In his senior year, Delhomme hit 218 of 394 passes for 3,351 yards and 32 touchdowns, rushing for 265 yards and eight more scores. In 12 of 14 games he threw for over 100 yards. He exceeded 200 in five, 300 in three and had a career-high 421 passing yards against Vermilion Catholic.

He threw in a game-winning field goal for good measure in one game, and played safety well enough to be an All-State selection on defense.

For his career, Delhomme hit 421 of 835 passes for 6,703 yards and 65 touchdowns, totalling 7,421 yards of offense and having a hand in 81 TDs.

He comes with high expectations.

Teurlings' move filled with questions

It's the question Greg Tidwell, his coaching staff and his players must be sick of by now.

How will Teurlings win now that Jake Delhomme is gone?

Sick of it or not, the Rebels must come up with an answer.

Tidwell, entering his second season as Teurlings' head coach, had major question marks to work out in preseason practice, but he's not about to give in to the tough challenge.

"We all know what (Delhomme) meant to our team a year ago," Tidwell said. "It was a great year. I don't think we surprised ourselves, but I think we surprised a few people out there. (Delhomme) was a great high school player and it's obvious just how valuable he was. But I still think we can have a good year. Things won't come as easy to us offensively as they did last year, but we still have some good

football players."

While Teurlings won't be able to 'replace' Delhomme, they do have a trio of guys they feel can step up and win the starting position.

Bumper Jourmet, Eric Legendre and freshman Kyle Stutes were battling to see who will start at quarterback in week one of the regular season. Tidwell says Jourmet and Legendre have an edge in the running department, while Stutes' strength is throwing the football.

"The position is up in the air, it's anybody's to win or lose," said Tidwell. "I think all three are capable of going in there and getting the job done. We may play all three, who knows. If it means we'll have to play a freshman quarterback at some point, then we'll do that."

But while overcoming Delhomme's graduation will be tough enough, Tidwell knows he lost key players at other positions.

"Everyone asks 'how will you overcome Jake's loss' and that's for obvious reasons," he

said. "But we also lost three other All-State offensive players in (receiver) James Stutes, (lineman) Paul Brunet and (tight end) Scotty Zeringue. Those were also key losses and they'll be very tough to replace also."

The good news is that four offensive linemen return. Those are tackle Tony Ozene (5-10, 205, Sr.), guards Ryan Brasseaux (5-10, 205, Jr.) and Jason Freeman (5-10, 175, Sr.) and center Dexter LeBlanc (5-11, 200, Jr.).

The experienced linemen will block for an experience backfield as well. Tailback Irvin Walker (6-0, 190, Sr.) and fullback Jon-Paul Landry (5-10, 165, Sr.) return, as does Jourmet (5-10, 170, Sr.) and Wade Greig (5-9, 155, Jr.), who will also see some backfield duty.

Defensively, Teurlings returns Ozene, Trent Stelly (5-10, 180, Jr.) and Landry at linebackers, while LeBlanc and Jason Freeman are back on

the line. Journet will see double duty also at free safety.

Because he's losing four All-Staters on offense, Tidwell feels more secure about his defense heading into the season.

"I think we're more stable there, because we have a lot of experience. We were real young defensively last year and we placed more emphasis on offense because of our talent. We have a good nucleus back, plus we will have a little more depth. We

were able to play a lot of people last year, so we have quite a few new starters who have game experience."

Re-districting went into effect for '93 and it put Teurlings back in Class AA, a classification the school has been more accustomed to. For that reason, Tidwell doesn't see a major difference.

"The schedule is mainly the same as last year, except we just reverse it," he said.

Journet taking over controls for Rebels

His given name is Chancellor, but in most parts he's known as 'Bumper'.

Bumper Journet says he got the nickname as a young kid, "when I was goofy, always bumping into things. Plus, my sister couldn't pronounce my real name. So it just kind of stuck with me."

Maybe he was goofy as a youngster, but Journet has devel-

oped into a quality high school football player after starting for Teurlings as a sophomore and junior at receiver.

James Stutes received the most accolades at receiver last year, and deservedly so with nearly 90 receptions. But Journet was also a top-notch receiver a year ago, grabbing over 50 passes from All-State quarterback Jake Delhomme.

Which brings us to the all-important question facing Teurlings this season. Who will take over for Delhomme at quarterback?

In spring and summer practice, the position was there for taking with Journet, Eric Legendre and Kyle Stutes all vying for it. Journet, however, feels it was his job to lose.

"I want to be the quarterback because I think the team needs me there," he said. "It's a position where you have to have leadership skills and I think I have that. A lot of the guys tell me I have good work habits and I think that's a form of leadership. I want

to lead by example."

Journet says playing with Delhomme the last two seasons made him a player player.

"Definitely, I know I'm a much better play," he said. "Jake was a great player and he worked very hard at it. He practiced just as hard as he played in games and I noticed that. Now I think I'm doing the same and I know I have to do well in practice if I'm going to play well in the games."

While admittedly it will be 'impossible' to put up Delhomme's numbers of a year ago, Journet feels he can be Delhomme's equal in a couple ways.

He is confident he can put points on the scoreboard and put 'Ws' in the win column.

"That's the most important thing — whether we win or lose," he said.

"It's not fun to go out there, play hard and come away with a loss. My job will be to help put points on the board and I think I can do it. Running is my strength, but I can throw. We still have some good passing plays and I can make them work. But for the most part we'll run more. Last year we were 'Rebel Airport'. This year it's 'Rebel Runway'."

Tidwell realizes Journet will be a key member of the '93 unit, and says

the 5-10, 175-pound senior is more than capable of taking over as the team leader.

"Bumper's a great kid," said Tidwell. "He's always smiling and he makes coaching a lot easier. I think Bumper will definitely be a team leader and he has those leadership qualities."

Tidwell also knows he will have to rely on more running plays instead of last year's emphasis on passing.

"That will be the key. Last year we knew we had a great passing attack and were able to exploit opposing defenses. Now we know we'll have to run more, but Bumper is an excellent runner and we'll try to take advantage of that as much as we can."

Rebels, Cougars enter openers searching

All high school teams around the Acadiana area are opening their regular season schedules this weekend, and technically Teurlings Catholic is in that group.

Realistically, however, Friday night's 7 p.m. clash with St. Louis at Clark Field will be little more than a jamboree.

For starters, the Rebels didn't get a scrimmage in because of a cancellation, and secondly, Head Coach Greg Tidwell are still very much in the 'jamboree stage' of deciding who will replace Jake Delhomme at quarterback.

"It's going to be somewhat like a jamboree," Tidwell said. "We're kind of still in that mode. We at least need to be able to eliminate people (at quarterback) this week. I would like to make a decision after this Friday, because we need to start put-

ting in stuff that caters to whichever quarterback we decide to go with."

The candidates include senior Bumper Journeal, junior Eric Legendre and freshman Kyle Stutes. Stutes will get the start Friday night, primarily because he didn't get any time in last Friday's 22-16 jamboree loss to Central Catholic.

"We need to see what he (Stutes) can do under fire," Tidwell said. "We pretty much know what Bumper's capable of. Eric will follow Kyle and we'll get Bumper some time at the end if we feel like we need to see him again."

The young quarterbacks aren't exactly without help in the backfield, though, with seniors Irvin Walker and Jon-Paul Landry in the backfield.

In the meantime, Tidwell will be depending on a senior-laden defensive unit to lead the way.

"Defensively, we've got a lot of experi-

ence back," he said. "We made some adjustments after last Friday's game and we think our defense is going to play much better this week. It's going to have to carry us at least for a while."

New Iberia at STM

The bad news for the No. 6-ranked St. Thomas More Cougars is that they're loaded with injuries already. The good news is that District 6-AAA play is still five weeks away.

That may not help Head Coach Jim Hightower's troops Friday night, though, when they host New Iberia Yellow at Comeaux High, beginning at 7 p.m.

"I just hope we get all this out of the way now," Hightower said. "We certainly can't afford to play shorthanded in our district."

Sophomore running back Nick Seelfo is out 6-8 weeks with a broken collar bone, starting tailback Mac Linden may be out two weeks with a sprained ankle, linebacker

Teddy Beaulieu is out indefinitely with a dislocated shoulder and center Adam Hoover remains out with an illness. Ben Neutrom and Luke Milam will see more time in the backfield.

"New Iberia looked real good in the jamboree," Hightower said. "They've got good backs, and their quarterback is very impressive. He's a game-breaker."

The Jackets averaged nearly five turnovers a game last season, and Head Coach Bill Simon hopes tonight is the first step to solving that problem.

"We played pretty well in the jamboree," Simon said. "We haven't had a fumble problem so far. We just can't afford to give it up like we did last year."

"My biggest concern with STM is that we're young on defense, and they're going to spread us all over the field. If we get confused and line up in the wrong formation, they could break some big plays on us."

At least the Hanson Tigers would say so after Head Coach Greg Tidwell's troops marched into Franklin and left with an impressive 28-6 victory to move to 1-1

on the season.

As for the hero of the night for the Rebels, take your pick. The top choices were none other than Irvin Walker and Bumper Journet.

Walker opened up the scoring in the first period with a nine-yard touchdown run. Journet then hooked up with Walker on a 59-yard touchdown completion for a

14-0 lead.

Walker would finish the night with 57 yards on 13 tries, and four catches for 52 yards. Journet, on the other hand, hit four of four passes for 74 yards.

Journet then equalled up the race with a 65-yard interception return for touchdown. But Walker wasn't going to be outdone with an

81-yard kickoff return for touchdown.

Wade Greig also contributed in the Rebels' victory with 35 yards on seven carries.

Hanson finally got on the board in the fourth with a seven-yard TD pass to Tony Fuhrer from K-West Lewis.

The Rebels, who now stand 1-1

TCHS enjoys scoring surge

Teurlings Catholic scored eight points in its first game, 28 in week two and then 47 in last week's victory.

So are the 2-1 Rebels headed for a 60-point explosion in tonight's 7 p.m. homecoming contest against the Redemptorist Wolves at Clark Field?

Sounds great, but Head Coach Greg Tidwell would simply settle for a victory.

"I doubt that (60 points)," Tidwell said. "This team is a little better than our last two opponents. As long as we win about 13-12, I'll be happy."

While increasing point totals at 20-point intervals is a bit unrealistic, the Rebels certainly are marching uphill these days. After a nightmarish season opener in which they turned the ball over seven times, they've rebounded with a pair of superb road efforts

in beating Hanson 28-7 and Sacred Heart of Ville Platte 47-8.

"If we can minimize our mistakes, we'll be in good shape," Tidwell said. "We didn't have any turnovers two weeks ago. That's what we're aiming for every week. Defensively, we've put in a lot more stuff the last two weeks. Basically, we're running multiple fronts. The kids like it and they believe in it."

Offensively, the Rebels have several threats in the backfield, led by Irvin Walker (32-212, 4 TDs) and quarterback Bumper Journet. Other threats include Jon-Paul Landry and Wade Greig.

"Bumper's working out well (at quarterback)," Tidwell said. "He gives us a double threat at quarterback because he runs the ball so well. People have to cover all four of our backs. If not, they're gone, which we learned the last two weeks."

Things, though, may not be as easy this time around.

"They've got some size," Tidwell said. "Their

two running backs are 218 and 206. They run the wishbone out of a full 'I'. I'm not real concerned with that. The assignments are basically the same as we're used to. We just have to get a couple of people to cover the third back.

"I'm concerned a little about how big they are up front, but I feel like we're quicker than they are and hopefully that will offset their size advantage. They're going to have to catch us to beat us. They look good defensively, but they've got a lot of people going both ways."

One thing the Rebels haven't experienced so far this season is a close ball game, but that's of little concern to Tidwell at this point.

"We look at it from play to play," Tidwell said.

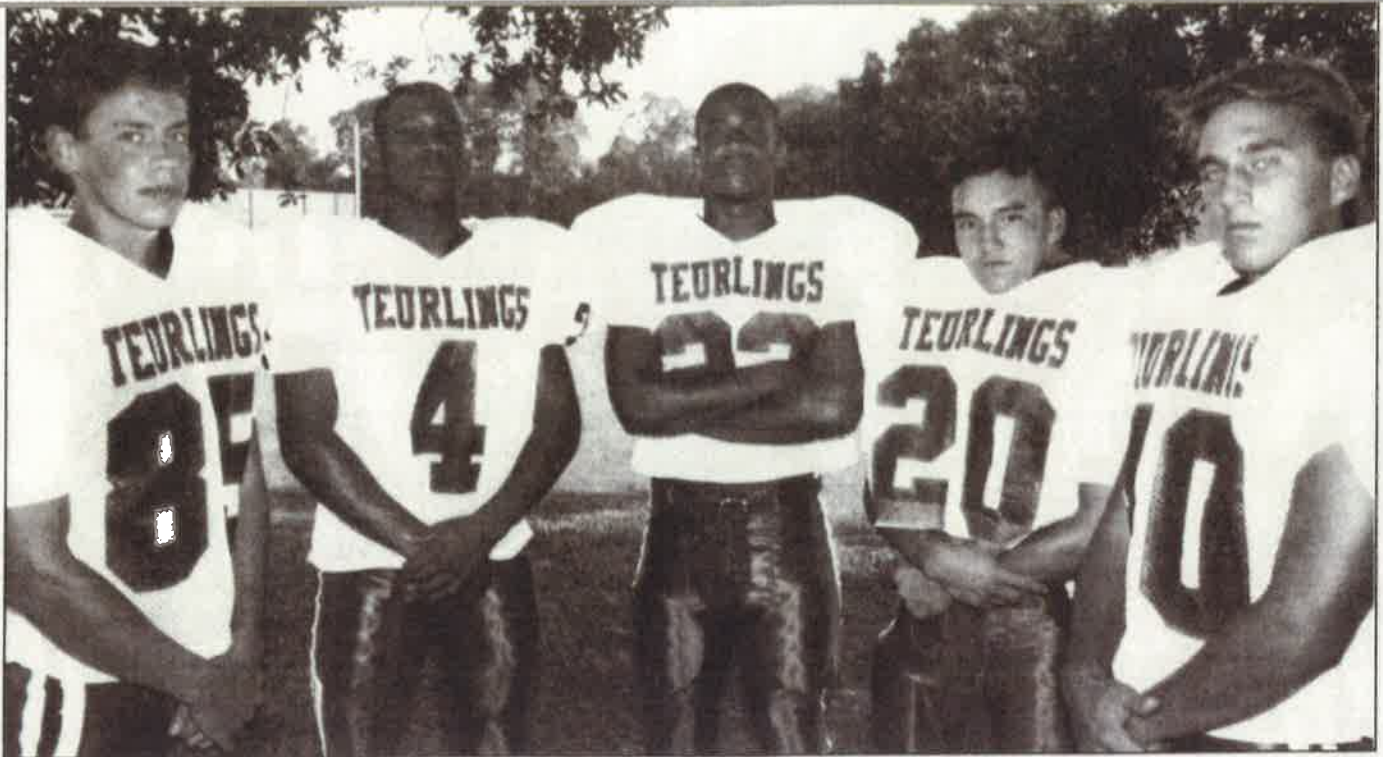
"That's the way we try to approach it. You just try to get a first down on every play. We really don't even want them to look at the scoreboard during the game. When the game's over, look up and see where you are. It may be to the kids, but it doesn't matter much to me whether we lose 6-0 or 66-0."

Kuber, Wolves decimate Rebels

Brent Kuber wasn't listed in the game program Friday night, but Teurlings Catholic fans will remember him as the player who ruined their 1993 homecoming game at Clark Field.

Kuber's 33-yard first period punt return set up the first touchdown of the night for the visiting Redemptorist Wolves, and their rock-ribbed defense made it hold up for a 20-0 victory.

In fact, it was that man Kuber who punctuated the victory with a 39-yard interception return touchdown for the final score of the night.

The Wolves improved their record to 3-1 on the season, while the Rebels of Coach Greg Tidwell had a two-game winning streak broken and fell to 2-2.

"We knew they would be bigger than we are," said Tidwell. "Many of the teams we play are. So we wanted to jump on them early, but we hurt ourselves with penalties and weren't able to execute."

The Rebels got an early spark from Wade Greig's 20-yard run, but then had a procedure call wipe out Irvin Walker's 21-yard run to the RHS 42 and had to punt.

Kuber's return came with barely four minutes elapsed in the game and reached the Rebels' 39-yard line. An offside on the Rebels pushed it quickly to the 34, and a six-yard option by quarterback Corey Gibbs reached the 28.

A nine-yard pass to Kuber was followed by a cross buck by Tito Rosario that gobbled up 18 more yards to the one. Two plays later fullback Darren Drago bulldozed across for the touchdown.

On RHS's next series, Drago appeared to have notched his second score of the night when he burst through the TCHS defense from 32 yard out, but holding on the Wolves wiped out the play.

One snap later, Kerry Fontenot ended the threat by intercepting Gibbs' pass for Kuber at his 20.

Fontenot was also alert enough to avoid further damage just before half when he picked off Gibbs again by outleaping Kuber at the goal line.

Those thefts allowed the Rebels to remain within a touchdown despite gaining just 28 yards at halftime and securing just one first down.

But the bruising Wolves' running game was taking its toll, and in the second half Coach Larry Guilbeau added speed with runs by Damien Rogers.

"They just wore us down," said Tidwell. "Our defense had to be on the field so long."

On the night, TCHS had just three first downs (one by penalty) and 42 total yards. As a young team going against a heavier foe, the Rebels grudgingly gave ground.

The defense turned away one threat in the third period, only to have RHS recover a fumble at the TCHS 18. Five plays later, quarterback Kevin Kimbrell plunged a yard to make it 14-0.

Kuber's clincher came with 3:44 to play, when he stepped in front of a Kyle Stutes pass and swerved his way 39 yards to score.

"We'll bounce back from this," said Tidwell. "The kids played hard, and I can't fault them for that. We'll get back to district play next week with Delcambre and our kids will feel more comfortable with that."

"This was the first time we had played this team."

And the first time the Rebels got a load of Brent Kuber.

Woodward

CROWLEY - Brannon Woodward came off the bench and threw the winning touchdown with a minute left to give the Crowley Gents a 30-23 homecoming win over the Eunice Bobcats.

Out with an injury, Woodward came on in the final two minutes and engineered a drive which gave Crowley its margin of victory. The senior hit sophomore wide receiver Jerry Dioron on a 24-yard touchdown with 1:05 left.

"Any time you lose one, you need to come back the next week and try to win one," said Crowley head coach Don Jones. "Being without Woody, I knew it would be a challenge for us. But I thought Jay (Duhon) did a heck of a job."

Rebels get past Panthers

DELCAMBRE — The Teurlings Rebels scored 11 points in the third quarter, enough to pull away from the Delcambre Panthers and finish with a 17-7 non-district win here Friday night.

The win improved Teurlings to 3-2 and it avenged a 33-20 loss to Delcambre a year ago. The Panthers fell to 1-4. The two teams were district foes last year, but Teurlings moved up to AA this season.

The key stat of the game was Delcambre's five turnovers, the first of which came at the Teurlings' three-yard line.

"That first turnover was really big for us," said Teurlings Head Coach Greg Tidwell. "At our three-yard line, they were right there in position to score. We came up with the big turnover and then we drove down and scored on them."

Irvin Walker opened the scoring for Teurlings, getting a touchdown from a yard out to make it 6-0. Delcambre came back to take their only lead of the game when Kal Laviolette caught a 13-yard touchdown pass from Sammy Mitchell to make it 7-6 at halftime.

"All three phases — offense, defense, special teams — played well," said Tidwell. "We were looking for consistency coming into this game and that's what we got. I'm really proud of the way our kids played hard and got the win. It was the kind of game we needed to win heading into district play next week. I think we've come along real well so far."

"They threw something different at us early on, but we responded well," he added. "Our defense came through with a fine performance. We made a few adjustments and I'd say about 90 percent of them worked for us."

The Rebels came back with a third quarter touchdown to take the lead for good. Fullback Jon-Paul Landry scored on an eight-yard run and a two-point conversion made it 14-7.

Teurlings' final points came later in the quarter when Joey Moss connected on a 28-yard field goal for the final margin.

Tidwell's squad finished with 272 yards total offense, 206 coming on the ground. Tailback Irvin Walker led all rushers with 72 yards on 18 carries, while Walker added 53 yards. Freshman quarterback Ryle Stutes completed seven-of-14 passes for 66 yards.

"I thought (Stutes) played very well," said Tidwell. "He's just a freshman, but he has a lot of poise. We gave him a lot of protection and we gave him some safe passes to throw. I'm sure when they (Delcambre) looked at the films, they saw we hadn't been throwing much, but we threw a few more times than we had been."

Jeremy Jones led Delcambre with 51 yards on eight carries and Chase Falgout added 52 on nine attempts.

"I'm sure it was easier for the kids to get up for this game, but we don't put much stock in payback and revenge," said Tidwell. "Last year's game was for the district championship and we just didn't play well. This year, we played much, much better and it was a solid win for us."

Stutes-led Rebels battle Patriots

Just when Teurlings Head Coach Greg Tidwell settled on a starting quarterback, he changed his mind.

Senior Bumper Journet is back to wingback, and freshman Kyle Stutes is getting another shot to lead the Rebel offense.

Now Tidwell hopes the ups and downs cease for his 3-2 Rebels when they open District 8-AA play tonight against the 3-2 North Vermilion Patriots at Clark Field, beginning at 7 p.m.

"We switched back to Kyle," Tidwell said. "That opens up the offense a little bit, because Kyle can throw the football, and it also allows us to use Bumper as a third back."

Stutes showed some stability in last week's 17-7 win at Delcambre, completing seven of 14 passes for 66 yards with no interceptions and a two-point conversion.

"I was really impressed with his composure," NV Head Coach Paul Jumonville said. "He put some passes right on the money. He's definitely a better passer than Journet. Plus, putting Journet back at wingback makes you have to play against an extra running back."

While the Rebels are coming off a win entering tonight's big district contest, Jumonville's Patriots will be trying to prevent a three-game losing streak. By no means is North Vermilion down at this point, however. Last week's 28-24 loss to No.

7-ranked Lake Arthur was more encouraging than downgrading.

"I was really happy with our effort against Lake Arthur," Jumonville said. "We played well against a ranked team. We got down 13-12, came back and took a lead, and was going in for more when we fumbled and they returned it 97 yards for a touchdown."

"The fumbles are a concern. I think it may be due to the fact that we do so little contact work during the week, because we can't afford to get anybody hurt. We just need to start hanging on to the ball."

When they do, the Patriots are dangerous. Donavon Allen has 726 yards and nine touchdowns on 76 carries so far this season, while Judd Picard has added 327 yards and three scores on 67 attempts. In the air, Shawn Sonnier has hit on 23 of 56 passes for 334 yards with four touchdowns and two interceptions.

"Allen is real good," Tidwell said. "He's probably the best running back we've seen this year. Plus, their quarterback's not a bad player and Picard can hurt you too. I'm been very impressed with them on film."

"Defensively, they're enthusiastic and they get to the ball. Their offense has turned the ball over and put them in some bad situations. They did some things to beat themselves in the Lake Arthur game."

The Rebels counter with Irvin Walker (58-284, 5 TDs), Jon-Paul Landry and Journet in addition to Stutes (19-44-5, 203

1 TD) on offense.

"Teurlings is very aggressive on defense," Jumonville said. "No. 69 is a doggone good football player. Offensively, they've got two or three weapons who that can hurt you. Bumper is a threat, and Landry does a good job of running it.

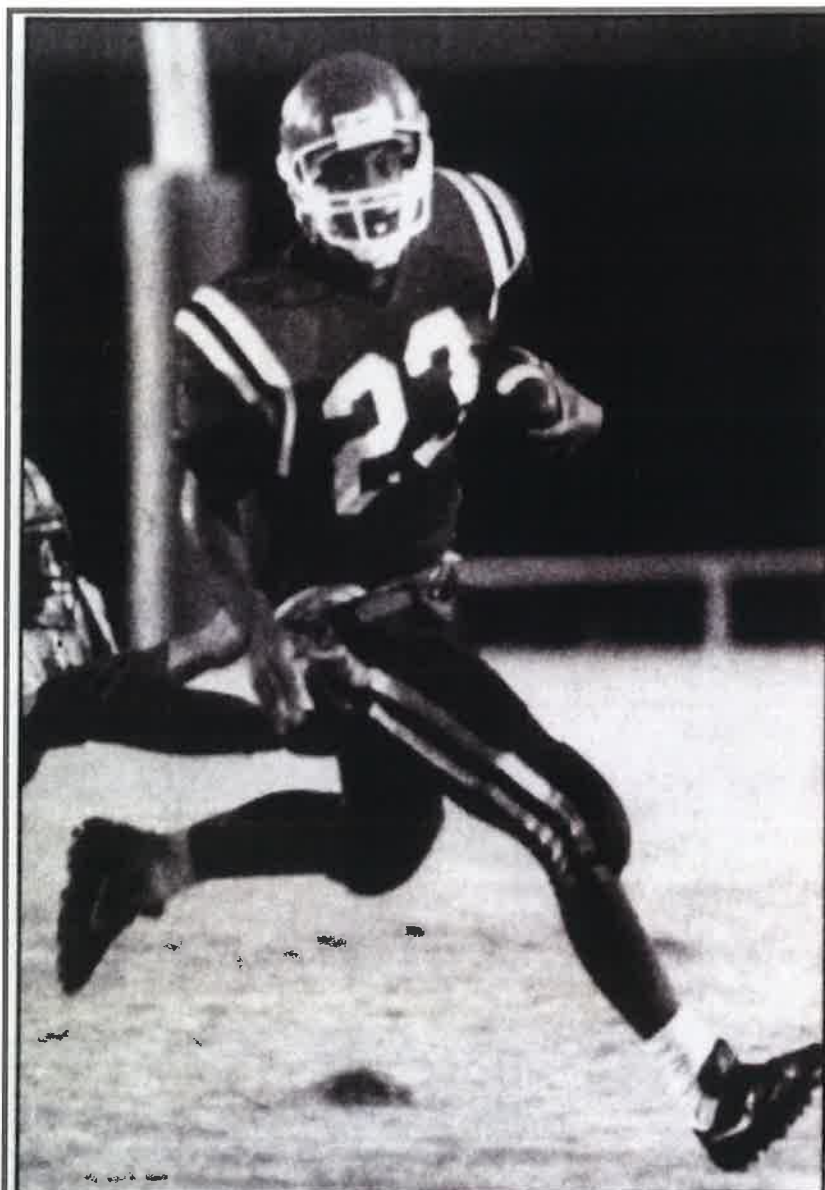
"It's important to get off to a winning start," Tidwell said. "You don't want to have to fight an uphill battle the rest of the way."

Versatile Allen sparks Patriots over Rebels

It's hard enough to stop Donavon Allen when he's got up a head of steam and is running with the ball for North Vermilion's Patriots, but when he picks off a pass in the open field and has nothing but green in front of him, it's all over but the extra point.

Allen's 43-yard interception return with 1:39 to play finally put away the stubborn Teurlings Catholic Rebels 34-20 Friday night at Clark Field in the District 8-AA opener for both teams.

Before that theft of freshman Kyle Stutes, Allen had already bulldozed for 189 yards and two touchdowns on 29 carries for Coach Paul Jumonville's team. And, when Allen wasn't carrying Rebels for extra yardage, fullback Judd

Picard was slipping through for 128 yards and a score on 20 thrusts.

"Donavon has been our leader on offense all year long," said Jumonville, whose team improved to 4-2. "He gets worked over pretty good. Defenses are starting to stack up on him, but he's a good second-effort back."

With Picard in the mix, the Patriots are extra trouble.

"Judd has been a complimentary player all year," Jumonville said. "Now when teams tee off on Donavon, Judd is a good runner. They're a good tandem for us."

"That (No. 22) can play," said TCHS Coach Greg Tidwell, whose team is 3-3.

What hurt the Rebels as much as Allen, though, was the 20-3 half-time deficit they dug themselves. It was too much to overcome against a larger, more powerful

NVHS squad.

Allen already had 130 yards by that time and scoring runs of two and six yards, while Picard had plunged in from a yard out. Adam Lege's 62-yard return of the opening kickoff sparked the Patriots, who also scored on an 80-yard drive and a 54-yard march following a Rebel onsidies kick.

Joey Moss kicked a 25-yard field goal to get the Rebels on the board, and they nearly scored again but Bumper Journet was ruled to have juggled a 32-yard halfback pass from Irvin Walker to the NVHS two.

The Patriots promptly marched to the Rebel two before Allen was dumped at the four to end the half.

"The biggest quality we have," said Tidwell, "is that we know how to win. Last year it was our offense we knew would score, and our de-

fense was young. We can win when we as coaches put our players in the right position."

Moss's 34-yard field goal drew TCHS within 20-6 early in the third period, and his interception of the Patriots' Shawn Sonnier and 41-yard return to the NVHS 44 set up the Rebels' first TD. Stutes found Journet for 26 to the 13, and Jon-Paul Landry scored on fourth and goal from the one.

Suddenly it was a game. The Patriots came right back, driving to the Rebel 22 where Landry hit Sonnier to jolt loose a screen to Allen and halting the threat. But on the next play Stutes was picked off on a slant for Moss by Daniel Benoit, who ran it to the 10.

Three player later Lege scored on an 11-yard reverse to make it 27-13 with 6:57 left.

But the resilient Rebels refused

to die, using consecutive interference calls on the visitors to get into position for Stutes' 20-yard touchdown on a zig-out to Moss at 4:36. Moss had a remarkable night with 12 tackles, two field goals, an interception and touchdown catch.

The Rebels forced a punt and tried to score again, but Allen's interception sealed it.

"Teurlings is a scrappy, aggressive club," said Jumonville. "I have to compliment them for hanging in there. We needed those two interceptions to put them away. All the credit in the world goes to Greg and his staff."

"Our defense kind of lost some momentum. It has too much bend in it right now. But they play both ways and get tired. Our kids hung in and fought. We had two wins last year, and we're 4-2, 1-0 this year. That's a feather in their hat."

His season totals entering week seven weren't that of a big time Division I prospect.

Bears' Faulk tops All-Parish squad

Selecting a Most Valuable Player is sometimes not a very easy task.

Carencro's Kevin Faulk changed that this year. A vote wasn't even necessary.

The junior quarterback's dominance far surpasses simply Lafayette Parish. Before his storied career with the Golden Bears is over, it's doubtful that many records will be safe or nationwide recognition matched.

For now, Faulk will have to settle for Offensive Most Valuable Player on the *Daily Advertiser/Pepsi-Cola All-Parish Football team*.

The other two top individual honors on this year's team weren't quite as easy to determine. In the end, however, stood St. Thomas More's Doug Johnnie as the *Daily Advertiser/Pepsi-Cola All-Parish Defensive Most Valuable Player* and Acadiana High's Bill Dotson as the *All-Parish Coach of the Year*.

Numbers aren't entirely necessary to back up Faulk's claim to

the top offensive honor. One only must watch him play. For the record, though, Faulk accounted for 2,488 all-purpose yards. The bulk of that yardage came doing what he does best — running with the ball.

Faulk rushed for 2,037 yards and 24 touchdowns on 246 attempts in virtually carrying the defending state champions to the state quarterfinals this season.

Johnnie's presence on Friday nights wasn't nearly as obvious. The 5-10, 230-pound defensive tackle was the mainstay of a solid Cougar defensive unit that didn't stop playing until the Class AAA state semifinals.

For the season, Johnnie recorded 28 solos, 75 assists, five quarterback sacks, an interception returned for touchdown, six stops behind the line, three fumble recoveries, three caused fumbles, four pass break-ups, four hurries and a blocked punt.

Selecting the best coaching job in a particular season isn't always a matter of adding up wins and losses. Dotson didn't have a Faulk, or anything close to him. The dean

of parish coaches began the season without his starting quarterback, and had both of his star halfbacks hobbling for much of the season.

Still he put another seven-win, playoff team on the field, and pushed league champion Covington to the limit in the first round of postseason play. The highlight of the season, though, was a 42-20 victory over the defending state champion Golden Bears.

Hypothetically, Dotson's Rams would have somehow won the old Class AAAAA league, considering two of their three losses came to Lake Charles teams Barbe and LaGrange.

Faulk is joined in the All-Parish backfield by a trio of hard-running, workhorse backs in teammate Chad Comeaux (181-982, 4 TDs), STM's Brandon Chestnut (187-1141, 12 TDs) and Lafayette High's Nick Bergeron (130-802, 9 TDs).

The wide receiving corps was practically as easy as picking Faulk as the team's MVP. Jumping right out at you were Comeaux's Brandon Stokley (80-946, 6 TDs), who led the state in receptions, and Acadiana's Terrance Blackwell (30-577, 5 TDs). Stokley finished the season with 12 catches for 239 yards and two touchdowns against Sulphur.

At tight end was STM's Gregg Hamilton, who fought off an injury to finish with 21 receptions for 292 yards and six touchdowns.

The offensive line is ruled by the parish's top two rushing attacks in Carencro and St. Thomas More. The Bears' contingent includes

and Allen Bares at tackle.

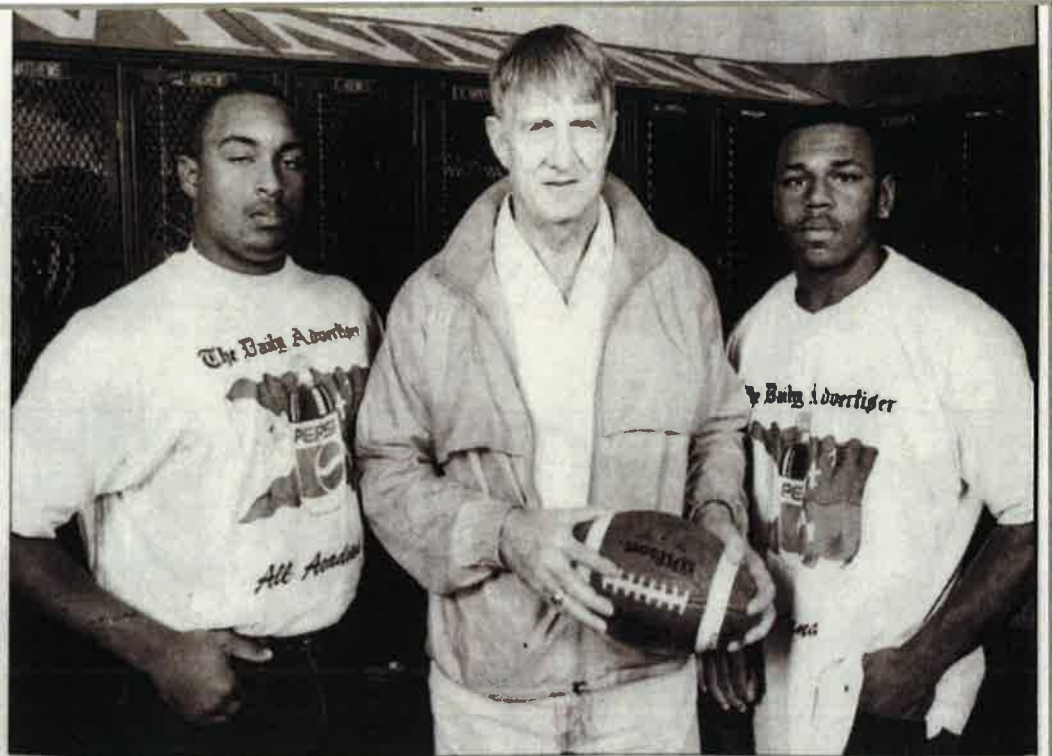
Acadiana's Kenneth Johnson rounds out the line at the other tackle spot.
