from the annual event. According to Kiwanis officials because of the late date no teams could be found to fill Teurlings' spot forcing them to switch to a round-robin format on Thursday.

The Rebels are scheduled to play in the four team Knights of Columbus Catholic School Jamboree in New Iberia on Friday.

The Kiwanis Jamboree concludes Friday with only two games scheduled. Lafayette High faces Carencro followed by Northside taking on St. Thomas More. Friday's

games will consist of two 15 minute halves with a 10 minute halftime. There will be a 20 minute break between each game.

Kickoff is set for 7 p.m.

Tickets for the Kiwanis Jamboree can be purchased at any participating school or at the gate on each night.

Six teams, Church Point, Notre Dame, Iota, Welsh, Rayne and the host Crowley, will meet at Gardiner Memorial Stadium in Crowley for the Gent Football Jamboree. Kickoff is set for 6:30 p.m.

While only two jamborees will be played on Thursday, nine are scheduled to be played on Friday.

Besides the Kiwanis Jamboree, Breaux Bridge, Jennings, Port Barre, Morgan City, Sacred Heart, Erath and Sunset are hosting jamborees.

TC's Heintz tries his hand at turning Rebels around

It's tough any time a head coach prepares to enter his first year at a school, but it's even tougher for a coach to inherit a team that has won just two games over the past two seasons.

Until two years ago, the Teurlings Catholic Rebels had one of the best football programs of the 1980's in the area. However, the program, which featured among others the undefeated and unscored upon '82 team, took a sudden nosedive following the '86 season.

That season (1986) Teurlings, loaded with talent, easily captured the 5-AA district title under head coach Bruce Cox with a perfect league record. However, 17 starters graduated from that team and Teurlings wasn't to be the same.

Despite Cox's success, however, he was gone the following year.

The sudden drop off in talent following the '86 season started the Rebels' nosedive as TCHS won just two games (2-8) in 1987 under head coach Bobby LaGrange and followed with last year's 0-10 campaign under

Head Coach Kent Finley

Earl Heintz, the sixth head coach in six years and seventh in eight years at the school, will attempt to bring the program back to what it once was, but it won't be an easy task for him.

Heintz arrives at Teurlings by way of Central Catholic of Morgan City where he led his team to a 5-4 record last season. His last CCMC team defeated two playoff teams along the way, including quarterfinalist

Hannan, but Heintz knows the '89 season will be a challenging one.

"If there's one thing I think we need to work on, I think it's consistency," said Heintz. "I'm a new coach here with a new system and I'm the fourth coach in four years."

Like the three previous years, the problem for Teurlings will be numbers, or the lack thereof. The drop-off in talent has been enormous and the number of kids out for football has also dropped off.

"Teurlings went 0-10 last year and only won two games the year before," said Heintz. "Consequently there's not a lot of interest in football right now. If there's one thing our players need, it's having confidence in themselves."

When a team lacks a lot of players, they are bound to have a problem with depth, and the Rebels do. Players having to play both ways can spell trouble late in a game, especially late in the season.

"We do have a lack of depth," said Heintz. "That's always a problem when you don't have a lot of kids out for football and any key injuries will definitely hurt us."

Teurlings' biggest asset will be four returning starters on offense, including quarterback Donald Cravins. Cravins, a 5-11, 185-pound senior, saw some action as a

sophomore and was the starting quarterback a year ago, so the Rebels have some much-needed experience at that position.

Two other backfield mates will join Cravins as returning starters. Fullback Jared Lemaire (5-6, 165, Sr.) and tailback Ed Stevens (5-10, 190, Jr.) will return and will have to provide the Rebels with yardage on

the ground if they are to be successful.

The split end will be Kevin Higgenbotham (5-11, 150, Sr.) with Tobyn Lavergne (5-8, 155) manning the tight end spot.

Returning center Brian Hebert (5-9, 180, Sr.) will anchor the offensive line, with Scott Ardois (5-8, 190, Soph.) and Ben Redman (5-8,

210, Soph.) at the tackles and Isaac Stevens (5-9, 210, Soph.) and Troy Ledet (5-11, 190, Jr.) at left and right guard respectively.

"We're young, but our guys have the willingness to learn and the desire to achieve," said Heintz. "We have had an excellent attitude at practice and the kids have the willingness to work hard and

improve."

If the Rebels has one thing going for them, it's their strong football tradition, despite their disappointing seasons the last two years. Heintz knows it will be hard, but anything is possible.

"There is a strong football tradition here at Teurlings," said Heintz.

While playing both defensive tackle and linebacker, Mitchell contributed 12 solo tackles and five assists, including three behind the line, a quarterback sack and a batted pass.

Obviously, there were more than two performances worth recognizing in last Friday night's season openers. Offensively, there was a multitude of fine outings.

Topping the list of runner-ups to Martin for this week's honor was St. Thomas More's Steve Mocek, who rushed for 153 yards and two touchdowns on 19 carries in a 22-18 win over Comeaux.

Fine defensive efforts aren't as easy to spot, but Mitchell was joined by several. Crowley's Marcus Senegal helped out with seven solo tackles, five assists and a one fumble recovery. Eunice nose guard Neil Thibodeaux led the Bobcats to a 7-0 win over Bolton with six solo tackles and three assists, including three behind the line.

Abbeville defensive end Sedwin Antoine aided in getting Head Coach Nick Saltaformaggio's Wildcats off to a good start with six unassisted tackles, four assists, three forced fumbles and two quarterback sacks.

TCHS Rebels out to end losing streak tonight

To say that Head Coach Earl Heintz and his 0-1 Teurlings Catholic Rebels are confident they're going to beat the 0-1 North Vermilion Patriots when they meet tonight at Clark Field, beginning at 7:30, is both right and wrong.

When Heintz took over the job at Teurlings after leaving Central Catholic, a team full of confidence wasn't the first thing he found. The Rebels have had their share of resounding losses in recent years, and were coming off an 0-10 campaign. But a 7-6 jamboree victory over Central Catholic and a respectable 12-0 loss to Vermilion Catholic last Friday, have Teurlings Catholic believing a return to the winner's column isn't far away.

On the other hand, it has been 12

games since Teurlings last won a regular-season ball game. So it's kind of hard imagining the Rebels being too confident in a victory, regardless of the opposition.

The fact that there is any confidence at all, however, can be interpreted as nothing but progress by Heintz and his staff. And progress is a welcomed concept at Teurlings Catholic.

"Things are looking up," said Heintz. "I'm not saying we're going to win, but I think our players have some confidence in themselves now. They're starting to believe in what I'm doing here. The jamboree win did a lot for their morale. I think we should have some confidence. But let's face it, the last time the seniors on this team won a game, they were sophomores. We're in no position to be overconfident, or take anyone for granted."

The Rebels failed in their attempt to win their first game in two seasons last Friday against Vermilion Catholic, but the game wasn't without some bright spots.

There was one pass dropped in the end zone, one tipped away by an Eagle defender and a fourth-and-one from the one not converted. And, defensively, the Rebels limited Vermilion Catholic to just 94 yards rushing, allowing Teurlings to outgain the Eagles 179-146 on the night.

So the dream of a victory was nearly a reality.

"We played good ball against VC," said Heintz. "Just not quite good enough to win. We made mistakes, but they were correctable mistakes. The desire and the effort were there, though, and that's the important thing. The big difference between Teurlings and VC in that game was that when it came down to making

the big plays, we just couldn't do it and they did. And that has a lot to do with the fact that Teurlings hasn't won in 12 games."

Individually, Ed Stevens stole the show for the Rebels, rushing for 135 yards on 28 carries. And although Heintz was pleased with Stevens' outing, he preferred to give much of the credit to the young Rebel offensive line, which consists of a freshman, a junior, a senior and two sophomores.

"Ed Stevens did a good job, but he didn't rush for 135 yards by himself," observed Heintz. "The offensive line deserves a lot of credit. They made some mistakes, but that's expected when you're that inexperienced. I'm very pleased with our offensive line. They're doing a good job."

The Patriots are in a different situation. Victories have been plen-

tiful in recent years, but graduation was very costly to North Vermilion, losing stars such as Tharon Lewis and John Thibeaux.

Under first-year Head Coach Ken Spears, the Patriots lost to Basile 20-14 in the opener last Friday. But like Teurlings, they had some promising performances. Quarterback Kyle Seibold completed eight of 16 passes for 161 yards, while receivers Jeremy Bergeron and David LeJeune also turned in big nights. Bergeron had four grabs for 91 yards, and LeJeune had three receptions for 55 yards. Shane Landry led North Vermilion in rushing in the game with 50 yards on 15 attempts.

"No one likes to play on Thursday night and have to go to school the next day," said Heintz. "But if we win, it's going to feel awfully good walking around school Friday."

Rebels crush Patriots

When a team ends a 12-game losing streak, usually it pulls off an upset.

But when the Teurlings Catholic Rebels broke their 12-game losing streak with a 27-6 victory over the North Vermilion Patriots Thursday night at Clark Field, it was no upset. The Rebels were clearly the better team.

"I can't even begin to describe how I feel right now," said first-year Teurlings Head Coach Earl Heitz after the big win. "I can't even imagine what it's like for the seniors. I wasn't here last year. Most of them probably didn't even play as sophomores, so this must really be great for them."

"I'm not a wishbone coach, but I started running it at Central Catholic last year and started loving it. I felt like we could line up and run right at North Vermilion. We did a great job of coming off the ball tonight. There was never really any doubt that we could control the line of scrimmage."

Ed Stevens was the big hero on the night for the Rebels, rushing for 207 yards and three touchdowns on 23 carries in just three quarters of action. His big night sparked a 312-yard rushing night for Teurlings, which could have been much more if not for several costly penalties. The Rebels were penalized 11 times for 80 yards in the game.

"Ed ran real hard tonight," said Heitz. "He was getting a lot better tonight. He was lowering his shoulder. He looked like a much more mature runner."

After penalties held the Rebels down their first drive, Teurlings broke the scoreless tie with a five-play, 40-yard scoring drive on its second possession. Quarterback Donald Cravins got the drive going with a 28-yard run to the NVHS 32. Two plays later, Stevens broke numerous tackles before galloping 23 yards for the touchdown. Scott Legendre added the extra point and the Rebels led 7-0 with 4:30 left in the first quarter.

It appeared Teurlings would score on its second drive, getting down the Patriot 18 after seven plays, but then fumbled. The next possession was much of the same, as they got to the NVHS six before turning it over on downs.

The score finally changed on the Rebels' next drive, which began following a 31-yard punt return by Legendre. Stevens quickly made it a one-play drive with a 14-yard touchdown run. The extra point failed, however, and Teurlings led 13-0 with 6:04 to go in the first half.

Teurlings dominated the first half statistically, holding North Vermilion to minus-17 yards rushing while collecting 178. The Patriots did show a glimmer of a passing attack in the first half, as quarterback Kyle Seibold completed three passes to Jeremy Bergeron for 50 yards. But

when Seibold exited the game with an injury with just eight seconds to go until intermission and Bergeron had to replace him at quarterback, any realistic Patriot hopes of pulling it out were gone.

Things didn't change much in the second half. Teurlings failed to score on its first drive, but did so on the next two. A 66-yard scamper to the one by Stevens sparked the first drive. Legendre finished things up with a one-yard plunge and then kicked the extra point for a 20-0 lead.

It got worse on the Rebels' next possession. Stevens got the drive going with a 16-yard scamper before Chris Walters added 11 more. One play later, Stevens got 13 more for the touchdown and it was 27-0 with 3:19 to play in the third quarter.

North Vermilion averted the shutout with 36 seconds left in the

game when Shane Landry put together two consecutive 21-yard runs, the second resulting in a touchdown. The two-point conversion failed, though, and the final score stayed at 27-6.

The Rebels' defense held North Vermilion to negative yards rushing until late in the fourth quarter. The Patriots ended up with 54 yards rushing with five first downs to Teurlings' 312 yards rushing and 15 first downs.

"It's going to feel good at school tomorrow," said Heintz. "But it's not going to be easy the rest of the way. Our schedule is horrendous."

It's a safe bet, though, that the Rebels aren't worried about the future just yet. For the first time in two seasons, they're able to enjoy the present.

Old district rivals TCHS, Notre Dame battle

CROWLEY — The scenario will be a little different than in the past when two long-time rivals — Notre Dame Pioneers and the Teurlings Rebels — meet tonight at Gardiner Memorial Stadium.

Split up by redistricting, the two old rivals no longer compete in the same district as the Pioneers have moved into the ranks of the tough District 6-AA, while the Rebels are competing in District 7-AA.

There'll also be a different look on the sidelines as both teams showcase new head coaches, namely, Notre Dame's Donnie Gaspard and

Teurlings Catholic's Earl Heintz.

"Teurlings is a much better team than last year," said Gaspard. "Coach Heintz has done a good job with them. They are a good running ball club and they have some good running backs so you have to be able to shut down their running game."

"For us to be in the game we have to come out and play hard nosed football," said Heintz. "I promise you Notre Dame will come out to play and we have to be ready for them."

Notre Dame enters tonight's contest with a 2-1 record as they've knocked off both St. Louis and Cecilia. Their last came at the hands of AAA power Eunice two weeks

ago.

Teurlings Catholic enters with a 1-2 mark as they fell to Vermilion Catholic in week one, 12-0, and fell last week to Hanson, 12-6. Their win came against North Vermilion in week two, 27-6.

The running game is the strong point for the Rebel attack as running back Ed Stevens and quarterback Donald Cravins lead the way. Stevens enters the game 354 yards on 51 carries despite a 12 yard effort last week against Hanson. "They are going to play a basic 50 defense but they are real tough," said Heintz. "Everyone talks about their offense, but they are an excellent defensive football team."

Leading the Pioneer defensive charge is returning all-district MVP Lance Link at linebacker, with help from Kevin Touchet at defensive end and Jason Kartsimas plugging the middle at nose guard.

Offensively the Pioneers pose a problem for the Rebels as they have two fine running backs and a big offensive line to lead the way.

"Up to this point we have played well defensively," said Heintz, "the

big question though, is how long we can take a pounding from their lineman and stay tough."

Chad Morrow and Jude Sittig are the two main threats in the Pro backfield, but senior quarterback Jason Habetz also has the ability to shine.

Morrow has collected six touchdowns for the Pioneers in this young season as he has run for five and caught one pass for his sixth.

"Chad (Morrow) started a little slow but he is running the ball real well right now," said Gaspard. "Also, Jason had been throwing the ball a lot better and with that we have been able to open up our offense a little bit and not let teams just key on the power sweeps."

"We are a little banged up right now and we are looking to improve this week," said Gaspard. "We have improved each week up to this point and I hope we can continue that pattern."

"We are hoping to come out of the game healthy and become a better football team, especially with district right around the corner."

Game time is set for 7:30 p.m.

Notre Dame Pios roll over Teurlings

CROWLEY — No victory ever angered the winning coach more nor made the loser prouder than Notre Dame's 20-7 homecoming win over Teurlings Catholic Thursday evening.

The win improved the Pioneers to 3-1 on the season while the Rebels fell to 1-3.

"I guess I ought to be thankful with the win, but good Lord we looked terrible out there ... just terrible," said Pioneer head coach Donnie Gaspard. "I don't know where our minds were, but it certainly wasn't on this football game."

While Notre Dame's play left Gaspard fuming, the Rebels' performance had Teurlings' head coach Earl Heintz more than pleased with his team despite some crucial second half mistakes that ended up costing them.

"They (Notre Dame) are about the best we're going to face this season and I thought the kids played extremely well," he said. "I dare say this is our best game so far this season."

"Thing is we still don't know what it's like to win," said Heintz, whose team held a 7-0 halftime lead. "But we're learning."

One of the most important lessons Heintz hopes his team learns in a hurry is how to hang onto the football deep in their own territory.

A pair of bad pitches by quarterback Donald Cravins — one at 6:18 in the third and the other at 1:15 to go in the period — opened the way for the Pioneers to score two big touchdowns.

Notre Dame scooped up the first errant pitch at the Teurlings' 29-yard line.

From there it was just a matter of time as Notre Dame needed just four plays including Jude Sittig's 15-yard run, which gave the Pios a first and goal at the six, to cover the distance to the end zone.

Sophomore Paul Poydras, who was filling in for an injured Chad Morrow, capped the drive two plays later with a nice five yard blast up the middle to tie the game at 7-7.

In an attempt to keep the Pioneers from pounding the ball up and down the field, Heintz had come into the game gambling employing a goal line defense to stop the Notre Dame running game.

"We wanted them to throw the football," said Heintz. "By using the goal line defense we dared them to throw the football. The strategy worked well, because they only completed five passes, but it was the two second half completions that broke our backs."

The first of the big completions came with time running out in the

third period and the Pioneers in possession at the Notre Dame 41. Jason Habetz, who was 5 of 12 for 129 yards, found Lance Link across the middle for a 56-yard gain. Only a shoe string tackle at the two kept the senior tight end from lumbering end, however, on the very next play Sittig, the game's leading rusher with 146 yards on 27 carries, scored and Jason Toups' kick made it 14-7 with 1:30 to go in the third.

While the Pioneers second touchdown hurt, the third td would break the Rebels' back.

Following the ensuing kickoff, Teurlings had the ball at their own 43 when disaster struck again. Notre Dame defensive end Bumper Wilkerson stepped in front of Cravins' pitch out and returned the pick off 13-yards before finally being drug down.

It took Habetz just one play to turn the Rebels' miscue into points for the Pioneers as he hit Jason Toups with a perfect 30-yard strike to put the ball game out of reach.

The Rebels had made a game out of it in the first half thanks to their aggressive defensive play, four Notre Dame fumbles, and six penalties for 41 yards.

Ed Stevens, who had 35 yards on 15 carries and two fumble recoveries, set up Teurlings Catholic's only touchdown of the night with runs of 28 and 27 yards. Jarrod LeMaire capped the nine-play 65-yard drive with a one yard burst up the middle.

Sunset Lions blank punchless Rebels

Thursday evening Sunset's Getano Clement did what he does best — run, tackle, and intercept passes.

For most, it was the type of performance that can only be dreamed about. However for Clement, Sunset's senior team captain, it was just another in a long series of outstanding games.

And his performance Thursday would certainly have to be described as outstanding as he:

- intercepted two passes, one of which he returned for a 51-yard touchdown;
- broke up two more passes;
- finished with a game-high 12 tackles, five of which accounted for negative yards;
- carried the ball 10 times for 54-yards, while catching two passes for 47 yards and scored yet another touchdown — a one yard plunge with 6:48 left in the third period to put Sunset up 14-0 at the time.

In fact, his performance was so good that it carried the Lions to an easy 28-0 win over Teurlings Catholic in both clubs' district opener.

The victory improves Sunset's overall record to 3-3 while Teurlings falls to 1-5 on the season. The Lions must now face Church Point at home while Teurlings travels to Cecilia.

"I've almost come to expect this type of performance from him every game," said Sunset's Gary Fontenot. "He's been our starting inside linebacker since he came to us as a 145-pound sophomore and he's led us in tackling both his sophomore and junior season."

"As our defensive leader he always draws the opponents best offensive player," said Fontenot. "And he always seems to get the job done. He's amazing and I certainly hate to lose him after this year."

Thursday evening Clement's heroics came early, often and without warning for Sunset.

His first opportunity to shine came with 15:12 left in the first period when he stepped in front of a Donald Cravins pass and raced 51-yards for the touchdown, his second such return of the season.

"The ball seem to float a little bit and he just cut in between the receiver and the ball," said Fontenot. "And I knew that once he picked off the pass, no one was going to catch him, because he's deceptively fast."

Despite Clement, though, Sunset led only 7-0 at the half, which didn't please Fontenot at all, as Teurlings was able to successfully dodge a couple of bullets.

"The first half we didn't play very well at all," he said. "Except for Getano run, that's about all we were able to accomplish. And we had a couple of scoring opportunities."

"I was much more pleased with our second half performance," he said. "We started to play like we had some juice in us."

Clement, a 4.5 spinter who also runs the quarter, led the way as he used his speed to pick off Cravins once again with just 1:27 gone to set up the Lions second scoring opportunity.

Thanks to Clement's interception

and return, Sunset found itself with a first and 10 at the Teurlings' 30. From that point, it took only seven plays for them to reach paydirt with Clement carrying it over from the one.

The big play in the drive was a 27-yard screen pass from quarterback Tyler Daigle to Clement that carried to the Rebel four-yard line.

Daigle, who completed five of six passes for 50 yards, teamed up with Clement right at the end of the third period to set up the Lions third score of the night.

Joe McCallister, who had the final three carries in the drive, did the honors for Sunset as he bulled in from the three at the 11:56 mark in the fourth.

Freshman running back Torrey Theall scored the Lions final touchdown of the game as he raced 28 yards for the final score with 1:14 left in the ball game.

Teurlings was held to just 78 yards in total offense as Clement and the Lion defense held Rebel standouts Ed Stevens (11-32) and Jarrod LeMaire (6-23) in check. In fact, Teurlings was thrown for a total of 40 yards in losses by the Sunset defense.
