

Rebels facing unknown

Young talent holds the key for Teurlings

For years, Sonny Charpentier has had the reputation of being an offensive mind that throws the ball all the time and likes to run trick plays.

And while he's always been a bit more creative than most and thrown more than many run-oriented teams in the area, the running game has always been a bigger part of the Rebels' offense than its reputation.

That could change a bit this season. Sophomore quarterback D'Shai Landon is now on the scene and Charpentier's play-calling may live up to his reputation this fall.

"He wants to be good," Charpentier said. "He's real coachable. He has an understanding beyond his years as far as reading coverages. He very rarely makes the same mistake twice and when he does, he knows it right away. He's like a sponge right now."

"With all of that said, he's still a sophomore. He's still on a learning curve. We can't expect him to carry us, especially early on."

Making life a little more challenging for Landon is that only one starter returns on offense in senior receiver Jessie Proctor. He'll be joined in the receiving corps by senior Max Saltzman, sophomore newcomer Dylan Dossier, tailback Adam Angelle and tight end Hunter Romero.

"Jessie's the most experienced," Charpentier said. "Max has written his name and is doing a good job. Adam is probably

"There's no doubt we're going to be tested," Doherty said. "This is going to be the toughest schedule in Teurlings Catholic history. Northside does such a good job with play-action passes and several other teams throw it well."

Pass defense is important, but the No. 1 key for the Rebels' defense is finding a way to stop the run with an inexperienced front line. Teurlings may have more speed on defense, but will it be physical enough?

"It's going to be interesting," Charpentier said. "I'm anxious to see how that's going to work out. This will be the fastest defense we've had. We'll see if we'll be physical enough."

going to catch the ball as much as anybody."

In front is a brand new offensive line that's comprised of three seniors and two juniors.

"I like the effort," Charpentier said. "If it's all about effort, we're OK. We're not going to be the biggest line, but I like the tenacity. We're going to get better. The thing is that we can't afford injuries on either line."

The task is just as challenging on the other side of the ball where senior cornerback Evan Call is the lone returning starter. Cornerback turned-out-

side linebacker Chris Faber brings some experience from last fall.

"Years ago, you would start teaching in two-a-days," Rebels' defensive coordinator Mike Doherty said. "With the 7-on-7s all summer now, we've been teaching coverage all summer long, and getting everyone where they're supposed to be in coverage is the hardest part."

Secondary play is going to be crucial for the Rebels with Notre Dame and Brexux Bridge expected to throw more than usual, not to mention Northside and Comaux.

Faber's role will expand for final season

Last year's reserve cornerback now the defense's big hitter

As a junior, Chris Faber was a reserve cornerback for the Rebels, finishing the season with 15 tackles, a stop behind the line and an interception.

But while his contributions were limited, Faber impressed the Teurlings staff with his aggressive approach to the game. So beginning with the exit interview after last season, Faber's role began to change as the Rebels' defense was being transformed into more of a speedy, aggressive unit.

That meant Faber would be moved from cornerback to outside linebacker or strong safety.

"The coaches told me after last season that I was one of the more aggressive players, so they wanted to move me closer to the ball to be in better position to make plays," Faber said. "It's definitely different. Last year, you had a longer time to react. But I'm getting used to it. I know it now."

Depending on certain coverage

packages, Faber will find himself in a cornerback role at times this season, but he won't likely be having to defend fly patterns against opposing wide receivers.

"Playing the run was his strength last year," Rebels' defensive coordinator Mike Doherty said. "He had problems covering the deep ball at times."

"He's got a big role on this defense this year. We're very inexperienced, so we're really looking for someone to step up and be leaders for us."

For the 6-foot-1, 175-pound Faber that's a responsibility he understands is part of being a senior, especially a

senior with varsity playing time under his belt.

"It's something you learn that you have to do," Faber said. "It's kind of expected of you when you're a senior. It's my last year. If I want my last year to be a good one, I have to push the younger guys."

In doing so thus far, Faber has actually learned that it goes both ways.

"Our team chemistry is the best since I've been around," Faber said. "The seniors hang out with the sophomores to the freshmen. We try to help them out and then when there are days that I'm not really into it, they kind of pick us up."

Once the games start for real, Faber looks forward to contributing to the defense in many more ways than simply showing good leadership.

"I'm going to be dropping back into zone coverage more," he said. "That's going to allow me to get more picks, be more physical, which is a part of the game I really love, and just make bigger plays."

The passing game has been a part of Teurlings Catholic's offense for a long time. The deep pass,

though, hasn't always been a huge part of that repertoire.

It is now. Sophomore quarterback D'Shai Landor hooked up with sophomore Dylan Bossier on a 57-yard touchdown pass with 1:58 remaining to lift Teurlings to a 10-6 win over the Acadiana Wreckin' Rams in the second game of Friday night's Kiwanis

Club Jamboree.

The winning bomb was a one-play drive after Acadiana's offense fumbled the ball away at the Teurlings 43. Trying to ice the win, the fumble was the third in four possessions for the Rams.

Trailing 6-3 at halftime, Teurlings opened the second half with a 13-play, 68-yard drive, but fumbled at the Acadiana 12. Landor finished 4-of-10 passing for 95 yards and a touchdown to earn team MVP honors. The Rebels piled up eight first downs in the game and 73 yards rushing.

Acadiana's offense moved the ball throughout the game, but fumbled three times, missed a field goal, scored a touchdown and turned it over on downs in its six possessions.

Blair Broussard rushed

for 129 yards on 10 carries to earn team MVP honors for the Rams. Josh Pillard added 50 yards on 10 carries. Acadiana rushed for 192 yards, passed for 19 and collected 10 first downs.

Last year, he was thrust into a tough role, going from the sophomore backup to starting quarterback in state semifinal and championship game matchups against Redemptorist and Lutch.

Along the way, Stu Cook took a few lumps. But now, as a seasoned varsity performer at tailback, Cook was ready to shine and did he ever Friday night.

Cook exploded for two first-half touchdowns — one running and one receiving — to ignite

Rebels first to try to upend Pioneers

The preseason talk was that Teurlings Catholic's passing game might just have a little more bite to it this fall with the additions of sophomore sensations D'Shai Landor at quarterback and Dylan Bossier at receiver.

It took the duo a grand total of one jamboree game to make an impact, hooking up on a 57-yard TD pass to beat Acadiana, 10-6.

As much fun as that was, Teurlings coach Sonny Charpentier knows any enjoyment of that win better have ended that night. Class 3A's No. 1-ranked Notre Dame Pioneers are in town.

"It always gives you confidence when you make plays, so that was good to see against a quality opponent like we were playing," Charpentier said. "But it was n't just those two. Max Saltzman made a great catch and Adam (Angelle) ran the ball well.

"There's no doubt, though, that we can't expect to line up and throw it all over the place against Notre Dame. They have the ability to pressure the quarterback without

bringing extra pressure."

The Rebels' running game showed promise with Angelle and Briston Dooley.

"They had two real good drives against a pretty good defense," Pios coach Lewis Cook said. "Teurlings has always been able to find a way to move the football. They've always been about big plays."

the Pios' defense this year may be its offense. Two versatile backs in tailback Stu Cook and fullback Marshall Watson, and a seasoned quarterback in Ryan Leonards, lead the way.

"Really, we've looked on film. I just don't see any weaknesses," Charpentier said. "At times in the past, their defense has had to carry their offense. That's not the case this year. Their offense is going to be able to keep their defense off the field."

The Rebels' defense struggled early in the jamboree win over Acadiana, giving up 192 rushing yards and 10 first downs, but 108 of those rushing yards came in the first two drives.

No. 1 with a bullet

After some tense moments in second half, Class 3A powerhouse Pios pull away late

Notre Dame had been pushed around most of the first half, something the Pioneers aren't used to.

Teurlings Catholic had burst out to a 13-0 lead, still led 13-7 and had possession early in the second half.

The top-ranked Pioneers needed someone to make a defensive play, and it wasn't a surprise that they turned to stand-out linebacker D.J. Welter.

Welter stormed through and tackled Teurlings running back Andrew Simar in the end zone for a safety five minutes into the second half, opening a stretch of 30 unanswered points as Notre Dame rallied for a 20-11 victory over the host Rebels at Clark Field.

The Pioneers (1-0) scored off the free kick following the safety, picked off an interception to set up a touchdown only moments later, and suddenly Teurlings found itself down by double digits in a game the Rebels had totally dominated for most of the first half.

"We knew we needed to start getting some push up front," said Pioneer quarterback Ryan Leonards, who engineered a touchdown drive

Comeaux 21, South Terrebonne 7

BOURG — Dillon Williams has grown fond of the road down Highway 90 to Bourg where South Terrebonne plays.

As a sophomore two years ago, he exploded for 240 yards in a win. On Friday night, he helped Kevin Mugge get his first win as the head coach of the Comeaux Spartans by rushing for 144 yards and three touchdowns in a 21-7 win over South Terrebonne.

Comeaux led 14-7 into the fourth period when Williams added his third touchdown to ice the victory.

in the final four minutes of the first half to start the comeback. "Teurlings was beating us up front and beating us emotionally, and we just had to get something going."

The host Rebels (0-1) scored on the game's first possession and Nick Ortega added two field goals early in the second quarter for that 13-0 advantage. Teurlings was driving once again before Rebel sophomore and emerging standout quarterback D'Shai Lander was intercepted by Notre Dame's Ricky Stoma four minutes before halftime.

The Pioneers drove 42 yards and had two apparent touchdowns, called back on penalties before Leonards hooked up with tailback Stu Cook in the flat for a three-yard touchdown that sliced the margin to 13-7 at the break.

"Getting the touchdown before the half was

big," said Notre Dame coach Lewis Cook, who claimed his 240th career victory. "13-0 is a lot bigger hill to climb, but we still had to make things happen in the second half."

The Pioneer defense did that, limiting Teurlings to 22 offensive yards in the final two quarters after the Rebel offense rolled to 157 first-half yards.

The biggest of these defensive plays came after a holding penalty early in the second half pushed the Rebels back to their own one-yard line, and Welter went on a blitz on the next play and hit Simar in the backfield.

Logan Venable's return of the ensuing free kick gave Notre Dame good field position and Marshall Watson capped a 56-yard drive with a 10-yard burst with 3:36 left in the quarter. That gave

the three-point first lead at half, and two punts later Teurlings was intercepted again, this time by John Roberts, and the Rebels 25-yard line.

Welter played hard on fourth and goal. Welter made a rare defensive appearance and went into the end zone on a blitz for three yard yards, and to make it 23-13.

Venable hit one of three field goals midway through the fourth quarter and went 33 yards for Notre Dame's final score.

The Rebels, who had upset Acadiana last in last week's playoffs, appeared to be on their way to another upset when Lander was picked apart by Notre Dame's defense, including a 47-yard strike to Adam Angeli on the game's first play. Seven plays later, Lander's booter drove outside and kept Notre Dame in the game for a comeback that was real.

Teurlings' defense held Notre Dame to one first down through the first quarter and a punt and Watson's interception gave the Rebels a 10-yard field goal. Angeli's kick and a three-point drive with 10:11 left in the second quarter.

St. Thomas More wins; Teurlings routed

ZACHARY — The St. Thomas More Cougars delivered a convincing road win over the Zachary Broncos, 36-0, on the familiar field turf for their first win of the young season.

The Cougars' offensive line controlled things most of the night by leading the way for a 261-yard rushing performance, even without leading rusher Brody Broussard available due to an injury.

In his place, Thomas Gumpert led the attack with 89 yards on 16 carries and a touchdown. Matt Flores added 62 yards

on 10 carries, followed by Joe LaPrairie, who contributed 41 yards on seven attempts.

"We played pretty well," STM coach Jim Hightower said.

"We handled things pretty well on the line. We were more physical and just played solid with no turnovers."

Defensively, the Cougars were just as dominant, limiting Zachary to five first downs and 70 total yards.

Two teams in different mindsets meet in a rare Thursday matchup between Lafayette Parish schools when the winless Teurlings Catholic Rebels travel to the undefeated Comeaux Spartans.

Since a very encouraging 13-7 halftime lead over Notre Dame in the season opener, the Rebels have been outscored 68-7 the last six quarters.

Strentz leads Comeaux to win

Comeaux High quarterback Mike Strentz made the most of his completions.

None, though, were bigger than the game-winning, 45-yard touchdown pass to Shawn Hebert with 3:28 left to play for a dramatic 34-27 victory over the Teurlings Catholic Rebels on Thursday at Spartan Stadium.

On the night, Strentz completed just 5 of 9 passes, but for 206 yards, including the game-winner.

"I told the kids that I haven't been around here very long, but I've been around a lot of teams and that was a great win that showed a lot of character," Comeaux coach Kevin Magee said. "We battled and beat a good football team in Teurlings. I'm very proud of them."

"It feels great to be 3-0 and I told the kids that they earned every one of them."

The game-winning drive was set up by a Robbie Romeo interception with 4:37 left to play. Just prior to the interception, Teurlings was on the verge of potentially overcoming a 14-point deficit, getting possession at the Rebels' 35 with 5:10 left to play in a tie game after forcing Comeaux to punt.

After first-down runs of 10 and 13 yards by Dillon Williams, Strentz threw a pass high in the air down the right side-line to Hebert, who made a subtle move inside and grabbed the ball with no one between him and the end zone for the winning

touchdown.

"Coach said you have to make an adjustment on the ball when it's in the air and that's what I did," Hebert said. "This is a big win for us. The offense's goal was to score at least 21 points and we did that."

The effort was especially sweet for Hebert, who was originally supposed to be out four weeks with an illness, but only ended up missing one game.

For Strentz, it was the latest of numerous big plays he made in the game. Many of them were a result of him scrambling to create open receivers.

"We do that a lot in practice, so I'm used to doing it," Strentz said. "That was a lot of fun. That was a real football game. We were 2-0, but we've been having to lean on the defense. Tonight, we did our part. We stayed together as a team."

That especially happened on two key occasions in the second half. With the game tied at 13-13 at the half, Comeaux

opened the second half with a 12-play, 80-yard drive in 5:23 to seize a 20-13 lead. The drive, though, began with a key third-and-seven play that was kept alive by Strentz's mobility and ended with a 13-yard completion to Mitch Callahan.

The scoring drive ended with a 12-yard touchdown run by Strentz, who threw three touchdown passes and ran for two others in the win.

"We challenged our offensive line at the half," Magee said. "We weren't staying on our blocks in the first half. We weren't being aggressive enough. We weren't mean enough. So we gave them a little talking to at the half and they responded."

Comeaux had 73 yards rushing at the half and finished with 203 to go along with 206 yards passing.

The Spartans actually made it 27-13 on their next drive when Strentz hit William Delhomme on a 52-yard TD pass with 4:04 left in the third. It was only justice for Delhomme,

who had delivered the key block on a Dillon Williams 81-yard score on a screen pass in the first half.

But just like Teurlings did in putting together a 92-yard scoring drive in the two-minute offense late in the second period, the Rebels' offense exploded with two quick scores to tie the game at 27-27 with 7:33 left to play.

Briston Dooley's hard running led to a 16-play, 61-yard scoring drive for the first score, before D'Shai Landor hooked up with Dylan Bossier on a 68-yard, one-play drive to tie it.

The Rebels' momentum, though, was halted by Romeo's interception and the big pass play by Strentz and Hebert.

Kevin Fouquier's interception then iced the win.

Dooley finished with 78 yards rushing for Teurlings, while Williams led all rushers with 113 yards.

Landor finished 16-of-33 passing for 207 yards.

"The Malveaux kid at running back has good speed," Charpentier said. "They definitely show signs at times, but just haven't been able to put it all together yet."

Surging Rebels run past Tigers

Teurlings Catholic hadn't run an offensive play Friday night, and the Rebels already led 7-0.

Once that offense got cranked up, the host Rebels rolled to their second straight convincing win in District 6-4A play, posting a 33-0 victory over Opelousas at Clark Field.

The Rebels had scoring drives of 68, 83, 83 and 65 yards, and the only possessions that Teurlings didn't tally touchdowns came on a first-possession punt, a late third-quarter interception and a kneel-down in Tiger territory at the final horn.

The win came on the heels of a 42-8 victory over St. Martinville last weekend that gave the Rebels (2-3, 2-0) their first win.

"We didn't have a turn-over last week," said TCHS coach Sonny Charpentier. "We had one here tonight, but other than that we're happy with the way we moved the ball. You've got a sophomore quarterback (D'Shale Landor) and he's going to make some bad decisions, but he's also going to make a lot of very good decisions."

Landor made the decision to put the ball into the hands of Adam Angelle and Andrew Simar against the Tigers, and that worked well as each scored a pair of touchdowns and led the Rebels to a balanced 165 rushing yards. Landor threw for 150 yards along with guiding the four marathon drives.

"The passing game opens it up for the run and the run sets up the pass," said Landor. "If you don't have both, it really doesn't work. We were pretty consistent, but we know we can do better."

Teurlings hit the board without its offense leaving the sidelines when Dane Menard stormed into to block a David Houser punt on Opelousas' first possession. He then scooped up the loose ball at the Tiger

35 and rammed the rest of the way for the early 7-0 lead.

That set a defensive tone for Teurlings, with the Rebels never allowing Opelousas (0-5, 0-2) inside their 35-yard-line the entire game - even though the Tigers had the ball in Teurlings territory on five of their eight possessions.

"Any time you can win and you shut out the other team on Homecoming, I'm happy," Charpentier said. "There's always a lot of distractions, but we came out and did what we had to do."

The Rebels had to punt on their first possession, but went on two long drives that ate up most of the rest of the first half. Simar capped an 88-yard, 12-play march with a one-yard scoring run 9:36 before halftime, and after forcing a punt Teurlings went 83 yards on 13 plays before Angelle scored from two yards out for a 19-0 halftime lead.

The Rebels then drove 65 yards with the second-half kickoff to set up Angelle's two-yard scoring run, and midway through the fourth quarter Simar capped an 88-yard march with a wrapup 6-yard touchdown.

Landor had a completion for at least 20 yards in all four drives.

"We got pretty pumped up when the defense scored early," Landor said.

Rebels plan to test progress by Vikings

One week after a stellar defensive performance in beating Westgate, 33-2, the Northside High defense faces a very different challenge with the Teurlings Catholic Rebels visiting Viking Stadium tonight.

While Westgate relied heavily on a running quarterback, the Rebels' offense features a strong-armed sophomore quarterback in D'Shaie Landor and a vertical passing game.

"They throw the ball really well," Northside coach Vincent DeRouen said. "He can make every throw possible with his arm. He's very accurate with the deep ball; they try to get it downtown. It's not a short passing game. They try to get pass interference or a big play."

After an 0-3 start to the season, the Rebels have enjoyed two blowout wins, but now it gets tougher.

"The biggest thing about Northside that you notice is their speed," TCHS coach Sonny Charpentier said. "It's speed everywhere. Even their big guys can run."

Receiver Jereon McGilvery especially stood out to Charpentier.

Guy achieved big things for Rebels

Teurlings Catholic is starting a sophomore quarterback this season in D'Shale Landor.

It certainly isn't the first time that coach Sonny Charpentier had a sophomore starter at quarterback. Most recently, he had a three-year starter in Taylor Dugas.

Before Dugas, there was Justin Guy.

Guy led the Rebels to an 8-4 season as a sophomore, endured a frustrating 5-6 campaign as a junior and then led Teurlings to arguably the best season in school history with an 11-3 record and a 3A semifinal appearance in 1999.

"There was obviously a big size difference my sophomore year," Guy said. "Everybody was 10 times bigger than me, but it didn't really bother me that much. The older guys kind of look me under their wing and then I got to work under Coach Charpentier."

Very little during his high school football playing career made a bigger impact on Guy's memory than Charpentier.

"Once you play for him, you don't want to play for anyone else," Guy said. "He was like my second dad. He would build relationships with players like no other. He would just give you great confidence."

"He would make you work hard, but then you would see all the hard work pay off. He was just a great coach to play for. Everybody wanted to play for him."

It also didn't take Guy very long to rattle off the most memorable win of his career. That was the second playoff win his senior year — a 21-14 upset win over Litcher.

Teurlings had defeated future LSU Tiger and current New Orleans Saints' cornerback Randall Gay and Brusly, 34-8, in the first round.

"After we beat Brusly and all of that Randall Gay talk, we started to think that we might be pretty good," Guy said.

Some of that confidence began to slip away, though, when Lutchter's Bulldogs got off the bus at Carencro High's field in that regional contest.

"A lot of us just started laughing when we saw them on the field, realizing that the kind of effort it was going to take to beat that team was astronomical," Guy said. "I still don't really know how we did it. When it was over, it was kind of like, 'Did we really just beat that team?'"

"That offensive line we had was just tough. You couldn't tell that offensive line that we couldn't run the ball."

The Rebels then avoided the letdown the next week by surviving a 21-20 scare at Cecilia.


"We went to Cecilia and played on a wet field," Guy said. "We still don't know why the field was wet, but those guys were good. They had good players and they played really hard."

Teurlings would then lose a tough 10-7 decision at Karr in New Orleans with a trip to the state finals on the line in a game that would be forfeited back to the Rebels after the fact.

Since Guy left Teurlings, he's watched it grow beyond what some thought possible.

"When I was a freshman, we were playing JV games against teams like St. Edmund and Opelousas Catholic," he said. "By the time I was a senior, we were playing 3A teams where we were thinking that there's no way we should be playing against those teams. Now they're in 4A."

"But Coach Charpentier and the coaches just put that will in you to where you just refused to lose."

The Last Laugh

Vikings rally late for key 6-4A win

Terrell Alfred figured to be the key to Northside's success against District 6-4A foe Teurlings Catholic on Friday night, even before heavy rains moved into the area, soaking Viking Stadium prior to the game and throughout the second half.

Once those showers came, Alfred's contributions became even bigger.

The Vikings' junior tailback pounded and burst his way for 245 yards and three touchdowns, including a clinching 37-yard scoring run with 2:18 left, as Northside remained unbeaten in league play with a 27-13 victory over the Rebels.

"When it started raining, I figured we wouldn't take a lot of chances throwing it," said Alfred, who had more than 120 yards in each half. "Our offensive line did a good job of blocking and our wide receivers blocked really well downfield."

The ninth-ranked Vikings (4-2, 2-0) needed every one of those blocks and yards to rally from a 12-0 deficit in the first half, as well as a 15-14 lead the visiting Rebel squad took into the final quarter.

"They shocked us pretty good early," said Vikings coach Vincent DeRouen, whose team has won four in a row since two losses to open the season. "They hit a couple of plays and I think our defensive backs panicked a little early. But once we settled down, we played pretty good defense."

The Rebels (2-4, 2-1), suffering their first district loss, had taken a 15-14 lead with 3:11 left in the third quarter when Nick Ortego nailed a 32-yard field goal.

Then, three plays later, Teurlings had a golden opportunity when safety Chris Faber stepped in front of Northside quarterback Kyle Carmouche's screen pass and returned an interception 14 yards to the Viking 20.

However, three plays didn't generate much, and Rebel quarterback D'Shai Landor threw incomplete on a fourth-down attempt.

The Vikings promptly drove 87 yards on 13 plays, all on the ground, and Alfred capped the drive with a three-yard burst up the middle to make it 20-15 with 6:42 left.

"That could have been huge for us," said Teurlings coach Sonny

Charpentier of Faber's interception. "We just didn't capitalize."

After the Vikings' go-ahead score, the Rebels came up short on another fourth-down try, and three plays later Alfred broke loose for the clinching 37-yard score.

"At that point we were just trying to strip the ball," Charpentier said. "But he (Alfred) is just a tough kid to tackle."

Alfred entered the game as Acadiana's fourth-leading rusher, and his season-high total helped Northside roll up 354 rushing yards and 402 yards in total offense.

"We wanted to stick to that (the ground game) even after they scored early," DeRouen said. "We had to stick to the game plan because we still had a lot of time."

Landor threw for 115 first-half yards with one score, but was under duress much of the second half and completed only one of his final 14 passes in the wet conditions on the way to a 10-of-30, 178-yard performance.

The Rebels marched 63 yards with the opening kickoff with Landor hitting a pair of passes worth 44 yards, and Adam Angelle's two-yard run gave Teurlings a 6-0 lead.

Two series later, Northside punter Jasper Turner had a snap fly over his head, and he was tackled by the Rebel rushers after a 31-yard loss at the Viking 19.

Four plays later, Landor hit a wide-open Jesse Proctor from five yards out for the 12-0 advantage.

Rebels down Lions in thrilling fashion

Teurlings Catholic and Lafayette High certainly have a flair for drama.

The two schools met for the first time on the football field Friday and didn't disappoint with a thriller at Mighty Lion Stadium.

Nick Ortego booted a 35-yard field goal with three seconds remaining to avoid overtime and propel the visiting Rebels to a 27-24 victory over the Lions.

Ortego's game-winner came a couple of plays

after Teurlings thought it had the game won on a 36-yard scoring play from D'Shae Lander to Dylan Bossier. However, a holding penalty negated the touchdown.

"I was just trying to focus in on what I had to do and just make sure I made the field goal," Ortego said.

The field goal, Ortego's second of the quarter, came after LHS called a timeout in an attempt to ice the senior kicker.

"I told him if he made it or missed it, we still love him," Teurlings coach Sonny Charpentier

said. "That's just the way of trying to relax him. I'm happy for the young man because he really worked his tail off this summer and that's what's supposed to happen. I'm not sure if he's missed a field goal this year."

Ortego actually made three field goals Friday, but Charpentier elected to take one off the board in the fourth quarter and go for a touchdown.

The Rebels started a drive at their own 10-yard line and drove deep into the Lions' territory. The drive stalled and Ortego converted a 26-yard field

goal, but the Lions were assessed a roughing the kicker penalty.

Charpentier then decided to go for the touchdown. Lander found Adam Angelle in the corner of the end zone, but Angelle was ruled out of bounds.

"I thought the pivotal part of it was we didn't get the touchdown," Charpentier said. "They said he was out of bounds."

Instead, Ortego trotted back out for another field goal attempt. This time he connected on a 23-yard field goal for the

24-16 lead.

"I just wanted to do the same thing I did before," Ortego said. "Make sure I got it through and give us a lead and, hopefully, our defense could stop them."

But, the Rebels defense couldn't stop the Lions.

LHS drove 97 yards in 10 plays and capped the drive with a Jordan Romero 5-yard TD run.

The junior quarterback called his own number again for the two-point conversion to forge the 24-24 tie.

"We have to give those guys credit," Charpentier said. "They went 98 yards

and got the two-point conversion."

Teurlings struck for a pair of first-half touchdowns to build a 14-10 lead at the break. Lander connected with Jesse Proctor on a 16-yard scoring strike and Angelle added a 3-yard run.

Lafayette got on the board midway through the second quarter on Romero's 17-yard run. The Lions cut the lead to 14-10 on Seth Sebastian's 38-yard field goal just before the half. It was the first of three (38, 38, 36) field goals for the Lions' place-kicker.

Teurlings refused to quit, mounting two more threats. The first was halted on fourth down at the BBHS 7 with 6:29 remaining, and the final surge ended with an incomplete pass at the goalline with 1:23 to play.

A last-minute decision would not have been a surprise. The Rebels edged Lafayette High, 27-24, last week, while BBHS fell in triple overtime to Northside in District 6-4A action. Instead of wrecking a season, that loss to Northside drove the Tigers to bounce back against the Rebels.

"We kept our composure this week," Landry said. "We stayed confident."

"We stuck together," BBHS coach Mike Mowad said. "It was such an emotional loss. I think it was the first three-overtime game I've ever been in. You preach about forgetting it, but you've (also) got to build on it. We were behind the 8-ball. It got us motivated."

"This was a quality win for us. We're going to continue to work hard to end the season."

The Rebels showed grit in their comeback after the Tigers took complete command at 20-0. The first score was a 67-yard pass from Landry to Dural, followed by Lamar Louis's 4-yard run with 8:38 left in the first half, and then a

71-yard Joston Dugas rumble to the 1 set up Latrelyn Pete's TD plunge just 3:09 from halftime.

Time after time, the Tigers exploded for big gains.

"Those guys make my job a lot easier," Landry said. "When the running backs bring their 'A' game, it really opens up the passing game for us. Then I'm able to hit the receivers in stride and let them do the work."

The Rebels' Jesse Proctor shook loose for 39 yards to the BBHS 26 on a pass from D'Shaie Landor, then caught a 12-yard touchdown with a minute left in the half for the initial TCHS score. Then an out-and-up to Adam Angelle was good for a 57-yard score, bringing the Rebels within 20-13 midway through the third period.

It was as close as they would get, but there was plenty of drama remaining.

Landor hit 17-of-42 passes for 310 yards in defeat and Proctor's second-effort rambles resulted in 173 yards on nine grabs. Teurlings managed 77 yards rushing, but the Tigers stopped them when backed up to their own goal.

Breaux Bridge netted 334 yards on the ground, led by 166 from Dugas, 82 from Louis and 63 from Pete.

"We thought we could control the ball with our running game, and we did," Mowad said. "That's our best defense — control the ball and keep their offense off the field."

The Bulldogs also had a 30-yard field goal by Dustin Guilbeau and appeared to take a 17-14 lead on a 57-yard touchdown run by Montrell Carter, but the play was called back for an illegal

"We knew we had it; we've stuck together all year," said Carter, who ran for 119 yards on 13 carries.

Cecilia went up 39-28 on an 18-yard TD pass from Noel to Keenan Dartez, which was set up by a Jacob Barras sack and forced fumble of Landor.
