When senior linebacker B.J. Hayes looks to his side, he sees fellow senior Ty Stuart ready to attack the offense with him.


"We're first cousins," Hayes said. "We grew up playing together in Carencro."

The family-type feel is one reason why TCHS is 76-23 under coach Sonny Charpentier, and one factor in postseason hopes again in 2003.

"The school is so small, so you know everybody," Hayes said. "We're close together as a team. We're friends, we're disciplined and we work hard.

"Also, Coach Sonny is real smart. He comes up with some awesome plays on offense. And on defense, the guys are smart."

Hayes and Stuart will be joined by returning starters Jake Toups at end and Duriel Watson at cornerback, with the other spots to be filled by relatively new faces.



"We'll have a lot of new defensive linemen," Hayes said. "But we have guys who have played before. We have a few different coverages that we'll have to get down, because we like to blitz a lot. I'm pretty sure we've got the speed on defense."

Before opening the season at Notre Dame, the Rebels will need to acclimate those new faces to the scheme.

"We have to get the plays down, and the new people will have to learn the coverages," Hayes said. "The young guys will have to step up and be more aggressive."

The chief aim for Hayes is to halt the opposition's ground game, although he has been known to take a turn or two at fullback on offense.

"My strong point in stopping

Either way, Hayes' experience and leadership will come in handy on a rebuilding squad.

"We want to win another district title," said Hayes, who was part of a 4-0 run in District 6-3A in 2002. "And, we definitely want to beat Catholic High (New Iberia). I heard they've been talking a little, like they're already the district champion."






Teurlings Catholic's Jared Conques blocks the punt attempt of Cecilia's Kyle Angelle.







LAFAYETTE --- The Iota Bulldogs football team is off to a hot start at 2-0, so one might think that head coach Neal Lege would be happy.

Not necessarily.

While Lege is happy that his team is 2-0, he is not happy about the way they accomplished getting to 2-0.

"We are definitely not where we want to be," said Lege, who is in his second season as the Bulldogs' head coach. "It's hard to gripe when you are 2-0, but I really felt that we would be further ahead than we are at this point."

The Bulldogs have victories over Jennings and Church Point, but in either game according to Lege, the Bulldogs never really played their style of football.

"We are a running football team." Lege said. "We have to be able to run the football if we are going to be successful."

And so far it has taken the offensive line a little longer than expected to come together, but they will get a lift with the return of junior left guard Brodie Bellard, who has been out with a knee injury since the spring scrimmage.

"It's going to be great having Brodie back." Lege said. "He's very smart and extremely aggressive and at the end of last season, he beat out a senior for the starting spot. So he is going to help us out a lot."

The Bulldogs will try again to establish a running game when they travel to face the Teurlings Catholic Rebels on Friday at 7 p.m.

The Rebels are off to a slow start at 0-2, but Lege considers them to be a very dangerous team.

"Teurlings is a very good 0-2 team," Lege said. "They lost to two real good teams in Notre Dame and Breaux Bridge, so they don't have anything to be ashamed of. We are going to have to play well."

Lege acknowledges that the Rebels have an high-powered offensive attack that is led by quarterback Roch Charpentier and receiver Ty Meche.

"The Charpentier kid is a good quarterback," Lege said. "Although he is not as mobile as the (Dusty) Collette kid, he is very effective. Plus, he has receivers that run super routes."

Charpentier has completed 22-of-47 passes for 205 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions, while Meche has caught 13 passes for 128 yards.



Rebels, Panthers clash in 6-3A

NEW IBERIA — After the way their season began, head coach Sonny Charpentier and his Teurlings Catholic Rebels would like nothing better than to begin district play on the right foot.

The Rebels began the season with an embarrassing 40-14 defeat at the hands of the Notre Dame Pioneers, followed by a 28-14 loss to Breaux Bridge in week two.

"I truly believe that we lost all of our confidence after that opening week loss to Notre Dame," Charpentier said. "I think that loss was so bad that it actually affected us in the first half against Breaux Bridge."

But the Rebels bounced back in the second half against the Tigers to make it a game, which Charpentier says got them back on track. "I think we gained some confidence back after our play in the second half," Charpentier said. "Even though we were down because we lost, we felt good about the way we finished off the game."

The result of their renewed confidence is a threegame win streak that includes victories over lota (24-7), Cecilia (17-13) and Lake Charles-Boston (42-8).

"I think our win over Cecilia helped us a lot," Charpentier said. "When we played them they had just beaten Breaux Bridge the week before, so it was a big confidence booster."

The Rebels (3-2) will look to continue the win streak today when they open up District 6-3A play against the Catholic High of New Iberia Panthers.

"This is a huge game for both teams," Charpentier said. "In a five-team district, you can't really afford to lose a game. But for us we don't want to start off the new season with a loss."

But the Rebels have their work cut out for them as they face one of the top quarterbacks in the Acadiana area in Michael Desormeaux.

"The Desormeaux kid is very dangerous." Charpentier said. "He is one of those players that can score at any time from anywhere on the field. Besides that, he has a lot of weapons."

In five games this season. Desormeaux has completed 69 of 120 passes for 867 yards, 10 touchdowns and three interceptions. He's also carried the football 28 times for 239 yards and five touchdowns.

Desormeaux's top receivers are Tyler Comeaux, who has 15 receptions for 240 yards and five touchdowns, and Tucker Lewis with 23 receptions for 224 yards and one touchdown.

But the Panthers (3-2) have

to be concerned with Rebel quarterback Roch Charpentier, who in his first year as a starter has completed 54-of-113 passes for 630 yards and six touchdowns along with five interceptions.

"Roch has done a wonderful job," Charpentier said. "He's very poised and has done a great job with game management. He's progressing really well."

Charpentier's favorite target is Ty Meche, who has hauled in 31 passes for 365 yards and three touchdowns.

Charpentier says that avoiding turnovers will be the deciding factor in whether or not his team is successful.

"We have to minimize our turnovers and create some turnovers on defense," Charpentier said. "We have to make them work for everything they get. Basically, we need to make them beat us and not beat ourselves."


The only problem is that the two teams have to face off on Friday at 7 p.m. in Leros

Teurlings grabs needed victory

LEROY — With a must-win situation facing his Rebels, Teurings Catholic head football coach Sonny Charpentier pulled out all the stops here Friday night.

And most of them worked

A 73-yard sideline streak on the game's third play a reverse pass that set up the goahead score and a fourthdown "swinging gate" that gave the Rebels the eventual winning margin

Combined, it was enough for a 28-13 victory over North Ver milion in their key District 6-3A battle here Friday night.

"It was a win we really needed, and to get a win like this on the road was huge," said Charpentier. "After an 0.2 start. I'm really proud of these guys for what they've done."

What TCHS has done is set up a showdown next weekend with unbeaten Erath (8-0, 2-0, which beat Catholic-New Iberia 28-27 Friday night A Rebel win would give them a share of the league crown.

Teurings (5.3, 2.1) slowed down the Patriots big number running attack, holding North Vermilion (5.3, 0.2) to only 104 ground yards and to only nine rushing yards in the second half

In fact, after an early Patriet 62 yard march that tied the game 7.7 late in the first quarter. North Vermilion had only 41 ground yards the rest of the right after entering the game averaging 273 rushing yards

"We were monsistent; and they took it to us," said Patriot head conch Stephen Lottef 'A game like this always comes down to five or six plays, and they got these and we dudn't."

That was one of three touch down passes for the coach's son, who ended the night 15-of-29 for 26 yards. The other two scores went to Ty Methe, strikes of 34 and 49 yards as part of Methe's 10 catches for 187 yards.

"Ty's capable of doing that," said coach Charpentier. "He's been a little meansistent malkmg great plays and then dropping some He's too good a player to do that, and tonight he made plays for us."

The Patriots came back two possessions inter with their best march of the night, going 62 yards and ending that drive with a one-yard J.J. Broussard run that tird the game 7.7

TCHS took the lead for good late in the second period, with a 32 yard flanker reverse pass from Gabe Begnaud to Meche to cap the 80-yard march

Meche then lenged over two defenders in the end zone three plays later and hauled in a 34yard scoring pass that made it 157 at halfitme

Back to-back sorts on NVHS quarterback Codev Mare and a short putter gave the Rebels good field pointion to start the second half, and on fourth down from the Patriot 25 TCHS quickly inned up nine men near the left boundary. Deep snapper Jett Duett picked up the ball and threw quickly to BJ. Hayes behand blocking, and he worked his way into the Patriot end zone for a 21.7 lead

"We ve worked it a lot in practice, but we've never used it, said conch Charpwriter. "It was blocked well and B-J rupped it open."

North Vermilion cut it to 21-13 on Mire's 19-yard croaning pattern touchdours pans to Jared Hebert with 9-42 left, a score set up by Audy Snodgram' usterospilon.




"He's really playing well right now. I can't ask much more of him. He made one bad throw tonight and he knew it. I thought he made some great decisions.

"This is a huge game, and the way we look at it is two things," Charpentier explained. "First, you want momentum and you want to be playing well into the playoffs. Secondly, Sam Houston has only one loss, so win or lose, it will catapult us in the playoffs and gives us a little bit better positioning in the playoffs and keep us from having a second round matchup against a team like Amite or Chalmette.

"But probably the most important thing is we want to play well. We are playing a good football team, we are playing up in classification. We look at it as a playoff game, the only luxury is that if we lose, we play again next week."

The Rebels are coming off a 48-28 win over Erath, a victory which gave the Rebels a share of their third straight district title.

Charpentier says the Rebels will have their hands full, literally, Friday night as they face a very big Sam Houston team.

"We don't match up with them well," Charpentier said. "We don't have anybody on defense as big as their tailback, let alone their fullback. Their fullback is 255 and their tailback is 230. They have a tight end that's 6-5, 230. Their offensive line look like they are all clones, they all look the same.

"The only advantage is what they do is fairly simplistic. We know what they are going to do, we just have to stop them."

Acadiana at Barbe

With both teams already pretty much assured of a spot in the Class 5A playoffs, tonight's matchup between the Acadiana Wreckin' Rams and the Barbe Bucs will serve as a chance for either team to move up a little in the power ratings and get some momentum going into the playoffs.

The Rams (5-4, 2.4) have lost four of their last five games after starting the season 40. Their tailspin has dropped them from the upper echelon of the power ratings to their current position as the 27th seed. A win by the Rams could move them up to the mid-20s, while a loss could position them anywhere from 29 to 32.

"It's been tough. I don't know what's wrong with our football team and it's my fault," Acadiana coach Willard Hanks said. "When the kids do well, it's them and when we don't do well, it's me.

"We are not executing, we are not giving any effort that we need to. We are in a downward spiral and I don't know what to do to fix it. We are just not a very good football team right now."

really a compliment to our kids.

We were real concerned about matching up with them, said Charpentier. Our guys play with a lot of heart and got them stopped before they got started, and our defensive coaches came up with a good game plan, once again.

Quarterback Roch Charpentier was on target all night, completing 18 of 20 passes for 275 yards and three touchdowns, while Meche and Aubrey combined for 13 catches for 111 yards and two scores, as Teurlings outgained Sam Houston 350-180 in total yards.

Roch is really playing well, and is seeing the things that we re asking him to see, said Charpentier. "He's making a lot of checkoffs at the line-of-scrimmage, and he's really doing everything that yoou ask of a quarterback.

With the loss, Sam Houston ended their regular season with an 8-2 record, while Teurlings improved to 7-3, and goes into the playoffs, which begin next week, playing at the top of their game.

We can get better, said Charpentier. We need to get more consistent in some areas if we're going to make a run in the playoffs.

LAFAYETTE - At the midway point of the season, Teurlings Catholic fans didn't really know what to think about their Rebel football team.

After starting off 0-2, the Rebels bounced back with three straight wins to move to 3-2 on the year. But in week six, the Rebels dropped the district opener to Catholic High to fall to .500

As it turns out, that may have been the wakeup call coach Sonny Charpentier had been looking for. The Rebels responded by win-

"We used to be in the same district as them, so we know about each other," Charpentier said. "None of our current players have played against Church Point, but they are familiar with them.


